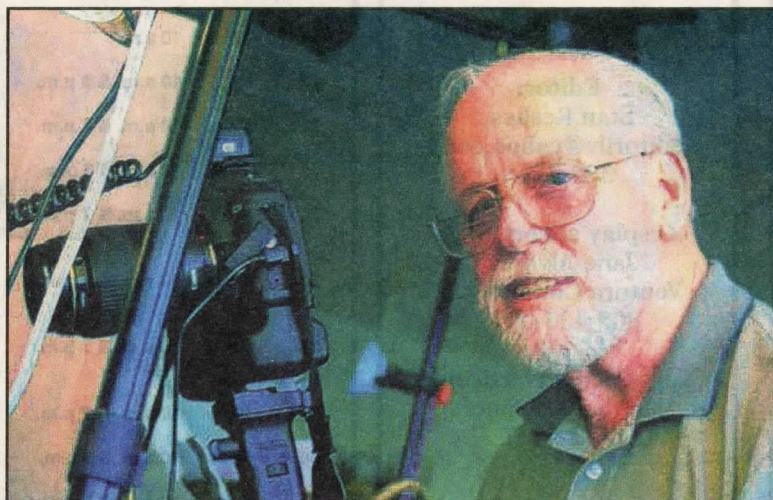
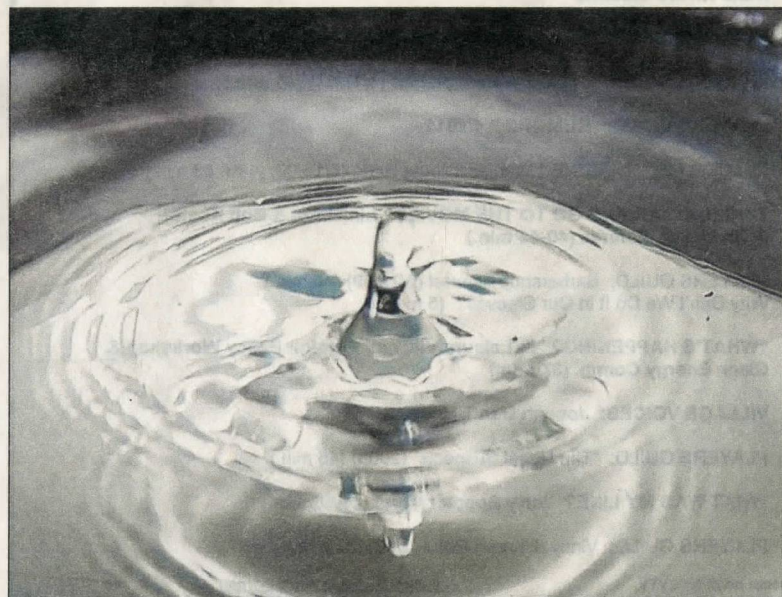

The family also had a camera with bellows which was only used for special occasions. Over Don's 30-year span in the Army, he was photographing pictures with a Leica camera

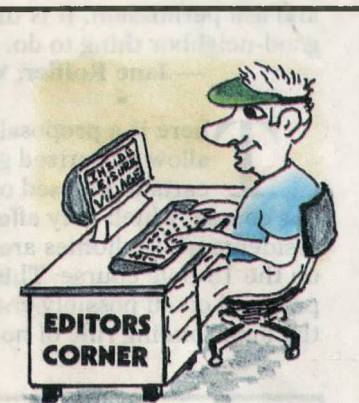
when he was stationed in Germany and a Canon during his time in both the Korean and Vietnam wars.

Lora decided to move back to California, and Don once again found himself interested in photography. By now, it was the age of digital photography. Candidates Night draws big crowd

A large crowd of LV residents attended the "Meet Your Candidates" Night Thursday evening, May 19, in the AR to hear the candidates seeking election to the Board of Directors give their reasons for running and to hear their backgrounds and their objectives for the future of the Village.

Nominee Chairman Ted Lansing introduced the candidates, incumbents Gerald Rosen and Don Marquardt, and homeowners Bob Ellis, Lynne Holmes and Robert Riveles. Homeowner candidate Robert Kulick did not appear.

Moderator Joseph Benti went over the rules and procedures for questions from the homeowners in the audience, who were required to write their name and Village address on the question card, only one question per card. The card was then given to a screener and then presented to the moderator to be read. Only the question was read, not

The program, which began at 7 p.m., ended at approximately 8:30 p.m. and was shown live on LTV.

Absentee ballots were mailed to all homeowners on May 20. The annual meeting is scheduled for Thursday, June 23, at 10 a.m., after which the results will be announced and officers for the coming year elected.

