PRESS ROOM: Room 162 in the eastern wing of the gymnasium serves as the press room for Titan basketball. Three telephones are available approximately 10 minutes after the final buzzer. PRESS TABLES: Primary beat reporters and broadcasters will be located on the south side of the playing floor, around the scorer's tables. Auxiliary media seating and scout seating will be available at tables along the base lines.

GAME SUMMARIES: Will be collated and distributed in Room 162 of the gymnasium building. Halftime box scores, play-by-play accounts and final box scores will be provided. PRESS/PHOTO CREDENTIALS: Will be issued on a per game basis only. Requests should be made as far in advance as possible. "Visiting" media may make their requests through their respective "home" SIDs. Photo credentials must be worn in plain sight at all times. Photographers may shoot only from the designated areas behind both baselines.

PARKING: On Monday through Thursday evenings, parking is available by: a) Using Lot A at State College and Yorba Linda Boulevards and paying \$1.50 upon entry for a daily permit, or: b) Obtaining a complimentary pass upon presentation of news credential to the Visitors Information Booth located on the south side of campus, northwest of the intersection of Commonwealth and Nutwood Avenues. At other times, ample free parking is available in Lot B, immediately west of the gymnasium.

FAX/TELECOPIER: One FAX machine will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. BROADCAST SPACE: One table is allocated to each team's designated commercial radio station. Each holds three persons comfortably across the working counter with one cramped seating space available to the rear.

TELEPHONES: There is one telephone at the press table -- (714) 773-3970 -- which must be kept free for messages, out-of-town scores, etc. Additional telephones CANNOT be installed at the press table due to the physical limitations of the building. Please call if you have special telephone needs.

LOCKER ROOMS: Located off the hallway on the north side of the playing floor. John Sneed will conduct his post-game interviews in the equipment manager's office just outside the Fullerton players' locker room, which is closed to the media. Players will be brought to the office area upon request after a reasonable cooling-off period.

SCOUTS: Requests should be made at least one week in advance. Seating is very limited.

The University

California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing. The main campus is located in Fullerton and a Mission Viejo campus was opened in August, 1989. The latter offers only upper-division and graduate courses.

Classes were offered at Fullerton for the first time in 1959 and the first commencement — for five students — took place in 1960.

The University's 25,000 students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes, although nearly 400 now live on campus in residence halls opened in 1988.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 775-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The University is fully accredited and enjoys national recognition for both its array of traditional academic programs and a growing list of independently accredited professional programs, including art, athletics training, business, chemistry, communications, computer science, dance, education, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, speech and hearing and theater. All told, there are 86 degree programs —41 of them at the graduate level — plus a wide variety of credential and certificate programs.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is an internship and cooperative education program that allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours without the formalities of regular admission to the University.

Still another strong point is the University's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students, but also open to community members, is another highlight, as is the network of community support groups, including the Titan Athletic Foundation.

Further examples of community outreach are the Ruby Gerontology Center, which serves as an educational and research facility for the study of aging and a meeting place for the Continuing Learning Experience support group.

Through a series of joint ventures started in 1979 with the establishment of the Fullerton Arboretum and continuing with the 1989 opening of the Marriott Hotel, the University and the City of Fullerton are working to complete an on-campus sports complex in 1992. Already in use are two lighted softball fields. When the main part of the sports complex is finished, it will include a stadium for football, soccer and other activities plus a pavilion for baseball.

To reinforce the University's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State conducts comprehensive fundraising. Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great university.



Administration



Dr. Milton A. Gordon, President

Dr. Milton A. Gordon was selected the fourth president of Cal State Fullerton by The California State University Board of Trustees on May 15, 1990. He assumed his duties on Aug. 6. He replaced Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb, who had served since 1981.

Gordon previously had served as Vice President for Academic Affairs at Sonoma State University in Rohnert Park in Northern California.

