While we have only two crosswalks identified by signs, the Board is planning more as money in the budget allows. 

California, pedestrian deaths comprise about 22% of all traffic deaths, but our community leadership is taking steps to diminish the possibility in Leisure Village.

There are 12 crosswalks on Leisure Village Drive and four on Mountain View Drive. The crosswalks are defined by either yellow or white lines. Once a pedestrian enters a crosswalk, traffic is required to stop. When a person, particularly elderly, or disabled, and young children are crossing the street, be sure to give them plenty of time to completely cross the street.

Don't roll into the crosswalk until they are fully across. Whenever a pedestrian is attempting to cross a street, regardless if they are at an intersection or in a marked crosswalk, you should slow to a stop. It doesn't matter if there isn't a traffic light or stop sign, exercise caution instead of taking a chance.

Pedestrians have an obligation as well. First of all, wear light-colored clothing at night. While the individual may be able to see traffic, the oncoming car may not see the person in the walkway. "See and be seen" is a good motto.

As a reminder – bicyclists and golf carts must obey traffic regulations as well, and that means obeying crosswalk laws. Nuff said?

## A Free Vegetable Patch Right Before My Eyes



#### Sciuridae's Baked Summer Tomato Casserole

- 5 Tbsp olive oil
- 3 cups diced French bread cubes

10-12 large fresh tomatoes chopped,

- 1 large tomato, sliced thin
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tsp kosher salt
- 1 tsp ground black pepper
- ½ cup fresh basil, chopped
- ½ cup Parmesan cheese, grated

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Combine the tomatoes, salt, pepper and garlic in a large bowl. Set aside. Add 3 Tbsp olive oil to a large skillet over medium heat. When the oil is hot, add the bread cubes and toss to coat with oil. Toast, stirring frequently until the bread is golden brown. Add the tomato mixture to the bread cubes and stir to combine. Cook the tomato mixture for about 5 minutes, or until the tomatoes are bubbly. Spread mixture in a medium-size baking dish, which has been sprayed with non-stick cooking spray. Add a layer of thinly sliced tomatoes over the top. Sprinkle generously with Parmesan cheese and drizzle about 2 Tbsp of olive oil evenly over the casserole.

Bake for 35-40 minutes, or until the cheese is browned. Remove from oven and sprinkle the fresh basil over the top. Invite the rest of the den over.






