## 'Talking Guns, Germs & Steel' Community Discussion Series

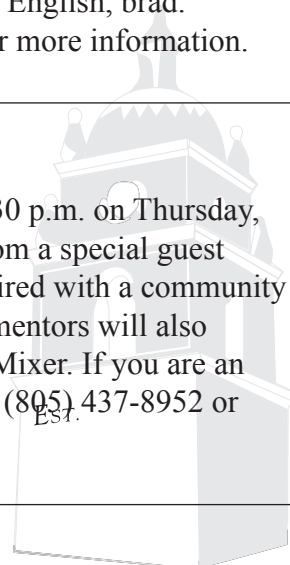