"Dr. Gordon has a superb academic and administrative background," said Marianthi Lansdale, CSU board chair. "I'm certain that Fullerton will continue to flourish under his able leadership. We offer him our warmest congratulations."

Prior to his Sonoma appointment where he also held the rank of professor of mathematics, Gordon was dean of Chicago State University's college of arts and sciences for more than eight years. An associate professor of mathematics at Loyola University of Chicago from 1966-77, Gordon also directed that institution's Afro-American studies program. He also taught at the Illinois Institute of Technology, the University of Detroit and in the Chicago Public School System.

Gordon has a Ph.D. in mathematics from the Illinois Institute of Technology, an M.A. in mathematics from the University of Detroit and a B.A. in mathematics and secondary education from Xavier University of Louisiana.

Athletics Department



Ed Carroll, Director of Athletics

The rapid climb of Ed Carroll through the ranks of the Cal State Fullerton athletics department culminated in his appointment as Director of Athletics on July 1, 1985.

Former University President Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb made the announcement on May 28, 1985, after a nationwide search and Carroll, now 40, immediately ushered in an era of "positive thinking" for Titan athletics.

"One of my priorities has been to enhance the image of our athletics program by stressing positives," says Carroll. "We must use the power of positive thinking to overcome our

limitations and build our program to greater heights."

One of Carroll's first moves was to upgrade the football schedule. The Titans have played LSU, Florida, West Virginia and Auburn in recent seasons and have a date with Georgia next year and Syracuse and Temple in the near future. With the new stadium complex now under construction, Carroll has signed Mississippi State, Colorado State, Texas Tech, UTEP and Army to home-and-home series.

Carroll scored his first hiring coup when he was able to replace Augie Garrido with equally successful Larry Cochell as the baseball coach for 1988. Cochell took the Titans to the College World Series twice in three seasons and was selected national Coach of the Year by Collegiate Baseball in 1988. When Cochell left for Oklahoma last summer, Garrido was rehired away from the University of Illinois.

The long-awaited Sports Complex will provide a playing facility for football, soccer and baseball as well as an all-weather track. An on-campus Marriott Hotel opened in October, 1989, and the revenue it generates will help finance the \$10.7 million athletics project.

Fund-raising levels have reached record numbers during Carroll's tenure. The Titan Athletic Foundation's 1990 spring drive raised more than \$414,000.

Carroll began his Fullerton athletic career as a wrestler. In 1972, he served as captain and was selected the "Most Outstanding Wrestler" in the California Collegiate Athletic Association championship meet. He later served as an assistant to former head coach Don Matson.

Carroll earned bachelor's degrees in history (1972) and physical education (1974) from Fullerton as well as a secondary teaching credential. He taught physical education classes at Fullerton and earned a master's degree in recreation administration from Long Beach State.

After serving in various capacities in the Fullerton recreation department, Carroll left briefly in mid-1980 to serve as a recreational sports programmer and doctoral intern at Indiana University. He returned to Fullerton in November, 1980, as an assistant athletics director and later served as acting director of the Titan Athletic Foundation. He then served under athletics director Lynn Eilefson, who left in January, 1985. Carroll and Utah State's Rod Tueller now rank as the "deans" of athletics directors in the Big West Conference.

Ed and his wife Connie live in Fullerton with young children Brandon and Kimberly.

Nickname and Mascot

"What exactly is a Titan?"

"Why do you have an elephant for your mascot?"

Those are two of the first questions that pop into the minds of media and fans when a Cal State Fullerton athletic team makes its inaugural visit. While the relatively young institution carved out of the Orange County citrus groves may be too new for many traditions, here are the recognized legends.

"It was the students' decision in a vote," explains Dr. Ernest Becker, founding Dean of Students, of the nickname 'Titans.' "More than a hundred names were suggested, and the Student Council took on the job of narrowing the list down to a few for the

purposes of an election. The vote was close, with Titans narrowly prevailing over Aardvarks and Rebels."

