**PRESS ROOM:** Room 162 in the eastern wing of the gymnasium building serves as the press room for Titan basketball. Three telephones are available approximately 10 minutes after the final buzzer.

**PRESS TABLE:** Located on the south side of the playing floor, behind the scorer's table. A limited number of working spots are available.

**GAME SUMMARIES:** Will be collated and distributed in Room 162 of the gymnasium building. Halftime box scores, play-by-play accounts and final box scores will be provided.

**TELEPHONES:** There is one telephone at the press table — **(714) 773-3970** — which must be kept free for messages, out-of-town scores, etc. Additional telephones **cannot** be installed at the press table due to physical limitations of the building.

**RADIO:** The broadcast position is adjacent to the scorer's table. A telephone will be provided the designated commercial station for each visiting school in Titan Gym. No additional phones may be installed due to the physical limitations of the building. Use (714) 773-3970 as your trouble number.

**LOCKER ROOMS:** Located off the hallway on the north side of the playing floor. George McQuarn will conduct post-game interviews in the equipment manager's office just outside the Fullerton locker room. Players will be brought to the same area upon request after a reasonable cooling off period.

**CREDENTIALS:** Requests should be made as far in advance as possible. When time permits, credentials will be mailed. If not, Press Will Call is located at the western entrance to the gymnasium. Credentials MUST BE WORN IN PLAIN SIGHT to access the doors leading to the locker rooms and press rooms.

**SCOUTS:** Requests should be made at least one week in advance.

**PARKING:** Except on Monday through Thursday evenings, ample free parking is available in the lot immediately west of the Gymnasium. On Monday through Thursday evenings, parking is available by:

a) Using athletics Lot A and paying \$1.50 upon entry for a daily permit, or

**b)** Obtaining a complimentary pass upon presentation of news credential from the visitors information booth located on the south side of campus, northwest of the intersection of Commonwealth and Nutwood Avenues.

# THE UNIVERSITY

California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing.

Classes were offered for the first time in 1959 and the first commencement — for five students — took place in 1960.

The University's 24,000 students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes, although nearly 400 now live on campus in newly completed residence halls.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 775-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The University enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, communications, dance, education, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, speech and hearing, and theatre. All told there are 85 degree programs — 41 of them at the graduate level plus several credential programs and six certificate programs.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is an internship and cooperative education program that allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours without the formalities of regular admission to the University.

Still another strong point is the University's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the network of community support groups, including the Titan Athletic Foundation.

Further examples of community outreach are the new Ruby Gerontology Center, which serves as an educational and research facility for the study of aging and a meeting place for the Continuing Learning Experience support group.

Through a series of joint ventures started in 1979 with the establishment of the Fullerton Arboretum and continuing now with the construction of the Marriott Hotel, the University and the City of Fullerton are working to complete an on-campus sports complex by mid-1990. Already in use are two lighted softball fields. When the main part of the sports complex is finished, it will include a stadium for football, soccer and other activities plus a pavilion for baseball.

To reinforce the University's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State has embarked on a comprehensive fund-raising campaign. Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great university.

## Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb, President

Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb became the third president of Cal State Fullerton on Oct. 1, 1981.

Dr. Cobb had served as dean of Douglass College at Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey, since 1976. There she also held the rank of professor of biological sciences. Prior to her Douglass appointment she was dean of Connecticut College and professor of zoology for seven years. Previously, she was professor of biology at Sarah Lawrence College in New York.

Known for her work in cell physiology, her promotion of the advancement of women in scientific fields and her activities on behalf of minorities, she is the first black woman to head a major public

university on the West Coast.

Cobb earned her bachelor's degree from Talladega College in Alabama and her M.S. and Ph.D. in cell physiology from New York University. She also holds 16 honorary doctorates. She is the mother of a son, Jonathan, a graduate of the Cornell University Medical School now serving as a resident physician at Mt. Sinai Medical Center in New York.

# THE NICKNAME and MASCOT

"What exactly is a Titan?"

