

LEAN BEGINNINGS FOR TITAN POWERHOUSE

Baseball at Cal State Fullerton has turned full circle since its beginnings in 1966. The Titans were far from the national power they are now before one Augie Garrido took charge of the troops for the 1973 season. Dismal is probably the best term to describe those early years. Prior to Garrido's appearance, the Titans were suffering from an eight year 145-267-2 mark, or a winning percentage of only 35 percent.

The 1974 Titans, under Garrido's leadership, became the first Cal State Fullerton team to win a conference championship, competing in the California Collegiate Athletic Assoctation (Div. II). That was the first year Cal State Fullerton took part in post season playoffs, traveling to the NCAA Far West Division II regional. The Titans lost to present day rival UC Irvine, the eventual national champions.

Cal State Fullerton made the jump to NCAA Division I competition, joining the Pacific Coast Athletic Conference, in the summer of 1974. The switch didn't affect the Titans, and they won the PCAA title while chalk-

ing up a 36-16-1 record. This also marked Cal State Fullerton's first appearance at the College World Series in Omaha, representing District 8. The next trip would be far more memorable

In 1976 the Titans improved their mark to 48-15, while winning their second straight Pacific Coast Athletic Association title. Again, Cal State Fullerton competed in the NCAA West Regional.

The Titans moved into the Southern California Baseball Association for the 1977 season. This put Cal State Fullerton into the big times; the SCBA was soon to become one of the most powerful conferences in the nation. The Titans collected 44 wins against 14 losses and picked up another conference title as well as the right to go to the Rocky Mountain Regional.

The 1978 season saw Cal State Fullerton sweep to another SCBA championship (their fifth consecutive) with a 44-13 overall record. In 1978, the Titans made their traditional appearance in the NCAA West Regional to close out the season.

The ultimate triumph came in 1979 when the Titans ground out a 60-14-1 record, picked up yet another SCBA championship, a second NCAA West Regional title, and the right to advance to the College World Series in Omaha. The season was closed and the NCAA championship tucked away when Dave Weatherman threw a four-hitter against Arkansas to win the game 2-1.

The difficulty of winning a national championship was apparent during the 1980 season, as Cal State Fullerton had to struggle to win its seventh consecutive SCBA title. UC Irvine battled them right down to the wire before the Titans beat UC Santa Barbara in extra innings in the last game of the regular season to clinch the honors and the trip to Tucson, Ariz. for the NCAA West Regional. However, it was not to be the Titans' year when they ran into a scrappy Gonzaga club to close out the season at 49-18-1.

Strong teams have become the rule rather than the exception at Cal State Fullerton and a great deal of the credit goes to . . . Head Coach Augie Garrido.

GARRIDO'S ARRIVAL CHANGES COURSE

Augie Garrido came to Cal State Fullerton in September of 1972 with a history of turning baseball teams around. Around to winning. For Cal State Fullerton, association with a winner has been a rewarding experience.

Garrido, 42, was born Feb. 6, 1939 in Vacaville, Calif., and is a native of Vallejo, Calif. He received a bachelor's degree from Fresno State in 1961, and enjoyed a stellar career with the Bulldog baseball team. Following his Fresno State experience, he joined the Cleveland Indians organization in '61 and remained there until 1966 when he accepted a coaching position at Sierra High School in Tollhouse, Calif.

In 1969, his collegiate coaching career began at San Francisco State. His one-year coaching record with the Golden Gaters was 25-14. Cal Poly San Luis Obispo was Garrido's next stop, where he compiled a mediocre 15-33 record in his first season. However, the next three years were a turnabout, and he departed from Cal Poly with an 85-62-1 record.

Of course, Garrido then moved on to his present position at Cal State Fullerton. Again, his first season (1973) saw him with a nondescript 19-33-1 record, but his winning ways had already infected the Titan program. In Garrido's second season with the Titans, the first of the conference championships followed him home as Cal State Fullerton won the CCAA championship. His record reversed itself from the previous year to 37-17, and he was named CCAA Coach-of-the Year.

As Cal State Fullerton moved into Division I competition, Garrido piloted his Titans to a 36-16-1 overall record, the Pacific Coast Athletic Association championship, the District 8 championship, and the College World Series at Omaha. Quite a debut into the Division I circuit. By now, word was getting around and Garrido was named NCAA Coach-of-the-Year by the **Sporting News**, as well as repeating as PCAA Coach of the Year.

The 1976 season didn't win Garrido any post season laurels, but the Titans

finshed 48-15 enroute to their second straight PCAA championship and the finals of the NCAA West Regional.


In '77 Cal State Fullerton became a member of the Southern California Baseball Association and Garrido guided them to another successful debut. His Titans won the SCBA conference championship (44-14 overall) and appeared in the NCAA Rocky Mountain Regional.

Garrido chalked up yet another SCBA crown in 1978 with a 44-13 record, and took his team for its fifth straight outing in the NCAA playoffs (West Regional).

