Cal State Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing. Classes were offered for the first time in 1959 and the first commencement, for five students, took place in 1960.

Cal State Fullerton Campus

California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing.

Classes were offered for the first time in 1959 and the first commencement (for five students) was in 1960.

The University's 24,500 students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Many students commute each day to and from classes; some come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 775-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The University enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, communications, education, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, speech and hearing, and theater. All told there are 86 degree programs -41 of them at the graduate level plus several credential programs and five certificate programs.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is an internship and cooperative education program that allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study

tours without the formalities of regular admission to the University.

Still another strong point is the University's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationally-known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the network of community support groups. Another is Continuing Learning Experience, which has spearheaded the fund-raising campaign to build a gerontology center on campus.

Further examples of community outreach are joint ventures with the City of Fullerton. One resulted in the Fullerton Arboretum, which opened on campus in 1979. Another produced lighting for the baseball field and adjoining soccer fields, while a third yielded lighted softball fields.

The long awaited reality of an on campus football/soccer complex and baseball and softball stadium in conjunction with an on-campus Marriott Hotel will be completed in 1992. The Hotel is open and construction for the athletic facilities is underway.

To reinforce the University's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State Fullerton has embarked on a comprehensive fund-raising campaign. Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great university.



SEASON PREVIEW

TITAN SOFTBALL TEAM AIMING FOR OKLAHOMA CITY

To say Cal State Fullerton Head Softball Coach Judi Garman is optimistic and looking forward to the 1991 Titan softball season is an understatement. With her new talent and returning experience, Coach Garman hopes to take her team back to the NCAA Softball College World Series in May in Oklahoma City. Garman, beginning her 12th season at Fullerton, has six starters including two All-Americans back from last year's squad that finished third in the Big West Conference and ninth nationally. Joining that nucleus are two JC transfers, two redshirts, six freshmen and a former member of the Titans' women's basketball team.

The Titans finished 45-23 overall last season and 22-13 in the nationally prominent Big West Conference. The 1990 season ended with a narrow defeat to Long Beach State, 3-2 (8 innings), 0-4 and 1-2 (16 innings) in the NCAA West Regional. This year the Titans are aiming only for Oklahoma City and nothing short of the College World Series.

The six starters back from last year's team are seniors Jill Matyuch, Joy Tiner, Mich DeBree and juniors Ann Van Dortrecht, Shireen Campbell and Charlotte Wiley. Both Tiner and Van Dortrecht were named second team All-Americans, first team all-conference and all-west region last season.

Van Dortrecht was the team's top pitcher last season with a record of 29-12 and 0.43 earned run average. She was also named conference Pitcher of the Year, conference Pitcher of the Week three times and set four school records.

"The key to our success this season is pitching," said Garman.
"There will be a lot of pressure on Tiffany Boyd to perform the way she
did her freshman year and if she has that kind of year again combined
with Ann Van Dortrecht, our pitching will be exceptional."

Another area which should be exceptional is the infield with the return of Tiner, a third baseman. She led the Titans in hits (71), runs (30), doubles (10), total bases (83) and assists (144) last season.

"Joy is looking real good," said Garman. "We'll look for her to be our team leader and she should have another All-American year."

Wiley, a shortstop, led the team in batting average (.315), doubles (10) and home runs (1) last season. She also was named conference Field Player of the Week once last year.

Matyuch returns to play for her final season with the Titan softball squad. This past summer she was an ASA All-American and Coach Garman looks for her to start at either shortstop or second base. Last season she had 78 putouts, 67 assists and 8 double plays (.942 fielding percentage).

DeBree returns to play in the outfield. As a starter last season, she tallied 97 putouts for an .980 fielding percentage. At the plate, she had 57 hits, 17 RBI and five doubles in 193 at bats. She led the squad in walks (19) and sacrifices (16).

Campbell, a pitcher, was Van Dortrecht's back-up last year and finished 15-10 with an 0.80 ERA. Also back is utility player Yvette Hernandez. She had 28 hits and seven runs in 129 at bats.