"Why do you have an elephant for your mascot?"

Those are two of the first questions that arise when a Cal State Fullerton athletic team makes its inaugural visit to a new town. While the relatively young institution carved out of citrus groves may be too new for many traditions, there are some legends.

"It was the students' decision in a vote," explains Dr. Ernest Becker, founding Dean of Students, of the nickname 'Titans.' "More than a hundred names were suggested, and the Student Council took on the job of narrowing the list down for the purposes of an election. The vote was close, with Titans narrowly prevailing over Aardvarks and Rebels."

It was a unique student body at "Orange County State College" at the outset with only upper division students until 1963. There were 453 students, mostly female, in 1959, the first year of classes. They voted to organize as a student body and assess themselves \$10 per semester.

"Even when it was decided that 'Titans' would be the nickname, there was confusion as to what it represented," said Becker. "I was thinking of a large mythological figure from Greek history, not unlike Tommy Trojan, but with perhaps straighter, more modern lines. In the same vein, the original dormitories were named Othrys Hall. There were others, however, who related the name to the Titan missile then in prominence."

Nothing official was done about a mascot because no one knew quite what to do. Until, of course, the "First Intercollegiate Elephant Race in Human History."

What began as a practical joke turned into probably the biggest "happening" on the campus to this day. The "gag" attracted elephants from universities around the nation and even Oxford from England. A crowd estimated at more than 10,000 people turned out on "Dumbo Downs" as the hastily graded field became known that Spring afternoon in 1962.

To publicize the event, a circus-like elephant called "Tuffy the Titan" was used and it began appearing on sweaters and notebook covers around the campus. Several revisions in the caricature have been made in recent years to create a more tenacious Tuffy, or Titus as he also was called in an attempt to make him Greek.

The mascot easily outlived the race. In 1963, one elephant charged into the crowd causing minor injuries and the early signs of a now-common liability insurance crisis halted a tradition in the bud.


The origin of the school colors also bears discussion. The students voted for royal blue and white when they chose Titans, but the athletic equipment manager at the time thought orange was an appropriate color on uniforms for a school known as Orange County State College. The unofficial color was adopted just as the unofficial elephant.

When Lynn Eilefson was appointed athletic director in 1982, he furthered the cause of orange because of its uniqueness and brightness compared to the wide variety of blues. Thus, the "Orange Crush" booster group was born and the color remains predominant in most team uniforms.

And, finally, there is the matter of the school's name. As mentioned earlier, the name originally was Orange County State College. It's also been Orange State College and later California State College at Fullerton or California State College, Fullerton. The change to university status necessitated a further change to California State University, Fullerton, but the school's address could not be changed from 800 N. State College Boulevard. And that's only the start of the confusion.

To out-of-staters, the sky seems to be the limit because most don't realize there are two distinct systems of higher education in the state — the University of California and the State University system. So, we've been called everything from Cal-Fullerton to UC Fullerton to California State Fullerton State to simply Fullerton State. The preferred moniker is Cal State Fullerton, which is what most of the more than 50,000 graduates call it. But since there are only two other major institutions known as Titans (University of Detroit and Oral Roberts University), just call Fullerton teams the "Titans!"

# ATHLETICS DEPARTMENT-



The rapid climb of Ed Carroll through the ranks of the Cal State Fullerton athletic department culminated in his appointment as Director of Athletics on July 1, 1985.

University President Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb made the announcement on May 28, 1985, after a nationwide search and Carroll, now 38, immediately ushered in an era of "positive thinking" for Titan athletics.

"One of my priorities has been to enhance the image of our athletic program by stressing positives," says Carroll. "We must use the power of positive thinking to overcome our limitations and build our program to greater heights."

One of Carroll's first moves was to upgrade the football schedule. The Titans have played LSU, Florida and West Virginia the past few seasons. With the new stadium complex now firmly on the horizon, Carroll has signed Mississippi State, Colorado State and Army to home and home series. Road games at San Diego State and Georgia also have been added.

