- 1) Self introductions in Pairs with each person identifying self as an Educator, in Business/Finance, Public Policy, Social Service, an Activist and talking briefly (10 minutes) about realized and perceived effects of the changing economy and how each is being affected.
- 2) Mix chairs comfortably
- 3) Discussion with full group on same topic.

Recorder charting discussion.

Participants talk about realized and perceived effects of the changing economy and how each is being affected. (allow for stories...)

1:00-2:15 Session Two: <u>Building Women; Building Selves! Improve Women's Economic Opportunities Locally</u>

- -People grouped according to like-organizations
- -Initial seating in large circle
- -Facilitator 'leads' discussion
- -Recorder 'records' on single chart paper/rack using participant words.

First Part: This discussion is intended to be brief (10 min max) and basically set the thinking paradigm.

- 1) What's being done now to improve women's econ opportunities by your org?
- 2) What could we/you be doing differently; how could we enhance our programs?
- 3) What new elements do we need to inject?
- 4) What new thinking that we have gained today might we add to our box?

Second Part: Participants meet with individual subgroups (pre-set) for discussion and preparation of Action Paper (a copy to be left with Summit).

- Each subgroup to prepare an Action Plan in any format: written/spoken, acted, shown in any art form
 - *lists one (or two) actions which the group will take to enhance their existing program or initiate a new program to address locally women's participation in the global economy.
- 2) Each subgroup will plan to present this paper to the group as a whole.
