DWIGHT L. MATHIESEN, County Assessor, reminded veterans that their property tax exemption claims should be filed soon.

California law allows all qualified veterans a \$1,000 deduction in the assessed value of their property, provided the veteran or the veteran's wife does not own property in the value of \$5,000 or more.

Under certain conditions, widows of veter-

ans may be allowed up to \$10,000 in total assets. As a prerequisite to the allowance of the veteran's claim, the interest of the claimant in the property must be of record on the lien date, which is the first Monday in March.

Veterans filing for the first time this year must personally appear in the office of the assessor, presenting their record of service, evidence of property ownership, and proof of residency in California as of Nov. 3, 1964. If the veteran is unable to personally appear, the veteran's spouse may file for the veteran. Under recent legislation, veterans purchasing property under unrecorded contracts of sale, under certain conditions, are now eligible to file for exemption. In filing for exemption, the contract must be presented so that a copy may be made for the Assessor's files.

Veterans who filed last year and who are still qualified under the \$5,000 limitation may file their affidavit by mail prior to May 2, 1966. No exemption can be allowed after 5 P.M., May 2, 1966.

All veterans who appear on the Assessor's records as the owners of real property for 1965, whose claims for exemption were allowed last year and continue to own the same property, have been mailed the neces-

sary exemption affidavit. These affidavits must be filed in detail, properly signed, and acknowledged and returned to this office at once. All questions MUST be answered.

The Assessor's office is located in the County Administration Building at 70 West Hedding Street, San Jose, and is open from 8 AM to 5 PM daily except Saturdays, Sundays and holidays. The telephone number is 299-2401.



Dear Mr. Garcia:

In the past few months, a supposedly Mexican American organization has created a ruckus within the Economic Opportunity Commission in the name of the Mexican American community. The organization I am referring to is, of course, the Mexican American Political Association. They waged a crusade to plant a director who would serve their purpose and made Arthur Potts their scapegoat. Then when their President, Mr. Isaias "Friday" Aguilera dared to voice a minority opinion, he too was bulldozed by the lynch mob.

As a member of the Mexican American community, I protest their actions since they do not represent the feelings of the community. I protest that they are referred to as the "Mexican American" leaders.

I also protest the membership of non-Latins within MAPA. Certainly an organization claiming to be a Mexican American organization, representative of the community, should not have members who do not represent our best interests in their organization.

I further protest the actions of the organization in the expulsion of Mr. Aguilera because he dared to voice his opinion. A political organization such as this which allows non-Mexican Americans to join and which allows persons of both the left and the right in their membership, certainly must allow them to be expressed if it is to exist.

And finally, I protest the statement by a member of that organization that Mr. Aguilera's difference of opinion represents the age old problem of Mexican American disunity among ourselves. I assure you that I would not compromise my beliefs just for the sake of unity. I commend Mr. Aguilera for exposing the facts and for standing up to the stampeding forces to express his opinion.

#### THE END OF THE BEGINNING

The Mexican American organizations that led the revolt to restructure the Economic Opportunity Commission (War on Poverty) to give voice to the poor and minority organizations should be commended by the community. The adamant, inflexible Executive Director Arthur Potts who was fired by the EOC was allowed to resign. After seven months the long sought victory has been achieved.

Attacks against the Mexican American organizations have been coming back fast and furious. We have been referred to as conspirators, connivers, sharks, left wing dominated, political opportunists and other such names. The record will show that throughout the seven months the Mexican American organizations never attacked the integrity or personal character of any individual or group. In other words we should make clear which side is the side that is playing dirty and using the vicious name-calling tactics.

We hope that now the War on Poverty can return to its concept - the involvement of the poor to the maximum extent in planning, policy making and operation of the program.

The only sin against us is that we were in a hurry to get rid of Potts. We lost his confidence and any delay in firing him would delay getting the war on poverty programs to the poor. He completely rejected the Mexican American groups and our concerns for the poor. In the end result he was judged by those whom he had judged. His adamant and inflexible attitude and his bureaucratic approach was no longer acceptable to many groups in our community.

Now Congressman Charles Gubser blows into town and says that the M-A groups were used by the left-wing who are trying to gain control of the program. After years and years of being one of the foremost exponents of foreign labor the Congressman could hardly qualify as having any feelings for the poor. He voted against the antipoverty program in Congress. He is the fair haired boy of the California growers. He didn't say anything about the dangerous right wing Bircher dominated element.

All we can say is, "Sorry, Charlie, we did it ourselves. Regardless of what you think the Mexican American does have the brains to solve his own problems."

They refer to our victory as the revolution. If it is, then it is a revolution for social justice. A loud cry from Americans that have been excluded for too long. We no longer want to be captives in American society, we want to be full participants.

It has been an honor for me to have served with some of the leaders from the organizations that led the charge. Albert Piñon, Dr. Y. Arturo Cabrera, Jose Martinez, Pat Vasquez, Max Ruiz, Monico Amador, Joe Sarzoza, and Ramiro Perez. Many other individuals, community groups, organized labor, gave us a great deal of help. Nothing could have been achieved without the tremendous support from the membership of the Mexican American organizations. Our admiration and thanks to the EAST SAN JOSE SUN.

A few leaders have demonstrated beyond the benefit of a doubt, thru great personal sacrifice of time and family, that the Mexican American community possesses the desire, the guts and the determination to solve problems that affect the poor of our community.

Out of this has been born a new type of leader that places the needs of our community first without self interest, a leader that is not afraid to fight for justice for our people.

We have great faith in the War on Poverty program now that obstacles have been removed. We will support it as hard as we have fought it.

The revolution may be the end of the beginning.