One of the nation's top pitchers from two years ago will be playing for Fullerton this year. Boyd, a sophomore transfer from UCLA, will be eligible after red-shirting last season. As a freshman at UCLA she had a 19-2 record and was the NCAA ERA leader at 0.24. She was named first team All-PAC-10, first-team All-North Region, all-world series team (3 wins) and <u>Daily Bruin</u> Athlete of the Year.

"We are excited to officially have Tiffany on board this year," said

Garman. "Tiffany is ready to play."

Another transfer who will make an immediate impact is junior catcher Kim Powers. Powers was named first team All-Big Ten and was the Big Ten batting champion (.357) as a freshman at Indiana. In 154 at bats she had 12 runs, 44 hits and 21 RBI. Her sophomore year she had 13 runs, 37 hits and 16 RBI in 142 at bats. Powers, from Burbank and John Burroughs High School, is looking forward to playing at "home."

"Kim is a real power hitter," said Garman. "She is an experienced catcher and can handle pitchers well. Her leadership will be important and we will benefit with her in that role."

There are seven freshmen on this year's squad and all should see

plenty of playing time.

"We have some outstanding ballplayers with great personalities to add to this year's team," said Garman. "This year we have as much depth as we've ever had. We have great ballplayers from beginning to end. All of the players on my roster could be starting for any team in the country."

Leading the list of newcomers are pitcher Miho Sasamoto, outfielders Jstone (cq) Vines and K.C. Clark and infielder Kelly Hunt.

Sasamoto, from Toyko, Japan (Saitama Sakae H.S.) went undefeated her junior and senior seasons and was named MVP for all Japan high schools. She pitched for the 1987 Japanese National Junior Team and Olympic Festival Team.

Vines is a nine-time varsity letterwinner from San Pedro High School in basketball, softball and track. Her honors include Female Athlete of the Year, All-Southern Pacific League and All-Los Angeles City. In 86 at bats she hit .453 with 31 runs, 39 hits and 20 for 22 in stolen bases.

"Jstone could be the fastest player in the nation this year," said Garman.

K.C. Clark is from Rancho Cordova and is a junior transfer from Sacramento City College. She will also add speed to the team.

"K.C. has a real strong arm and will start for us in centerfield," said Garman.

Hunt, a first baseman from San Dimas (Charter Oak H.S.), had 36 RBI with a .412 batting average her senior year. Her honors included 4A CIF Player of the Year, San Gabriel Tribune Player of the Year, Best Offensive Player of the Year two seasons in a row, All-Sierra League and All-San Gabriel Valley all three years and first-team All-CIF the last two years.

"Kelly Hunt will start at first base this season and she is a strong hitter and real competitor." said Garman.

The other newcomers are Los Angeles Valley College infielder Karin Knoop from Sun Valley and three freshmen: catcher Kari Escobedo from Buena Park (Buena Park H.S.), Melissa Hadfield from Lakeside (El Capitan H.S.) and Jennifer Shuey from Poway (Poway H.S.).

Knoop at LAVJC was twice named all-league and was conference Co-Player of the Year last season. At John Burroughs H.S., she was three-time all-league, three-time Most Inspirational and first team All-CIF, MVP and won the Coaches Award her senior season.

In her senior season, Escobedo was named first team All-CIF, team MVP and Best Offensive Player (.382 batting average) and all three years was named first-team all-league.

Hadfield was three-time all-league, All-CIF two years and team MVP for two years. Her senior season she hit .400 with six home runs and 14 RBI.

Shuey was all-league her junior and senior seasons.

The last newcomer is not a newcomer to Cal State Fullerton. She is the former starting forward on the Titan basketball team and this season is a walk-on on the softball team. Kathy Werth will add valuable depth to the infield.

With a strong blend of experience, transfers and freshmen, Coach Garman has high expectations for the 1991 Titan softball program.