'Rumors' wins a rave review

Leisure Village: You missed it! Or at least 75 percent of you did. Missed what, you ask? You missed the absolutely fantastic presentation of "Rumors" by the Players Guild. From the opening curtain and the "frantic" performance by Karla Holland (as Chris Gorman) to the "shocked surprised" expression on Marty Simons' face as the curtain came down on the final scene, the Guild players did author Neil Simon proud.

There are 10 characters in the play: four couples and two police officers. The opening scene featured Karla and Ken Walker, with Ken playing Karla's lawyer husband. As good as Karla was, and she was outstanding, Ken matched her performance.

Then came Marty Simons (Lenny Ganz) and Ida Zeller (Claire Ganz). Again, a perfect matchup of comedy. Don Seidler played psychiatrist

Ernie Cusack to perfection, while it was at times difficult to tell if wife Cookie's (Cathy Friedman) aches, pains and muscle spasms were real or not!

The final couple, the Coopers, were played by Linda Levitz and Stan Reshes in a performance so good that they could have landed the role of the Bickersons in days past. Al Botta and Debra Guill rounded out the cast as Officers Welch and Pudney.

Good comedy (and this was good) requires much more than mere delivery of lines. Timing is critical, along with demeanor, etc. Kudos to director Don Pearlman for staging the perfect play, and, of course, to Producer Joyce Belcher and her so very competent LV crew.

Electricity discount programs go unused

Did you know that Southern California Edison estimates there are about 60,000 customers who are eligible for discounts on their electricity bills through the California Alternative Rates for Energy (CARE) plan, but have not enrolled?

SCE offers a range of programs to those customers who qualify for assistance, including:

- The CARE program, which provides a discount of 20 percent or more on customers' monthly electric bills.
- The Family Electric Rate Assistance (FERA) program, which allows a discounted rate on the monthly bill for families of three or more who fall within the income guidelines and exceed their

baseline usage by 30 percent or more.

- The Energy Savings Assistance Program (ESAP), formerly called the Energy Management Assistance program, which helps income-qualified households conserve energy and reduce their electricity costs. SCE supplies and installs energy-efficient appliances and equipment at no cost to eligible customers. ESAP services are available to homeowners and renters.

- The Energy Assistance Fund (EAF), which grants up to \$100 per year to help customers who cannot pay their electric bills. The grants are administered by United Way through community-based assistance agencies. EAF is funded by donations from SCE

employees, customers and Edison International.

- Customers who rely on electronic medical equipment may be eligible for the Medical Baseline discounted rate.

In addition, SCE can help any customer, regardless of income, with payment arrangements. Customers who need additional help should call 211 to connect with community service programs throughout California.

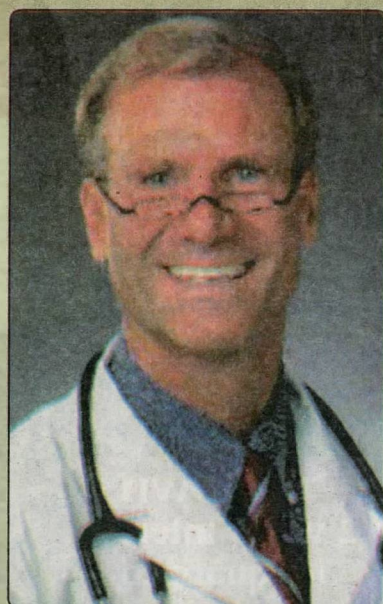

Village resident Sandy Garfield shares life's experiences

I want to tell you about a very interesting man. His name is Sandy Garfield, and he lives in Village 31 with his wife of 64 years, Bernice.

Sandy was born in New York City on Dec. 21, 1922. When he was 2 years old, the family moved to Boyle Heights in Southern California, and he has been here ever since except for his military career, so I guess you can say he is almost a native.

Being poor in those days was a fact of life, and Sandy's family was no exception. Things were tough, and the family struggled to make it and consequently didn't travel too much. Well, as you will see, Sandy made up for that big time.

Sandy attended Roosevelt High School, graduating in 1940, and he was in his second year at UCLA when the world awoke on a Sunday morning to the tragedy of Pearl Harbor. Not waiting to be drafted,

Sandy decided to join the Army Air Corps. He thought he would finally get to travel, and travel he did.

In early training he was stationed in California, Utah, South Dakota, Nevada and Texas. He received his commission to serve as a navigator on a B-24 bomber. This took him to Savannah, Ga., and then to Mitchell Field near New York City, where his crew was given a brand new plane to fly to their final destination, Italy. After all, this was not a jet, and it made numerous stops, including Newfoundland, The Azores, Morocco and Tunis before arriving at an air base in Italy.

