The above prices will vary somewhat from region to region and store to store. But you get the general idea.

Food prices have increased over 4% a year during the Nixon Administration. Altogether, more than 15% since Nixon took office.

The rate of increase has been over 50% faster than the rate during the Democratic administrations before Nixon.

The blame for the increase in inflation must be laid squarely at Nixon's doorstep. When he became President, Vietnam and Pentagon extravagance were already straining the nation's economy to the limit. But

Nixon decided to continue the war at an additional cost of \$66 billion. And the "peace dividend" we were supposed to get from withdrawing ground troops was gobbled up by more Pentagon demands.

Now Nixon's belated wage and price controls have held wages down but failed to stop price increases. So you're caught in a squeeze.

America needs George McGovern, Sargent Shriver and the Democratic Party to stand up for the ordinary citizen and against the Nixon-Agnew favors for special interests and big business. We can't afford four more years of Nixon.
