

Mexican - American Community Services Project Aids Students by bob rodriguez

The Mexican American Community Services Project is now in its second year of operation. The office is located at 1668 E. Santa Clara Street, San Jose.

The Director of the project is Mr. Lino M. Lopez whose dedication, energy and leadership have made this project the success that it is. It is the only funded project of its kind in California. At present the project is funded mainly by the Rosenberg Foundation with supplementary aid coming from the Economic Opportunity Commission (EOC) and the United Fund. The project is staffed by Director L. M. Lopez and Secretary Carol Perez.

The project objectives are to serve as liaison between the Mexican American community and social agencies, schools and the public. The project has developed improved understanding between the Mexican American and the general community. It encourages employment of Spanish speaking people by social agencies, and schools and the appointment of Mexican Americans to voluntary and paid agency boards and committees and to public commissions.

The Mexican American Community Services Project (MACSP) has accomplished various projects such as the compilation of scholarships available in California colleges and universities, inventory of professional Mexican Americans, pre-school reading program, a motivation project in the East Side High Schools which reached 355 students, leadership workshops, the Mexican American Luncheon Forum, formation of the Mexican American Youth Organization (MAYO). Director Lopez has given over 200 formal talks to different groups in the community to better acquaint them with the culture and history of the Mexican American as well as its problems and progress. Over 4200 persons have heard Mr. Lopez speak.

WORK STUDY PROGRAM FOR STUDENTS

The MACSP places great emphasis on the Mexican American youth. It is this group that will provide the leaders of tomorrow.

Through a sub-contract with San Jose State College a \$27,000 grant from the Office of Economic Opportunity has been awarded to the MACSP. The grant is used to provide part time and full time jobs to economically deprived college students.

This grant covers 90% of the students' salaries. The remaining 10% is donated by individuals and groups throughout the Bay Area. The students work 15 hours per week during the school year and 40 hours per week during the holidays and summer vacation period. The students employed by the project all speak Spanish and many of them are Mexican Americans from the San Jose area.

It is the philosophy of the project that these jobs primarily keep the students in school and secondarily provide needed services which the Project is unable to provide due to staff and budget limitations.

These are some of the programs undertaken by the Work Study Students:

Stanford University Summer Program For Mexican American Students

Twenty students attended Stanford University for a four week session. The university granted a \$30 per week stipend to each of the Mexican American students and provided transportation costs. The sessions included theory, laboratory work and field trips in physics. One professor and two assistants were assigned for each five students. The students were motivated to attend a college or university on completion of high school. This project was coordinated by the Work Study students working on the Project.

Foundation Requests

A work study student with background in sociology explored possibilities for funding programs to further aid the Mexican American community. After consultation with various private and governmental agencies, it was decided that an On-the-job Training Proposal to the Federal government would be desirable. The proposal was approved by the federal government and a \$150,000 grant has been awarded to the MACSP for an On-the-job Training Program.

MAYO Program

Two work study students were involved in rendering aid to MAYO (The Mexican American Youth Organization). It is a county wide organization of Mexican American high school and college students who have as their goal "creating a new image for the Mexican American." The work study students helped the group's elected officers plan meetings, conferences, social functions and fund raising affairs. The work study students coordinated with MAYO and Stanford University the Second Mexican American Youth Conference held in October.

Mexican American Pre-School Program

A graduate education major was in charge of organizing a pre-school experience

program for the non-English speaking child. The student secured professional volunteer help for the program, volunteer donation of supplies, books, games, etc. This project is being expanded to other schools.

Recreation Program

This program was organized by three students, the coordinator being a graduate college student in recreation. With the support of the school districts involved the students planned a recreation program to teach those teenage boys who would not respond to a regular type recreation program. They organized a baseball league, but left the rest of the program unstructured. This allowed the boys to choose their own activities. Much time was spent in "bull sessions" and discussing the future plans of the young boys.

Citizenship Classes

These classes are taught by a Spanish major student who was born in Mexico and is now a citizen. These classes are for the Mexican Americans in the East San Jose area. Also included as part of the class is the rights of citizens and agency services that are available. Driver education classes are also underway.

Community Service Organization

Two bilingual students work in the CSO office to provide assistance in referring the non-English speaking to proper agencies for help. They also give help in immigration cases, provide some job referrals and help with community organization in one of the poverty areas in East San Jose.

Agency Workshops

One of the work study students is a teacher from Argentina and she gives classes to agencies on Spanish culture and also teaches conversational Spanish. Translation services are also provided by the student.

FUTURE BRIGHT

This then, in brief, are some of the things that the Mexican American Community Services Project is doing through the work study program. Worthwhile employment for the students is keeping them in college. The future looks bright for these students and for the Mexican American Community Services Project. We commend Director LINO LOPEZ for his leadership and accomplishments. May he stay with us for many years to come.



EXPERIMENTO PARA APRENDER INGLES

Los lexicologos han dicho que si una persona aprende un vocabulario de ochocientas palabras, sabe lo suficiente para entender y hablar ese idioma.

Memorizando una palabra al dia, en dos años se podra valer de ese vocabulario para hablar y entender el idioma.

La revista EL EXCENTRICO empieza el experimento con este numero.

Lo principal en cualquier lengua es conocer el sonido de las letras, para empezar este experimento, daremos los sonidos de los vocales en el idioma Ingles. Cada vocal tiene dos sonidos, uno largo y uno corto.

- A Sonido largo como en cape sonido corto en cap.
- E Sonido largo como en meet sonido corto en met.
- I Sonido largo en dine

sonido corto en din.

O Sonido largo en hope sonido corto en hop.

U Sonido largo en tube sonido corto en tub.

Y A veces suena como vocal, con sonido largo como en cycle y corto como en city.

Hay otros sonidos o combinaciones en el desarrollo de este experimento.

El proposito de esta leccion es aumentar la habilidad del estudiante para hablar y entender el Ingles en forma real. Al mismo tiempo esta unidad en la educacion del consumidor es designada a ayudar para comprar economica y cuidadosamente. Ademas el estudiante aprendera acerca de anuncios y oportunidades, para encontrar cuales de los articulos son realmente oportunidades y cuales son mercancia comun. Otros aspectos de la unidad son: compra y uso de comestibles, vestidos, articulos para el hogar, automoviles y el uso del credito.







BRUINS WHIP "UNBEATABLE" MSU

Millions of people stared intently at their idiot boxes on Saturday, January 1st as Michigan State halfback Bob Apisa ran wide around his own right end, hell bent for the end zone with the points which would have tied UCLA 14-14. But it was not to be. He was met by halfback Bob Stiles and line-backer Dallas Grider and stopped cold, and that was all she wrote for Michigan State.

The Rose Bowl battle of 1966 will be remembered long after the other games played this day are forgotten. Michigan State was a team that could not be beaten, or so the sportswriters wrote. The Spartans were big. They were fast. They were experienced. They were well coached. In effect, they couldn't possibly lose! But they did!
