- To familiarize students with educational issues affected by gender
- To provide opportunities to explore the meaning of being engendered
- To provide insights into the social, economic and political issues of gender
- To qualify students to work in careers in which a knowledge of the social construction of gender is vital
- To provide insight into the nexus of engendered roles, careers, home and leisure
- To support and assist students who want to specialize in women's or men's issues
- To expose students to the accomplishments of women
- To involve students from diverse backgrounds with a multidisciplinary faculty
- To provide a coherent program in gender and women's studies, integrated with other disciplines and departments

2. Justification for the Proposed Degree Major Program

Gender Studies is an interdisciplinary field, an innovative, 21st-centry major, and therefore fits well with the mission of the uiniversity. In addition to serving as a useful major for students, it will also provide general education courses of benefit to all students.

None of the programs above is a program in critical gender studies, allowing a focus on women's studies, critical masculinity studies, and/or glbt studies.

Gender Studies would be a useful major for students seeking greater understanding of the social construction of gender and how gendering affects the lives of everyone; in the course of such a program of studies, a student will gain methodological competence in the social sciences as well as sharp analytical skills. Students should graduate well prepared to undertake advanced study in Women's Studies or Cultural Studies, and to emark on careers in such fields as journalism, social services, education, eco-feminist activism, international relations, counseling, politics, family planning services, family law.

The Gender Studies program will supply the region with students trained in critical thinking and with knowledge of issues that are of importance to everyone's lives. It will be a model program in the CSU, innovative and forward-looking.
