Graphic artist, Janice Ledgerwood, has been the digital media instructor at Reedley College since 2005. She combines computer technology with traditional art media and has shown her work in numerous group and individual exhibitions. Believing art to be a vehicle for social change, as well as for individual expression, Ledgerwood is currently working on a time-based media project that explores California's diversity.

[Terry Hayden](#) has been involved in commercial, graphic arts, and fine art photography for more than thirty years. He has taught photography, established a technical photographic application firm, and created fine art work featured in private and public collections across the country. While his work is based on the tradition of black and white analog large format landscape photography, currently he is exploring the latest in digital image capture.
