



IN10CT: Wats frustrating to you? FRUSTRATORS: Anybody who takes themself too seriously. They have no idea how obnoxious everybody else thinks they are.

IN10CT: Wine or Woman? FRUSTRATORS: Woman. Wine can give you a headache and make you puke. (Believe me, so do women!)

IN10CT: Ever tried jumping off a really, really, really tall building? I started FULL CONTACT about 3 years ago for a lot of reasons. First of all I've been into Hardcore for a long time now, 17 years, and felt like getting more invoved. I always wanted to do a band, but it never happened...



(Continued from what you were just reading) I've always known people who did distros, shows, zines and bands and wanted to do something that showed Hardcore

the way I've always seen in since the mid 1980's when things were crazy. I also did it to publish my photos. I've been taking pics at shows since 1984, and wanted to have a vehicle to show/publish them. At that time, I was also getting tired of assisting photographers and wanted to do my own thing. It was either FC or sell everything and move to NYC. I also felt that hardcore wasn't very well represented in mags. Lots of mags had hardcore mixed with ska, punk and face painter bands. I thought it was time to promote **Hardcore. FULL CONTACT** is published 4 times a year and yeah, it's always been slick. That was the point. I was tired of the attitude that <u>just because it was a Hardcore mag it</u> had to look like crap! Hardcore is about doing what feels right to you. It seems there are as many ideas of what "hardcore" is as there are people. My idea was, and is, as long as you are doing it for the right reasons and are true to what you believe, thats Hardcore. We don't suck up to labels by giving them nice reviews so they'll keep advertising with us. If they don't like the review they get, tough. Thats not to say that newsprint zines suck or anything, it's just the route I wanted for what I was going to do. Some people think that its not hardcore, well friend what is ? (A JUDGE RECORD!)







I think if you can make them work for you the way you want to be presented than they are great, the trick is getting them to see things your way. If you can do that and get your music out to thousands or even millions as opposed to hundreds and even make a little money to cover yourself then thats great.

We had two guitarist for the album but one left the band. We feel this is our most solid line-up to date. We have intentions to get a second guitarist, but in no hurry to do so.