It was a unique student body at the outset, all upper division students until 1963. There were 453 of them, mostly female, in 1959, the first year of classes at what was then known as Orange County State College. They voted to organize as a student body and to assess themselves a fee of \$10 per semester.

"Even when it was decided that 'Titans' would be the nickname, there was confusion as to what

it represented," said Becker. "I was thinking of a large mythological figure from Greek history, not unlike Tommy Trojan, but with perhaps straighter, more modern lines. In the same vein, the original dormitories were named Othrys Hall. There were others, however, who related the name to the Titan missile then in prominence."

Nothing official was done about a mascot because no one knew quite what to do. Until, of course, the "First Intercollegiate Elephant Race in Human History."

What began as a practical joke turned into probably the biggest "happening" on the campus to this day. The "gag" attracted elephants from universities around the nation and even Oxford from England. A crowd estimated at

more than 10,000 people turned out on "Dumbo Downs" as the hastily graded field became known that spring afternoon in 1962.

To publicize the event, a circus-like elephant called Tuffy the Titan was used and it began appearing on sweaters and notebook covers around the campus. With no other mascot, the elephant was unofficially adopted. Several revisions in the caricature have been made in recent years to create a more tenacious Tuffy, or Titus as he also was called in an attempt to make him Greek.

The mascot outlived the race. In 1963, one elephant charged the crowd causing minor injuries and an early sign of a now-common liability insurance crisis nipped a tradition in the bud.

The origin of the school colors also bears discussion. The students voted for royal blue and white when they chose Titans, but the athletic equipment manager at the time thought orange was an appropriate color on uniforms for a school known as Orange County State College. The

unofficial color was "adopted" and finally was formally acknowledged by the Athletics Council in 1987.

When Lynn Eilefson was appointed athletics director in 1982, he furthered the cause of orange because of its uniqueness and brightness compared to the wide variety of blues. Thus, the "Orange Crush" booster group was born and the color remains prominent in most team uniforms.

And, finally, there is the matter of the school's name. As mentioned earlier, the name originally was Orange County State College. It's also been Orange State College and later California State College at Fullerton or California State College, Fullerton. The change to university status necessitated a further change to California State University, Fullerton, but the school's address could not be changed from 800 N. State College Boulevard. And that's only the start of the confusion.

To out-of-staters, the picture clouds quickly because most don't realize there are two distinct systems of higher education in the state — the University of California and the State University system. So, the school has been called everything from Cal-Fullerton to UC Fullerton to California State Fullerton State to simply Fullerton State. The preferred moniker is Cal State Fullerton, with no hyphens or commas, which is what most of the more than 80,000 graduates recognize. But since there are only two other major institutions known as Titans (University of Detroit and Oral Roberts University), just call Fullerton teams the "Titans!"

History of Titan Athletics

Obstacles and adversity. Grass-roots support and coaches with "sandwich board" signs. Stunning upsets and courageous performances. All have been a part of Cal State Fullerton athletics as "Titan Pride" has taken limited resources to athletic successes disproportionate to such a young institution.

How many universities can claim national championships in seven different sports, a star major league third baseman, men and women basketball players in the Olympics, two rookies in the Super Bowl and the subject matter of a Walt Disney feature film?

The tenor was set by the first Titan intercollegiate team - men's basketball. In only their second season, the Titans of coach Alex Omalev advanced five rounds into the NAIA national playoffs in 1961-62.

Sixteen seasons later, the entire nation watched another "cinderella" Titan Five advance to within one victory of the "Final Four" as Bobby Dye's 1977-78 team won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association post-season tournament and then beat nationally ranked New Mexico and USF to gain the finals of the Western Regional.