Carroll scored a hiring coup when he was able to replace Augie Garrido with equally successful Larry Cochell as the baseball coach. Cochell took the Titans to the College World Series in his first season and was selected national Coach of the Year by "Collegiate Baseball Magazine."

Building plans are being finalized and construction has begun indirectly on an on-campus Sports Complex to provide a playing facility for football, soccer and baseball. A Marriott Hotel is being erected on campus and the revenue it generates will help finance the \$6.7 million athletics project.

Carroll began his Fullerton athletic career as a wrestler. In 1972, he served as team captain and was selected the "Most Outstanding Wrestler" in the California Collegiate Athletic Association championship meet. He later served as an assistant to former head coach Don Matson.

Carroll earned bachelor's degrees in history (1972) and physical education (1974) from Fullerton as well as a secondary teaching credential. He taught physical education classes at Fullerton and earned a master's degree in recreation administration from Long Beach State.

After serving in various capacities in the Fullerton recreation department, Carroll left briefly in mid-1980 to serve as a recreational sports programmer and doctoral intern at Indiana University. He returned to Fullerton in November, 1980, as an assistant athletic director and later served as acting director of the Titan Athletic Foundation. He then served under athletic director Lynn Eilefson, who left in January, 1985.

Ed and his wife Connie live in Fullerton with young children Brandon and Kimberly.



# COACHING STAFF

#### Acting Head Coach John Sneed, 1st/9th year



John Sneed was thrust into his first collegiate head coaching role on Nov. 3, three weeks into practice drills, when George McQuarn resigned after eight years at the helm. Sneed's appointment will carry through the entire season, his ninth in the Fullerton program.

Sneed most recently had worked primarily with the forwards and coordinated the scouting of opponents among his myriad duties for the Titans. He has coordinated recruiting and the academic program and tutorial services and also has made a major contribution toward the promotion and marketing of Titan basketball. He has been the inspiration behind many promotional themes and home attendance has more than doubled during his tenure.

Sneed, 40, brought experience with winning Division I programs and remarkably successful high school teams to Fullerton when he became a member of McQuarn's original Titan staff in 1980.

Sneed was an assistant for one year at the University of Arizona, a 21-6 season (1976-77) which took the Wildcats to the NCAA playoffs. During 1977-78 he was an assistant at San Diego State and the 19-8 Aztecs won the PCAA title before being eliminated in the post-season tournament by Cal State Fullerton. He also was at San Diego in 1978-79.

Sneed succeeded McQuarn at Verbum Dei High School in Los Angeles in 1974 and won the CIF 4A title and CIF Coach of the Year honors with a 30-2 record. His Eagles won two more Camino Real League titles with 28-1 and 23-5 seasons and three times he was league coach of the year. His career prep mark was 81-8 (.910) and the 1974 team was recognized as national champion by the National Sport News Service.

A Cal State Long Beach graduate, Sneed served two years as an assistant to McQuarn at Verbum Dei. He is a native of Gastonia, North Carolina. He and wife Rose and one-year-old daughter Ashley live in Garden Grove.

## Assistant Coach Donny Daniels, 3rd year



Donny Daniels returns for his third year as a full-time assistant at Cal State Fullerton, where he has been a familiar face for many years. He will take on added duties with the departure of George McQuarn, particularly in the period of time it takes to appoint an additional assistant.

The former Titan player's primary responsibility lies with recruiting, where the Titans' most recent influx of signees was ranked No. 36 in the nation by Off the Glass Magazine. On the floor, Daniels is responsible for teaching and developing the centers. In addition, he has initiated an off-season weight-training program for all players.

Daniels resumed his Fullerton relationship after two successful seasons at Los Angeles Harbor Junior College in Wilmington. The Seahawks posted an overall mark of 33-29 in his two seasons in-

cluding the championship of the Moorpark Tournament and they made two trips to the state playoffs. In 1985-86, they advanced to the final round of eight.

