

CHRISTIAN SACRIFICES

The only "sacrifices" which the New Testament recognizes as now to be offered, after Christ's perfect and finished sacrifice, are those recognized in our Communion Service. The sacrifice of our bodies (Rom. xii:1); the sacrifice of faith (Phil. ii:17); the sacrifices of praise and alms (Heb. xiii:15, 16) for with such sacrifices God is well pleased; and "spiritual sacrifices" (1 Peter ii:5). And these sacrifices are in no sense of the word to be offered by priests only but by all Christians alike.—F. W. Farrar.