And then there was Garrido's 1979 edition of the Titans. He directed the '79 Titans to a school record 60 wins (with 14 losses and one tie). He led them to a sixth consecutive conference championship, the NCAA West Regional title, and topped off the season with the NCAA national championship as he returned to the College World Series in Omaha. The **Sporting News** honored him for the second time as the NCAA's Coach-of-the-Year.

Garrido's current overall collegiate coaching record is 447-217-5, a winning percentage of .673. At Cal State Fullerton, he owns an eight year mark of 337-141-4, or a percentage of .705. If one were to take away those two seasons before he turned his clubs around, his winning percentage jumps to .732. And the past seven Titan clubs have a 318-108 record for a percentage of .746.

Garrido formerly coached summer league baseball for the Anchorage, Alaska Glacier Pilots, and last summer took a team on a two-week tour through the Alaska league. He currently serves as a member of the executive committee of the American Baseball Coaches Association and the NCAA Baseball Committee.







MIKE MULLALLY, DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



Mike Mullally, who guided Eastern Illinois from the doldrums to the forefront of Intercollegiate athletics at the Division II level the past few years, is the new director of athletics at Cal State Fullerton. He replaced Neale Stoner, who is now director of athletics at Illinois.

Mullally became athletic director at Eastern Illinois in August 1974, when the Charleston Institutions programs were in disarray. In five of the following six years, Eastern Illinois had the nation's most outstanding Division II program, as determined by polls conducted by University of California, Davis, among others.

In 1978 the Panther men won the national championship in football, made their fifth straight trip to the NCAA basketball tournament, finished second in wrestling and third in soccer.

The Panthers won the national championship in cross country in 1977 and the track title in 1974. They also compete in baseball (fifth in 1978), swimming (third in 1975), tennis and golf.


Before joining Eastern Illinois, Mullally served eight years at University of Okla-

homa.

He earned his bachelor's and master's degrees at University of South Dakota with the undergraduate work in political science and the graduate work in history. In addition he has taken doctoral studies in history at Oklahoma.

He is 42, married (Carole) and the father of three (Heidi, Edward and Matthew). They reside in Fullerton.

LARRY SLAGLE, PRESIDENT, TITAN ATHLETIC FOUNDATION



The Titan Athletic Foundation is a non-profit organization with the express purpose of aiding the athletic program at Cal State Fullerton. It is a group of individuals, not necessarily alumni, who have a genuine interest in athletics and the University.

It is community involvement for some, business involvement for others, or simply an interest in a fine sports program that has attained national recognition and respect the past few years.

The foundation supports the athletic program by providing funds for scholarships and grants-in-aid which insure an effective recruiting program that attracts the best student-athletes available.

The Titan Athletic Foundation was founded in Janaury 1973, and is the University's official athletic booster organization. In the TAF's first year approximately \$30,000 was raised and 150 members enlisted. Just seven years later the TAF raised over three hundred thousand dollars and has a membership of about a thousand.

Fullerton businessman Pierre Nicolas was the TAF's first president and he has been succeeded by Don Karcher, president of Carl Karcher Enterprises; Buck Johns, president of California Climate Control, and the current president, Larry Slagle, vice president of Yellow Cab Co. of North Orange County.



KERNEN, ROBINSON PROVIDE GARRIDO YOUTHFUL EXPERIENCE

Bill Kernen begins his third season as a full-time assistant to Augie Garrido. Kernen's coaching career began at San Gorgonio High School in 1974 and he led his team to a 16-9 mark in the two years he piloted them. He then moved on to the role of assistant/pitching coach at Orange Coast College and in 1976 OCC had its first winning campaign and was ranked 10th in the state poll.

Kernen also owns a distinguished career as a player. He played three years of varsity baseball at the University of Redlands, and his team participated in the national playoffs (26-10) his senior year. He set school records in wins and ERA and was the National leader in wins and ERA (0.77). For these accomplishments, he was named Athlete of the Year and Player of the Year.

Kernen graduated with honors (major in psychology) and signed with the Baltimore Orioles, where he stayed for the next three years.

Kernen's responsibilities with the Titans include pitchers, organization of the recruiting program, and counseling student athletes.

William Craig Kernen was born in Boise, Idaho Aug. 1, 1948 and is single.

Jody Robinson, a two-time All-PCAA outfielder for the Titans, enters his fifth season as an assistant at Cal State Fullerton.

Robinson is a 1972 graduate of Morse High School (San Diego) and attended Mesa JC before coming to Cal State Fullerton. While in his native San Diego, Robinson was named an All-CIF athlete in baseball and gymnastics at Morse and was All-league at Mesa.

Joseph Edward Robinson, 26, was born Sept. 2, 1954 in Great Lakes, III. He and his wife Sally have one son (Parker).

At CSF, Robinson holds the single season record for sacrifice hits with 15 in 1976.