From the base they flew missions over Germany, Austria and many countries in Central Europe. After the war in Europe ended, they were ordered to fly the plane back to the States, and this time they covered the Southern Route — Morocco again, then

across the Sahara Desert to Senegal and across the Atlantic to Natal, Brazil, then on to Guyana, Puerto Rico and finally to Mainland, USA. So, you see, Sandy got quite a bit of traveling in.

Shortly after returning to the States, Sandy went to visit an old friend. The friend's younger sister opened the door, and the rest is history.

Sandy graduated from UCLA with a degree in accounting. On Jan. 26, 1947, Bernice, the younger sister, and Sandy were married and produced three children who are the joy of their life. Sixty-four years later they are still a happy couple and have four grandchildren. One of their children is a law professor at Widener University, another teaches GED classes at a junior college in Washington, D.C., and the third is retired after teaching at a day care center in San Francisco. I wonder where they got their love

of education.

Sandy had his own business in Los Angeles for more than 40 years. It was a firm of CPAs named Garfield, Massoth and Brooks. During all this time Sandy was with the Toastmasters, speaking on all types of subjects — war experiences, world problems and, of course, baseball. He is a rabid baseball enthusiast and has studied the history of the game from its beginnings.

While in college he was also a fan of basketball.

He was also an avid bridge player and loved golf — proving his talents in many ways.

Sandy is a member of the Writers Club here in the Village. His stories are so well-written and they definitely show his talent. He has a wonderful sense of humor, and it shines through in his writings.

Friend or foe? Squirrels are cute but also destructive

While sitting on the patio with coffee in hand, and leisurely reading the morning newspaper on a warm summer morning, one might be entertained, and perhaps even amused by the antics of the common tree squirrels inhabiting our community as they sit on their haunches begging for food, or chase one another around the trunk of a tree.

On a subsequent day, however, and after one or more of these same critters has emptied the soil and destroyed the plants from three different flowerpots in an effort to bury pinecones, the words that come to mind by that same resident might perhaps more closely be described as "destructive vermin," with subsequent inner feelings more closely resembling rage, and perhaps even fleeting thoughts of annihilation.

These are the widely divergent, but oftentimes verbally expressed

viewpoints within our community for the wild animals residing within our village known as the western gray squirrel.

Although this friendly species is native to California, truth be known there were no tree squirrels prior to

1973 on the land that would soon become Leisure Village, simply because there were no trees, and this species of squirrel needs trees to survive. Our community was carved out of farmland, with the principal crop being lima beans, and to a lesser extent other truck crops. It wasn't until the farmland was converted to a residential community complete with introduced trees, primarily pine trees, that the neighboring squirrels invaded the premises and have since become well established as a resident population.

With this in mind, a question often asked by new residents relates to the rationale for rule number 19.20, a community ordinance prohibiting the artificial feeding of squirrels and other wildlife within our community. The answer may be found in basic Biology 101, wherein it is well documented that feeding wild animals and birds simply results in increased population numbers. All animal populations are

ultimately limited in scope by habitat requirements, with food resources perhaps being the most important. Rather than competing for resources, the more food provided to these friendly critters, the more tolerant they become of their neighbors, and local populations increase accordingly.

Gray squirrels provide an important component of naturally occurring biological diversity, are protected by law, provide hours of entertainment to many residents and will therefore always be a part of our community, but keep in mind that our landscape already provides sufficient food for their survival in moderate numbers. The referenced rule is in place for a reason.

So the next time you think about feeding the squirrels, or allowing your grandkids to do so, ask yourself a simple question: How many squirrels do we want residing in our community?

The AR was "swinging" on May 12 when the LV Musicians Club brought four different Camarillo High School jazz ensembles to Leisure Village.

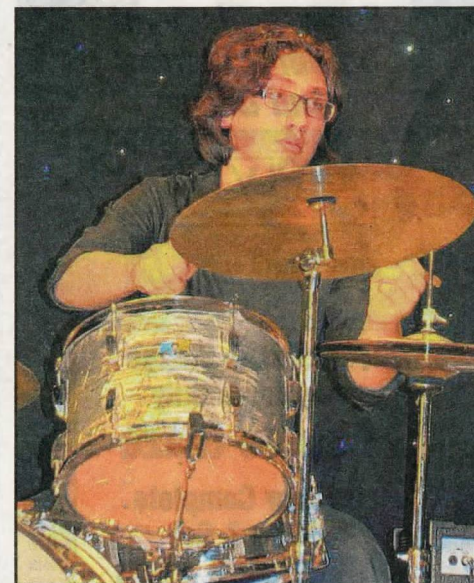