The basketball tradition, which included a women's national title in 1970 and coach Billie Moore and star Nancy Dunkle on the women's 1976 Olympic team, was continued in 1984 as Leon Wood helped the men to a gold medal before he became a first-round NBA draft choice. Coach George McQuarn's teams were usually factors in the PCAA race and had national Top 20 rankings and a victory over the nation's No. 1-ranked and undefeated team to their credit. Fullerton, which has seemingly specialized in last-second wins under current coach John Sneed, also has competed twice in the post-season NIT Tournament while the women have recently been in both the WNIT and the NCAA fields.

Gymnastics has brought Fullerton more fame. Coach Dick Wolfe won three college division titles (1971, 1972 and 1974) and has had recent teams in the Top Ten at the Division I level while winning 10 PCAA titles in a row. His 1987 squad was ranked No. 1 in the nation led by former Chinese Olympian Li Xiao Ping. Lynn Rogers began the women's program in 1976 and the Ti-



tans have finished sixth or better in the nation virtually every year and won the national title in 1979. Onearmed Carol Johnston was an All-American and star of the Disney film, "Lefty," while more recently Tami Elliott won 10 All-American awards before suffering a fractured vertebra in her senior season.

Baseball exploded on the national scene with the arrival of coach Augie Garrido. He broke the USC monopoly in the western regionals in 1975 and won the national title in 1979 behind the play of Tim Wallach, now of the Montreal Expos. He won the College World Series again in 1984 with players such as pitcher Greg Mathews of the St. Louis Cardinals and CWS Most Valuable Player John Fishel. The Titans won their first six-team regional and finished third in the CWS in 1988 under the direction of coach Larry Cochell, who in 1990 guided them to a Big West title, a

regional championship at Texas and a sixth trip to Omaha. A total of 15 Titan products have gained the major leagues and now Garrido has returned.

Women have sparkled on the Fullerton diamonds, too. Coach Judi Garman founded the softball program in 1980 and the Titans have been a powerhouse, making seven trips to the College World Series in 11 years. The Titans brought home their first NCAA Championship in 1986 and have been ranked No. 1 in the nation often during the past three seasons.

There have been national titles in men's cross country and women's fencing and individual standouts like golfer Martha Wilkerson and runner Mark Covert. But football is the only sport that matches the popularity of men's basketball and the Titans have had their share of success on the gridiron as well.

Dick Coury was the inaugural coach in 1970 and he built an instant winner at the Division II level. The Titans were 27-16-1 over the first four years under Coury and successor Pete Yoder before the growing pains of moving up to Div. I were endured. But the program eventually came of age under the guidance of Gene Murphy, who guided the Titans to two conference championships and four second-place finishes during the 1983-1989 seasons.

Head Coach John Sneed



Third Year Career & at CSUF: 29-29 Long Beach State '71

John Sneed begins his third year as head coach at Cal State Fullerton where he has gradually placed his personal trademark on the basketball program.

The 1990-91 season will be the first truly "Sneed" season with only two players left on the roster from the George McQuarn era in the person of junior guard Wayne Williams and junior forward Agee Ward. In 1988-89 Sneed carried an "interim" tag around his neck and last year's starting five were all McQuarn recruits.

While posting a .500 record at Fullerton at 29-29, Sneed has picked up the playing pace with more opencourt defensive pressure and a less deliberate offense. He has launched a successful "Playmakers" booster group that supports fifth-year scholarships and drastically improved the program's graduation rate. It's

been a hectic pace since he was handed the reins in November of 1988 when McQuarn suddenly resigned three weeks before the season opener.

Sneed officially was named head coach on March 11, 1989 when he signed a 3-year contract. The appointment after an open and thorough nationwide search came the day after the conclusion of an "interim" 1988-89 season that saw him bring renewed energy and excitement to Titan basketball.

After three years as an assistant at Arizona and San Diego State and eight years under McQuarn at Fullerton, Sneed was thrust into the head coaching role on Nov. 3, 1988. What he lacked in time was compounded by other shortcomings — no returning starters, a roster of barely 10 healthy players and no chance to hire another assistant coach.