"Our two goals this season are to win the conference outright and then get to the College World Series," said Garman.

Other positive additions for the upcoming season are the return of Assistant Coach Kathy Van Wyk, a 1982 Broderick Award winner who was pitching coach for Fullerton from 1982 to 1987, and the additions of strength and conditioning coach Tony Moreno and Dr. Michael Yessis, who oversees the team's plyometrics program.

Head Coach Judi Garman, 12th Year

Beginning her twelfth season at Cal State Fullerton, Judi Garman has led the Titans to no worse than a ninth place national finish, an NCAA National Championship (1986) and 560 victories in her eleven-year tenure. Garman is the only coach in the program's history and has accumulated 771 career victories, which is more wins than any other collegiate coach.

Garman established the program in 1980 and finished third in the conference, second in the region and ninth nationally. Since then, Garman's teams have won eight conference titles and six out of nine regional championships while finishing second in the College World Series in 1981, 1983 and 1985; third in 1982 and 1987, and winning the 1986 NCAA Championship.

Garman's tremendous success at Fullerton is only the latest in a remarkable string of accomplishments which stretch across the continent from Canada to Santa Barbara to Golden West College in Huntington Beach to Cal State Fullerton.

Garman earned her bachelor's degree from the University of Saskatchewan in 1966 and moved to California where she began working on her master's degree at UCSB. While at Santa Barbara, she started club softball and soon had a varsity team. Upon completion of her studies, she took the women's athletic director position at Westmont College in Santa Barbara and coached the volleyball, basketball and tennis programs in addition to softball.

Garman then moved to Golden West College where, along with softball, she coached basketball (1973-76) and cross-country (1977-79). Garman coached the Rustlers softball team to an unprecedented four consecutive national championships (1975-78) while compiling a record of 211-40. Twenty-one of her softball players received scholarships to four-year institutions.

Very involved professionally, Garman just completed a two-year reign as president of the National Softball Coaches Association. Each year, she hosts clinics which bring over 200 coaches and 1,500 players to the campus. Additionally, she has produced highly successful pitching video tapes with acclaimed pitching coach Don Sarno.

On February 7, 1991, Garman will he honored at the Fifth Annual National Girls and Women in Sports Luncheon sponsored by the Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles for her contribution in collegiate athletics in Southern California.

A popular speaker at clinics around the country, Garman has also made numerous trips abroad to Holland, Italy, Czechoslovakia and Japan. She runs a camp each summer in Italy. Many Titans have had the opportunity to play overseas because of these contacts.

Fishing and snow skiing occupy Garman's time away from the softball field. She also has numerous business interests and is actually involved in running a family business in Canada that manufactures moccasins.







Assistant Coach Kathy Van Wyk

Returning to Cal State Fullerton this season is Kathy Van Wyk, a former softball player and assistant coach at Fullerton.

Van Wyk, 30, was the Titans' assistant coach from 1982 to 1987 and was a part of the 1986 national championship team. After coaching at Fullerton, Van Wyk became a private pitching instructor at Rod Carew's Baseball School from 1987 to 1989. Then she went to Azzano Decimo, Italy, to be head coach of the Azzanase Softball Club. Recently, she completed production on four instructional video tapes on pitching and coaching. From January through March she was the pitching coach for the Walkerville Softball Club in Adelaide, South Australia.

As a Titan pitcher in 1982, Van Wyk finished 35-1 (35 wins is still a school record) with an ERA of 0.18 and earned AIAW and NCAA All-America honors and won the Broderick Award, which honors the most outstanding collegiate softball player. She also was named WCAA All-Conference, Orange County Athlete of the Month, PONY Invitational All-Tournament pitcher and she was awarded an NCAA post-graduate scholarship with a 3.43 grade point average. Her 1982 stats include 4 no-hitters, back-to-back perfect games, 27 shutouts, 278 innings pitched, 270 strikeouts and 6 one-hitters.

