

Do you want crime updates sent to you through e-mail?

I would like to inform you of a program we are going to start here in Camarillo that involves sending crime information out to residents.

The idea behind the program is to use e-mail as another avenue to get important information out to the community regarding current crimes and crime trends.

The purpose of sending the information out is to educate the public about current crime trends in the hopes that you can be better prepared to identify suspicious and possibly criminal activity and report it to the police. This program has been in place in the city of Thousand Oaks for a few months now, and they have already had some success with it. An arrest of a burglary suspect was made after an alert citizen observed a vehicle that was described in one of the e-mails sent out.

I envision sending out a few e-mails a month, depending on current crime trends and what information our detective unit feels is appropriate to release to the community. I do not want to inundate people with these e-mails, and e-mail addresses will not be shared with anyone.




So, once again I remind you to remember better breathing techniques that will help you get things done a little easier. If you need a refresher, let's get together and discuss taking care of ourselves.


renew your drivers license. All drivers age 70 and over must pass this exam.


Moorpark well worth a day trip

Recycle bin available for free

I am a new resident in the Village. I was told to put out my recycled trash in grocery bags and place it at the curb, which I have been doing. However, I wondered what I was to do when — or if — the rains came.

I was going to purchase a bin and then thought to call the Harrison Rubbish Company first.

It turns out that as a resident of the Village, I can receive a recycle bin free of charge. Sure enough, the next morning the bin arrived.

I was watching as the rubbish company employee went to the neighbor's and put their recycled trash in a bin he was carrying alongside the truck. He was working alone. He drove the truck to one neighbor, got out, placed their recycled materials in the bin, went back into the truck, emptied it, and went to the next house. where he did the same thing, all, of course, in very hot weather. When he came to my house, the mechanism of the truck put aside the bin it was carrying, lifted the one I had and emptied it. He did not have to leave his truck.

My question is: Why is

there no publicity about this "free-of-charge" bin to the residents? My neighbor was unaware of this service and made plans to call. I felt concern for the employee who had to get out of his truck at each stop, empty the recycle material into his bin, then get back into the truck, etc.

I thought it best to make others aware. Imagine the surprise and relief the employee would feel seeing that he did not have to "get out and get in" of the truck at every stop in every Village all day long.

Here is a piece of good news! A seldom used, longstanding law offers you protection of up to \$100,000 against debts you may incur through accidents, illness or misfortune. It is called a "homestead exemption."

This exemption can protect the equity in your home up to 100,000 against judgment liens. The homes in Leisure Village qualify to be homesteaded.

You are eligible to homestead your personal residence. For a person 65 years or older the exemption limit is \$100,000. The homestead exemption is recorded with the county of Ventura. A homestead will remain in effect until your house is sold or you abolish it by recording an "Abandonment of Homestead."

Note: The homestead will have to be removed to secure a loan that uses the property for collateral. But once the loan is secured, you may re-homestead your residence.

Who pays for what

The California Association of Realtors has specific forms for all real

estate transactions. When a buyer wants to make an offer on a home, the buyer's agent will complete a California Purchase Agreement and Joint Escrow Instructions.

Relevant items to this form are the price offered, the close of escrow date and deposit and loan information, unless it is a cash sale.

Typical seller expenses are the pest control inspection and correction, an environmental report, a title insurance policy, escrow fees, county and homeowner association transfer fees and a home warranty policy. Agents can provide a net sheet to show these expenses.

The contract allows for the buyer to have a contingency period to inspect and approve all disclosures and relevant paperwork. This contingency period is usually the first 17 days after acceptance, but it can be shortened. After the buyer's home inspection, there is a second round of negotiation regarding a buyer's request for repair/correction.

Your agent will guide you through these steps, explaining appropriate paperwork and assisting you to a satisfactory escrow closing.