"I told the players that we could hopefully surprise one another and surprise others out

there," Sneed recalls. "There were not a lot of expectations for us."

The Titans responded with a thrilling 16-13 season. Picked to finish ninth in the Big West Conference, they tied for fourth and gained the semi-finals of the post-season tournament. They went 8-2 in games decided by 3 points or less and were 5-1 in overtime games including their first win over UNLV in six years. Last year's team, with basically the same personnel, had less good fortune in close games and finished 13-16 including 6-12 to finish seventh in the Big West.

"A lot of people stood behind me that first year in a difficult situation, and I am thankful to them," said Sneed, 42. "The faculty, administration and fans... everyone was very positive and gave me a lot of help. I was fortunate to get the opportunity. A lot of assistants never

get that chance."

Sneed has paid his coaching dues. He began at Verbum Dei High School in Los Angeles as an assistant to McQuarn. After two years he succeeded McQuarn and immediately won the 1974 CIF Championship and Coach of the Year honors when he guided the Eagles to a 30-2 record and the mythical national championship by National Sport News Service. He followed that up with two more Camino Real League titles with 28-1 and 23-5 seasons for a three-year prep record of 81-8 (.910).

He went to Arizona as an assistant to Fred Snowden for the 1976-77 season which saw the 21-6 Wildcats compete in the NCAA Tournament. He was at San Diego State under Tim Vezie for two years. The 1977-78 Aztecs won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association title but were eliminated in the post-season tournament by Cal State Fullerton.


After 11 years as a college assistant, Sneed has special compassion for the assistant

coach and his chances of becoming a head coach.

"The goal I had for a number of years was to be a Division I head coach," he explained. "Sometime you don't get that opportunity, because it's not like a player, who can walk on to show his ability. A coach never has that opportunity.

"One of my priorities is to improve the academic situation at the university," said Sneed. "We have been working very hard at that, to bring about a change in attitude in our athletes and to raise our graduation rate. We're not going to complete that immediately, but we are off to a good start. Full realization of that goal will be over a longer period of time."

Sneed and his wife, Rose, live in Anaheim with 3-year-old daughter Ashley.



Assistant Coaches



Dan Dion Second year St. Mary's ('76)

Dan Dion returns for a second year on the Titans' coaching staff for the 1990-91 season.

Dion, 36, was an assistant to Coach Neil McCarthy for seven years — three at Weber State (1982-83 through 1984-85) and four (1985-86 through 1988-89) at New Mexico State. The Aggies posted a 70-54 record during his tenure and annually

were in the top half of the Big West standings. Dion also played for McCarthy at St. Patrick's High School in Vallejo and began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Weber State in 1976-77.

Dion was an All-Big Sky Conference selection as a sophomore at Weber State before transferring to St. Mary's, where he was team captain. He served as head coach for five years at St. Patrick's, where he had scored more than 2,000 points in an illustrious prep career.

"Dan is a quality addition to our staff," said head coach John Sneed upon his April 19, 1989 appointment. "I've known Dan for several years. He is a hard worker with great knowledge on and off the floor."

Dan and his wife, Karen, have an 8-year-old daughter, Lindsay.



Bob Hofman First year Colorado ('74)

Bob Hofman joined the Titans' coaching staff in June after a successful run as head coach at Eastern Washington University.

Hofman, 39, took Eastern Washington to within a lastsecond 3-point shot of last year's NCAA Tournament. The Eagles, who had finished second in the regular season Big Sky

Conference standings, lost to Idaho, 65-62, in the finals of the post-season tournament. For his turnaround after combined records of 14-43 the previous two years, Hofman was selected Big Sky Coach of the Year. He resigned his post in May and took a position as Special Assistant to the Vice President.

The former University of Colorado guard previously served four years as head coach at Fort Lewis College in Durango, CO. He guided the team to an inaugural Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference championship in 1986-87 with a 21-6 overall record and 12-2 league mark to win Coach of the Year honors. His four-year record was 68-47.