Daniels, who graduated with a degree in criminal justice, played forward for two seasons at Cal State Fullerton (1974-75 and 1975-76) under coach Bobby Dye and was selected the team's top defensive player as a senior.

A graduate of Verbum Dei High School and a member of George McQuarn's Eagle basketball team, Daniels' first coaching tour with the Titans came during the 1981-82 and 1982-83 seasons.

Donny, his wife Christine and young children Eric and Kalynn live in Chino.


A two-year varsity letterman at Emil R. Buchser High School in Santa Clara, Grossman played one season at West Valley Junior College in

# **SEASON PREVIEW**

A strong recruiting crop and the healthy return of 1986-87 starting forward **Derek Jones** are being counted upon to offset the untimely departure of coach George McQuarn and the loss of two of the most productive players in the history of Cal State Fullerton men's basketball.

With four-year lettermen Richard Morton and Henry Turner now pursuing professional playing careers, acting head coach John Sneed will quickly try to put together a new nucleus by Dec. 1 when the Titans open the season at the University of Utah. The lack of even a single returning starter from last season gave rise to numerous question marks and the Nov. 3 transition from McQuarn to Sneed will no doubt produce further changes.

"If we don't all pull together at the outset, things could be real tough for us," said Sneed, whose assignment will cover the entire season.

"Maybe this will pull everybody together," said assistant Donny Daniels, whose role also has been expanded.

New will be the watchword of 1988-89 Titan basketball.

"Most of the players are new, the conference has a new name, it's a new situation for me, personally, and this is a new situation for the program — we usually have a couple of starters back to build around," said Sneed. "I've got some ideas about the new and old people, but it should be an interesting December schedule. We should be a stronger club in the second half of the season."

The initial question mark concerns the condition of Jones (6-7 senior, Millikan HS and Long Beach CC), who was shot from behind and wounded in the back and left arm in a random street shooting near his home in Long Beach on Aug. 30, 1987. The senior southpaw could not attend school last year and has not completely regained all of the feeling in the fingers of his left hand.

"We will just have to see what he can do in game situations," said Sneed. "His ability to catch the ball is the primary concern. But we need his experience and leadership on the floor."

Jones averaged 8.7 points and 5.7 rebounds in 1986-87 and his absence last year was a major factor in the Titans' first losing season (12-17) in seven years. He has played only one season of the past three, having sat out 1985-86 at Long Beach City College to obtain his Associate of Arts degree.

If Jones can compensate for the departure of Turner, the Titans' No. 3 all-time rebounder and No. 4 all-time scorer, then Sneed can concentrate on replacing the scoring punch provided by Morton. The second-team all-conference guard averaged 22 points last season and finished second only to Leon Wood in Titan career scoring with 1,705 points. He made the opening day roster of the Indiana Pacers.

"Cedric Ceballos (6-7 junior, Dominguez HS and Ventura JC) will fill the scorer's role even though he will play the small forward position for us," says Sneed. "He did a lot of things for Ventura College last year and will be on the floor a lot for us."

Ceballos was the leading scorer in California junior college ranks last year, averaging 28 points per game while also pulling down 11 rebounds. He was the Most Valuable Player of the Western States Conference and a JC All-American. He was ranked as high as the No. 3 JC recruit nationally and lifted the Titans to a ranking in the Top 20 JC recruiting classes, which also included College of Eastern Utah forward William Allen, who quit the Titan squad in late October, and Los Angeles Harbor College guard **Mark Hill**.

"Hill (6-3 junior, Locke HS and L.A. Harbor JC) is the best outside shooter in our program," said Sneed."

Allen is the all-time leading scorer in CEU history with 1,418 points. He was an honorable mention JC All-American and is a physical, aggressive rebounder but left due to personal problems.

Hill is a two-time all-conference selection who averaged 23 points last season. He is an accomplished jump shooter with 3-point range.

A pair of local freshmen also are expected to make an immediate impact on a squad of 12 players, only five of whom were on last year's roster. Both **Wayne Williams** of Manual Arts High and **Michael Brown** from Westchester could find themselves in the Titans' backcourt come December.

