Charles B. Reed was appointed Chancellor of the 23-campus California State University system in March 1998, following 13 years as Chancellor of the Florida State University system. From 1971 to 1985 he served in Florida's Department of Education and Governor's Office, including as the governor's chief of staff. He taught education at George Washington University after earning his doctorate there in 1970. Chancellor Reed has also written, spoken and consulted widely on education, finance, management, governance and the politics of education.