Hofman played football and basketball at Pasadena High School (1969). He and his wife, Nancy, have three sons -- Luke, Robby and Nick.



David Grossman Fourth year Cal State Fullerton ('87)

David Grossman returns to the Titans' basketball program as a part-time assistant after a one-year hiatus. Grossman, 28, served on a volunteer basis during the 1986-87 season and was a graduate assistant during the 1987-88 and 1988-89 cam-

paigns, the first under George McQuarn and the second under John Sneed. When not assisting on the floor, he has been in charge of study hall and film exchange.

Grossman graduated from Cal State Fullerton in 1987, obtaining a bachelor's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports management. He is working on his master's degree in physical education.

A two-year varsity letterman at Emil R. Buchser High School in Santa Clara, Grossman played one season at West Valley Junior College in Saratoga. There he earned an associate arts degree in business administration before matriculating to Concordia College in Portland, Oregon.

A native of Brooklyn, New York, Grossman came to Fullerton to concentrate on academics. He assisted with recruiting and player development at West Valley and his goal is to coach basketball at the collegiate level. Grossman is single and lives in Fullerton.

Academics Coordinator



Alison Cone

Eighth year Washington State

Alison Cone is in her eighth year at Cal State Fullerton as Academics Coordinator, assisting student-athletes in reaching their academic goals. She organizes the tutorial programs, sets up study

halls and conducts advisement sessions with each athlete.

Cone previously served as assistant athletics director and advising and eligibility coordinator at Cal State Dominguez Hills.

A native of Washington, Cone earned her bachelor's degree at Washington State and her teaching certificate at Central Washington. She coached tennis, basketball, track and soccer at Auburn High School and basketball and volleyball at Green River Community College in Washington.

Cone worked on her master's degree at Dominguez Hills, where she also lectured in physical education classes and served as women's tennis coach for the 1982-83 season. She is single and lives in Fullerton.

Season Preview

Two years into his first head coaching assignment, John Sneed already has come full circle as he heads into the 1990-91 Cal State Fullerton basketball season with only one full-time returnee from his starting lineup of a year ago. He was faced with a similar situation in 1988-89 when he was thrust into an "interim" head coaching position in November with no returning starters and responded with a surprising 16-13 record.

While he isn't promising a similarly successful run with this year's newcomers, he does forecast an exciting, cohesive unit that will play together better than last year's 13-16 squad.

"I like the chemistry of this year's team," said Sneed. "They should be an enjoyable group to work with and coach. It will be a big change for us, but the drawbacks are our lack of experience and depth.

"You look around the conference and you see everyone else has a lot of returning starters. We have the least returning starting experience. We are counting on some junior college newcomers to come in and make a major contribution. They are promising but haven't played a minute of Division I basketball."

Leading scorers Cedric Ceballos and Mark Hill have moved on, Ceballos to the Phoenix Suns and Hill via graduation along with center David Moody and forward Van Anderson. Two-year starter Wayne Williams is back at point guard but forward Agee Ward, who split starting time with Anderson, is the only other returning Titan who has seen significant playing time last year. Other lettermen returning are perimeter players Dareck Crane and Bruce Bowen and inside players Ron Caldwell and Aaron Wilhite. Sneed is also counting heavily on redshirt J.D. Green, who transferred a year ago from SMU and practiced with the team, to step in and assume a major scoring role.

Williams led last year's team in assists with 209, the third best total in school history, and has a chance to break Leon Wood's career record of 744. Williams averaged 9.8 points and hit three more long-distance "buzzer beater" baskets but shot only 34 per cent from the floor.

Ward averaged 6.4 points and 4.8 rebounds despite Fall injuries and illness that prevented him from attaining optimum physical condition. He averaged 19 minutes per game. Wilhite played surprisingly well, particularly in non-conference play, and averaged 3.7 points and 3.1 rebounds over 29 appearances. Caldwell became eligible in December and averaged 4.0 points and 2.4 rebounds in 12 games, starting only once.