Williams led the Toilers to the state championship last year. The 6-foot-1 point guard scored a regional-final record 30 points in an upset victory over Crenshaw High and then tallied 25 including the game-winning basket in a one-point victory in the title game against Bishop O'Dowd High in Oakland. He has 3-point range and is an excellent defender.

Brown is a versatile 6-foot-7 athlete who could play either guard position or small forward. He averaged 14 points and 12 rebounds last year. But he still was missing from practice in November due to a bout with mononucleosis.

The returning "veterans" are center **John Sykes** (6-8 junior, Merced HS and U. of Texas) and guard **Marlon Vaughn** (6-1 junior, Dominguez HS), each of whom averaged about 10 minutes a game and started on only two occasions. The other lettermen are forward **Brent Calvin** (6-8 senior, Redwood HS and College of Sequoias), who played in only nine games before suffering a kneecap injury; guard **Randal Moos** (6-4 senior, Palisades HS and Santa Monica CC), who hit four 3-point baskets during a season that consisted of 45 minutes of action; and forward **Benson Williams**, a walk-on from the University of Illinois-Chicago who didn't become eligible until mid-season.

Two redshirts who could make a contribution are center **David Moody** (6-8 junior, Central HS of Omaha) and forward **Rashone Lewis** (6-5 sophomore, Verbum Dei HS). Moody chose to sit out last season after two years as a lightly used reserve and could press for playing time at center. Lewis was a victim of Proposition 48 and must overcome a year of inactivity.


"It's no coincidence that we have a lot of home games on the schedule this year," says Sneed, who has trips only to Utah, San Diego and Portland among a nine-game pre-conference slate. "We knew we were losing five seniors from last year's team and would have a young squad this year. We just didn't know we also would lose Bobby Adair (drop out) and Van Anderson (academics). Losing Coach and William Allen were really surprises."








A varied combination of the Prime Ticket regional network package, the University cable channel and the various packages of institutions the Titans will visit will keep Cal State Fullerton basketball "on the tube" most of the 1988-89 season.

Prime Ticket will feature a vastly expanded schedule of Big West Conference games this year with 21 "exposures" of teams. The Titans will be featured three times: at home vs. New Mexico State on Jan. 3; at UNLV on Jan. 16; and at San Jose State on Feb. 18.

Many of Fullerton's home games will be televised on a delayed basis via Titan Sports Productions under the supervision of professor Larry Ward. Ed Larkin and Greg Bunch provide the play-by-

play coverage. The feed is used to provide the games to cable subscribers in Fullerton, Yorba Linda, Placentia, Anaheim and Villa Park via the auspices of the University channel (54) in Fullerton.

Of course, the Titans also gain exposure on the road when home teams send their games out on cable, VHF and UHF stations.

On July 1, 1988, the Pacific Coast Athletic Association marked the beginning of the league's 20th year by changing its name to the Big West Conference. The new name is seen as a simpler, more accurate description of the league's 12 member institutions — Cal State Fullerton, Fresno State, Long Beach State, New Mexico State, San Diego State (women only), San Jose State, UC Irvine, UC Santa Barbara, University of Hawaii (women only), UNLV, Pacific and Utah State.

When the league was formed in 1969, it consisted of seven charter members, all of which were located in the state of California. In its 19 years of existence, however, the conference has expanded to include universities from states which are not on nor near the Pacific Ocean (Utah, Nevada and New Mexico). Because of this expansion, the new name will serve to better identify all of the conference's member institutions.

Recent highlights of the league's success include the 1987 NCAA basketball championships, when, for the first time ever, the conference had a representative in both the men's (UNLV) and women's (Long Beach State) Final Four. Last season, three of the league's men's basketball teams (UNLV, Utah State and UC Santa Barbara) were invited to the NCAA Regionals — the most ever for the conference.

Another first occurred in the spring of 1988 when three conference baseball teams (Cal State Fullerton, Fresno State and UNLV) received bids to the NCAA Regionals, with Fullerton and Fresno State both advancing to the College World Series in Omaha where Fullerton tied for third.