Van Wyk began her collegiate softball career at Texas Women's University before transferring to Fullerton. At TWU, she was named Texas AIAW Player of the Year in 1979, along with many other honors. She transferred to Fullerton in 1981 after TWU dropped softball.

A 1983 graduate from Fullerton with a Bachelor of Science in physical education, Van Wyk is currently working on her Master's Degree in PE at Azusa-Pacific. She is single and resides in Anaheim Hills.



Assistant Coach Linda Shafor

An integral part of the Titan coaching staff, Linda Shafor returns to the Titans for her seventh season as a part-time assistant coach with a direct responsibility in overseeing Fullerton's outfield. Shafor had worked with Garman in the latter's rookie season and returned to the program in 1986 in time to help the Titans win the NCAA Championship.

Coach Shafor possesses a wide and varied softball background from her playing days with the Sun City Saints (1966-67) to serving as the player-coach for the Huntington Park Blues in 1970. Shafor was head coach at LA Harbor College from 1971 until 1979. She was an assistant coach at the University of Arizona for one season prior to joining the Titans in 1980.

She returned to Harbor College and is currently a physical education and math professor.

Shafor is a 1966 graduate of Ohio State with a degree in physical education. She received her master's degree in PE at Long Beach State.

She is single and resides in Cerritos.



Head Women's Trainer
Julie Max

Now entering her twelfth year with her alma mater, women's trainer Julie Max plays a major role in the Fullerton women's softball program as well as all eight of the university's women's sports programs.

Last June, Julie was elected to the Office of District Director - representing California, Nevada and Hawaii in the National Athletics Trainers Association. She is serving on the Executive Board for the national organization.

Max has been recognized in the past on the local and national level for her outstanding abilities including serving as the administrative coordinator for volleyball and fencing at the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles.

She earned her Bachelors of Science degree from Cal State Fullerton in 1978 and received a Masters of Education with an emphasis in PE at Azusa Pacific University. Max became a Certified Athletic Trainer following graduation in 1979 and is also a Certified Emergency Medical Technician.





1990 SEASON IN REVIEW




Beginning her eleventh season at Cal State Fullerton last February, Head Coach Judi Garman had led the Titans to no less than a ninth place national finish, an NCAA national championship in 1986 and had 515 victories in her ten-year tenure. The 1990 season was another strong one for the Titan softball team. They finished 45-23 overall, 22-13 in the nationally prominent Big West Conference (third place) and ranked fourth and fifth in the nation at the end of the season in the Wilson Coaches' and NCAA polls, respectively.

Highlights for the 1990 season included a No. 1 ranking in the NCAA poll on March 13, two shutouts over national champion UCLA (5-0, 2-0), a sweep over Cal (both 1-0) and a 3-0 win over College World Series semi-finalist Oklahoma State. CSF pitchers finished the season ranked fifth in the nation in team ERA (0.55) and the team was ranked 9th nationally in defense (.969).

Individually, third baseman Joy Tiner and pitcher Ann Van Dortrecht were named second team All-Americans, first team all-conference and first team All-West region. Van Dortrecht was also honored as Conference Pitcher of the Year and three times named Conference Pitcher of the Week. She earned these honors based on her 29-12 (4th nationally) record and 0.43 ERA (12th nationally). Outfielder and designated hitter Carey Hess and outfielder Mich DeBree were also named first team all-conference and first baseman Missy Coombes was honorable mention. Hess and Coombes were selected second team all-region. Shortstop Charlotte Wiley was honored as Conference Field Player of the Week on May 14.

For the eleventh consecutive year, Fullerton qualified for the NCAA post-season tournament. The Titans lost the best of three series, at the Titan Softball Complex, to conference rival Long Beach State. Both teams were in the top five nationally, and two of the very competitive games went extra innings. The 49ers prevailed 2-3 (8 innings), 4-0 and 2-1 (16 innings) to advance to the 1990 NCAA Softball College World Series.