Crane and Bowen played sparingly behind Hill and Ceballos, respectively, who averaged 70 minutes between them. Crane played in all 29 games and averaged 2.3 points while Bowen played in only 18 games and averaged 1.7 points.

Five newcomers including two junior college transfers provide a large dose of new blood. A probable starter at shooting guard is Joe Small, who led all California JC players in scoring with a 25.3 point average for College of the Sequoias. Kevin Ahsmuhs, a 6-8 forward, averaged 16 points and 10 rebounds while earning all-state honors at San Diego Mesa and should see considerable action.

Four freshmen, two of whom signed in November, returning walk-on guard Tom Parada and a walk-on JC transfer complete the roster. Michael Bloodworth (14 ppg, 10 rpg)

is a 6-foot-6 wing player from Palisades High in Los Angeles. Marcus Bell (23 ppg, 5.5 apg) is a 6-1 point guard from Etiwanda High while 6-foot-3 Greg Vernon averaged 23 points and 7 rebounds in the backcourt for University High of Los Angeles and was the MVP of the annual City-CIF All-Star game. Walk-ons Jason Kerian, a freshman center from Minto, North Dakota, High School, and junior guard Randy Allen from Chabot College in Hayward are new to the program.

"This is our first real recruiting class," said Sneed. "With the addition of two or three more players next year of the same caliber, we should be competing at a solid level in the Big West Conference."

HIGH SCHOOL: Led Manual Arts High School of Los Angeles to a 27-3 record and the California large schools state championship in 1988... team upset city champion Crenshaw in the regionals and then beat Bishop O'Dowd of Oakland in the Oakland-Alameda Coliseum for the state title... Williams scored 25 points including the game-winning basket... in the regional, Williams scored a regional tournament single-game record 30 points in the 89-82 victory which avenged two earlier losses including a 16-point defeat in the city title game... averaged 18 points and 7 assists for the season... earned first-team all-state honors and was state's Most Valuable Player... two-time MVP and twice all-city... three-year varsity letterman... averaged 15 points and 5 assists as a junior and 12 points and 5 assists as a sophomore.

The Big West Conference is in its third year of existence since changing its name from the Pacific Coast Athletic Association prior to the 1988 football season. The name is seen as a simpler, more accurate description of the league's 11 member institutions -- Cal State Fullerton, Fresno State, Long Beach State, New Mexico State, San Jose State, UC Irvine (no football), UC Santa Barbara (Div. III football), Hawaii (women only), UNLV, Pacific and Utah State.

When the league was formed in 1969, it consisted of seven charter members, all of which were located in the state of California. In its 20 years of existence, however, the conference has expanded to include universities from states which are not on nor near the Pacific Ocean (Utah, Nevada and New Mexico).

Basketball success among Big West institutions has been growing over the years and reached its apex in April when UNLV won the NCAA championship in convincing fashion over Duke. The Rebels, who have become permanent members of the Top 20 polls the past few years, did not win the Big West Championship outright. New Mexico State tied the Rebels for the regular season title and earned the No. 1 seed in the post-season tournament by virtue of the tiebreaker and the Aggies' sweep of third-place UC Santa Barbara, which went on to beat Houston in the first round of the NCAA tourney.

In fact, the Big West had the best overall record (7-2, .778) in the tournament. UNLV went 6-0, UCSB was 1-1 and New Mexico State lost to "Cinderella" team Loyola Marymount.

Prior to conference play, the Big West had a memorable season, posting a 71-37 record against non-conference foes. All but two Big West teams had winning non-conference records. A total of 35 starters return from the 10 Big West rosters with five teams returning as many as four starters.

A record-equalling performance from the floor offset a poor free-throw shooting night for the Titans, who avenged their overtime loss in Logan to Utah State.