Six conference teams were invited to the NCAA women's volleyball championship last fall and conference member Hawaii won the national title, making it the third consecutive national volleyball championship for the league (Pacific won in 1985 and 1986).

Four conference teams received bids to the NCAA Softball Regionals last spring (Fresno State, Long Beach State, Fullerton and associate member Cal Poly Pomona) and two of them — Fresno State and Pomona — participated in the College World Series with Fresno State placing second.

The Titans had a great start and an inspired finish, but, in between, Pepperdine dominated the game with an impressive shooting display.

Obstacles and adversity. Grass roots support and coaches with "sandwich board" signs. Stunning upsets and courageous performances. All have been a part of Cal State Fullerton athletics as "Titan Pride" has taken limited resources to athletic successes disproportionate to such a young institution.

How many universities can claim national championships in seven different sports, a star major league third baseman, men and women basketball players in the Olympics, two rookies in the Super Bowl and the subject matter of a Walt Disney feature film?

The tenor was set by the first Titan intercollegiate team - men's basketball. In only their second season, the Titans of coach Alex Omalev advanced five rounds into the NAIA national playoffs in 1961-62.

Sixteen seasons later, the entire nation watched another "cinderella" Titan five advance to within one vic-



tory of the "Final Four" as Bobby Dye's 1977-78 team won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association post-season tournament and then beat nationally ranked New Mexico and USF to gain the finals of the Western Regional.

The basketball tradition, which included a women's national title in 1970 and coach Billie Moore and star Nancy Dunkle on the women's 1976 Olympic team, was continued in 1984 as Leon Wood helped the men to a gold medal before he became a first-round NBA draft choice. Coach George McQuarn's teams have usually been factors in the conference race and have national Top 20 rankings and a victory over the nation's No. 1-ranked and undefeated team to their credit. Fullerton also has competed twice in the NIT Tournament.

Gymnastics has brought Fullerton more fame. Coach Dick Wolfe won three college division titles (1971, 1972 and 1974) and has had recent teams in the Top Ten at the Division I level while winning 10 PCAA titles in a row. His 1987 squad was ranked No. 1 in the nation led by former Chinese Olympian Li Xiao Ping. Lynn Rogers began the women's program in 1976 and the Titans have finished fifth or better in the nation every year but two including the national title in 1979. One-armed Carol Johnston was an All-American and star of the Disney film, "Lefty," while more recently, Tami Elliott won 10 All-American awards before suffering a fractured vertebra in her senior season.

Baseball exploded on the national scene with the arrival of coach Augie Garrido. He broke the USC monopoly in the western regionals in 1975 and won the national title in 1979 behind the play of Tim Wallach, now of the Montreal Expos. He won the College World Series again in 1984 with players such as pitcher Greg Mathews of the St. Louis Cardinals. The Titans won their first six-team regional and finished third in the CWS in 1988 under the direction of new coach Larry Cochell and in September had 11 players in the major leagues.

Women have sparkled on the Fullerton diamonds, too. Coach Judi Garman founded the softball program in 1980 and the Titans have been a powerhouse, making seven trips to the College World Series in nine years. The Titans brought home their first NCAA Championship in 1986 and have been ranked No. 1 in the nation much of the past three seasons.

There have been national titles in men's cross country and women's fencing and individual standouts like golfer Martha Wilkerson and runner Mark Covert.

The Titans have won their share on the gridiron as well. Dick Coury was the inaugural coach in 1970 and he built an instant winner at the Division II level. The Titans were 27-16-1 over the first four years under Coury and successor Pete Yoder before the growing pains of moving up to Div. I were endured. But the program came of age under the guidance of Gene Murphy, who guided the team to back-to-back PCAA titles in 1983 and 1984. Several Titans have continued their careers in the National Football League led by New York Giants' cornerback Mark Collins and Chicago Bears' rookie tight end Jim Thornton.






