WELFARE DEPT

Foster Home Recruiter

Sometimes 1 am asked, "Why bother with trying to find foster homes? Why not place all children without responsible parents in institutions?

We live in a society of families, and each child needs to grow up as a member of a family as the best preparation for having a family of his own someday. A substitute family is the best plan for the child who cannot be with his own parents.

A child needs to be in a home where he observes the father go to work regularly to provide for his family; where he sees the father come home and help with the chores and play with the children.

A child needs to see a mother who cleans, cooks, sews, shops, and takes care of family members when they become sick. He needs to hear parents plan the use of money, and be given an opportunity to have some money of his own to spend or save. He needs to observe the love of parents for each other and for their children, to see that quarrelling and making-up are a part of even the closest relationships. A child should have responsibility for certain household tasks, to share in family outings and projects.

A baby should always be with its mother or a substitute mother who can spend considerable time cuddling and playing with him. Mother love and attention is as important to the emotional well-being of an infant as regular feedings, fresh air, and rest are necessary for his physical development.

Institutional care may sometimes be the answer for an older child who cannot go into a foster home. This may be a child so angry and upset at the world that his conduct could not be tolerated by foster parents for 24 hours a day. In an institution this disturbed child is cared for by professional persons who understand his problems and know how to give him help with them.

The child left too long in an institution loses, or fails to develop, the ability to form close ties with other people. Without this he is poorly equipped for marriage and for parenthood. Without experience as a family member, he has missed the first-hand knowledge needed to prepare him to take his part in our society of families.

A foster home is a substitute home for children who must be temporarily separated from their own parents. Except for its unusual offering of love to a stranger's child, it is a perfectly normal home.





OVER 500, 000 CHILDREN UNDER 5 YEARS ACCI-DENTALLY POISONED IN 1961

One case report concerns a three year old girl who found and swallowed an unknown amount of aspirin that was being used for an older sister. After the medicine had been given to the older child the container had been left on top of furniture in the bedroom where the three year old could easily see and redch it. When the child arrived at the hospital she was having convulsions, turning blue, and in a coma that ended in death.

Many cases of accidental poisoning occur because young children find these products within easy reach. Containers may be left on night tables, in dresser drawers, on kitchen shelves, in medicine chests to which children can easily climb, in low kitchen cabinets, on sinks and tables, under laundry tubs and in fuel containers placed on the floor.

At this very moment all over the country, children are being rushed to emergency rooms for medical treatment because they found and were curious enough to swallow any of the thousands of household products found in our homes today. Many of these products, such as strong detergents, furniture polishes, waxes, and bleaches definitely make our homes and lives more comfortable and attractive but may be poison to our young children. Other substances, such as medicines, insect sprays, rat poisons, disinfectants, and haeting fuels are necessary in our lives but can likewise be fatal.

To cope with this problem, poison control centers have been set up all over the country; there are about 470 in operation at this time. One of these is located in San Jose at the City-County Emergency First Aid Station at 245 Carlisle Street, behind the De Anza Hotel. In carrying out its objectives of information and treatment on a 24 hour daily basis, it serves both doctors and the public. A doctor and nurse is on duty at all times. During February it treated 23 cases of poisoning and handled 107 telephone calls, mostly from anxious parents.

To emphasize the problem, and to encourage public education on the dangers of accidental poisoning, and to support preventive measures all over the nation the Congress recently passed and the President signed legislation designating the third week in March every year as National Poison Prevention Week. During this week let me call your attention to some of the




preventive measures that can make our homes free of poisoning.

- 1. Store all medicines in locked cabinets.
- Get rid of unused or left-over prescription medicines.
- Discard old medicines and household products by flushing the unused portion down the toilet.
- Never refer to medicine as "candy" to your child.
- Store household products such as lye, cleaning and polishing agents, detergents, kerosene, and insecticides high in cabinets, out of reach of children.
- Read and heed the directions on the labels of products used at home.
- Always return products to a safe storage place immediately. Never leave on furniture or on floor.
- Never store non-food products in food or beverage containers.
- Protect your skin when using insecticides, salvents, and cleaning agents. Some products can be absorbed through the skin.
- 10. If a potentially poisonous substance is swallowed by your child, call your doctor immediately and follow his directions, or call or come to the San Jose First Aid Station - Poison Control Center listed in the phone book under San Jose city offices.

I hope that you will make a part of your daily routine these preventive measures recommended during POISON PREVENTION WEEK. March 18-24... If you do you will help make this a safer year with fewer such accidents.

In my last column I promised to discuss methods of eliminating rats and mice from the homes and commercial buildings; instead I have devoted this space to Poison Prevention to coincide with Poison Prevention Week. In my next column I shall resume our discussion on rodent control.



THE 1962 SEATTLE WORLD'S FAIR

CENTURY 21 is the theme of the \$80,000,000 SEATTLE WORLD'S FAIR slated to open on April 21, 1962. President John F. Kennedy is scheduled to be on hand for the opening ceremonies of the 6-months long exhibition which will run until October, 1962.

Over ten million visitors are expected to view the exhibits which will show accomplishments in International Science, Art, Entertainment, Commerce, and Industry.

There will be exhibits by 35 foreign countries, including Russia. The fair will feature science displays, art shows, concerts, horse shows, circuses, puppet shows, and even a girlie extravaganza. Also, the usual carnival rides, dancing, legitimate plays, etc. The entertainment stars will include Van Cliburn, Elvis Presley, Count Basie, The Royal Thai Dancers, Roy Rogers, and even Yogi Bear. An 800 seat playhouse will feature presentations by world famous theater companies. A fine arts pavilion will show \$20 million worth of paintings ranging from old masters to abstract expressionists.

The Seattle World Fair is the first international exposition held in this country since the New York World's Fair 22 years ago.

As in every international exposition in the past, architecture will dominate the scene. The very first world international exposition was in 1851 in London. The outstanding piece of architecture there was the incredible and huge Crystal Palace. Built almost entirely of glass and iron, it covered 21 acres and housed most of the fair's 17,000 exhibits. The American exhibition that year, incidentally, included such innovations as false teeth, chewing tobacco, artificial legs, McCormick's reaper, and a Colt repeating pistol.

Everyone is familiar with the Eiffel Tower in Paris. It was built as part of the Fourth French International in 1889 and to this day draws thousands of visitors from all over the world.

Seattle's answer to all this? The spectacular SPACE NEEDLE. The soaring, majestic 600 foot high needle thrusts itself into the air on three pairs of steel legs, tapers to a slim waist at about the 373 foot level, and then flares out to the 500 foot mark where it is crowned by a mezzanine, observation deck, and a plush 260 seat restaurant. The restaurant is unlike any other in the continental U. S. in that it revolves 360 degrees per hour, giving the diner a tremendous

panoramic view of the City of Seattle, Puget Sound, the Olympic and Cascade mountains, and over 70 acres of beautifully landscaped fairgrounds.

Another feature of the fair will be a monorail, the second ever constructed in the United States (the 1st is at Disneyland, in California) which is expected to take 10,000 visitors per hour from downtown Seattle to the fair, a mile and a half away, in 95 seconds!!!