Mark Hill came full circle from his frigid night in Santa Barbara, hitting 8 of 9 shots including 4 of 5 from 3-point range to help Fullerton tie its school record for field goal percentage at .682 -- matching the 30 for 44 performance vs. McNeese State (and Joe Dumars) in the 1983-84 season opener in Hawaii.

Fullerton's losing streak reached six and a frustrating low as the Titans were thoroughly outplayed by the host Anteaters, who had won only three games previously.

A 3-point barrage led by freshman Dylan Rigdon offset any hopes the Titans had of rallying. UCI hit 14 out of 22 to set a CSF opponent record, breaking the old mark of 13 set by UCI at home a year earlier.

UCI scored the first 10 points of the game and the Titans never got closer than 5 at 12-7. In the second half, they made an early run to cut a 15-point half time deficit to at 48-39 with 16:48 to go. But Ricky Butier stole a rebound from Agee Ward and that led to a 3-point play by Jeff Herdman. A Fullerton turnover preceded a 3-pointer by Rod Palmer and in less than a minute it was a 15-point game again. The lead grew to as many as 24 points and approached the worst CSF loss ever to UCI – 26 points in 1966-67.

A road weary UNLV team wandered into a packed Titan Gym where the Titans were honoring their seniors in their final home game with hopes of a victory to snap a 6-game losing streak. But any thoughts of an upset of the nation's No. 2-ranked team evaporated in 39 seconds. That's how long it took Anderson Hunt to hit a pair of 3-point field goals and the Titans found themselves down, 6-0, after having touched the ball only one time.

The Rebels didn't run or shoot as if they were tired. They hit 68 per cent in the first half and finished the game at .649 including 5 of 7 3-pointers. They led the entire way and by as many as 27 points before the Titans made a late run, cutting the gap to 15 at 83-68 with 9:09 on a putback by Cedric Ceballos. The rally was stopped when a pair of technicals were called on the crowd for throwing candy on the floor, even though one of the instigators was wearing a UNLV cap.

Ceballos ran his career averages to UNLV to 28.2 points and 15 rebounds but UNLV became the first team to break the century mark against the Titans since Portland did it in the 1980-81 opener.

The Titans are on the wrong end of a tournament streak with UNLV. The Rebels ran their winning streak in tourney play to six over the Titans, knocking them out in the quarterfinal round with an overpowering performance by Player of the Year Larry Johnson.

After jumping to a 12-0 lead as Fullerton turned the ball over on six of its first nine possessions, the Rebels toyed with the Titans, who got 14-point first halves from both Cedric Ceballos and Wayne Williams. Fullerton hung close, cutting the margin to 7 on several occasions and trailing by 10 at the half. It was still a 9-point game at 62-53 when Ron Caldwell hit two buckets in a row. But the Rebels went on a 7-0 run to make it 69-53 and they gradually pulled away as Johnson scored 9 consecutive UNLV points in one span.

The Rebels' total of 115 points was the most scored against a Fullerton team since the 1972-73 campaign when Utah State did it in a non-conference game. The record for opponents is 117 points by Cal State Northridge in 1983-64.

Cal State Fullerton has been well represented at the professional level despite the relative youth of the intercollegiate basketball program.

Seven Titans were drafted in the past seven years and several more players have signed as free agents. The Titans hit it big in 1984 when two players made National Basketball Association rosters -- guard Leon Wood with Philadelphia and center Ozell Jones with San Antonio. Each was subsequently traded more than once. Wood is in his sixth NBA season with Minnesota. Jones has been

in and out of the NBA, most recently on the summer roster of the Indiana Pacers.

From the decade of the 1970s, the Titans saw forward Greg Bunch play for the New York Knicks and forward Mike Niles play with the Phoenix Suns. Foreign leagues have featured the likes of center Herman Webster, Boagni and sharpshooter Kevin Heenan to name a few.
