Leisure Village Officials and Civic Leaders share in the excitement of open house!

It was a long looked-forward-to event, and when the Recreation Center at Leisure Village finally opened its doors late in September, there were gasps of delighted astonishment from those who beheld the transformation from bare bones beginnings to 26,000 square feet unadulterated beauty. Here in multi-faceted rooms, filled to the brim with billiard tables, gem grinders, power saws, sewing machines and potter's clay, residents of Leisure Village have only to select a craft or a hobby and a wondrous world of adult fun becomes a new way of life for those who, having stopped working, can now really begin to live.

Jerry Lawrence, president of Leisure Technology of California, expressed his feelings to guests at the open house in this way: "These are exciting times for all of us. Those who have purchased homes here are beginning to move in, and the Recreation Center is ready for every resident who wishes to make use of it. We've come a long way from the time we so diligently looked for the proper location for the first Leisure Village in California. More than a year went into the search. We are so pleased with the reception our Village is receiving. The people who have decided to live here are exceptionally pleasant and friendly. The many thousands who visit us tell us they sincerely like what they see here. And a gratifying number are quick to tell us that they plan to be here permanently as soon as they can arrange it. As we continue to build Leisure Village it will become more beautiful. This is only the beginning."

Project Administrator, Stan Berman is equally thused...equally inspired by the changes which have occurred during recent months in areas of his responsibility. "My job," Berman said, "is to see that the departments having to do with recreation, security and landscape maintenance, including the golf course, are functioning smoothly for the benefit of our residents." Berman pointed out that in a project of the size of Leisure Village it takes time to work out inevitable "bugs", but that so far there have been few problems. The Leisure Village Association, Inc., which Berman heads, is located at present in the Recreation Center. Residents are invited to call upon him or any of his staff for assistance when needed.

Camarillo Mayor, Don Livingston, and city council members who attended the open house at the Leisure Village Recreation Center, were told by Sales Manager and Marketing Director, Bob Dull, that many sites were considered for the location of Leisure Village. "We studied several, but the one we kept coming back to was the valley at the foot of the Santa Monica mountains, properly identified as Pleasant Valley." Dull stated that sales have far exceeded expectations with the result that preselling is currently being done for occupancy in the spring of 1974, even though a few choice sites are available for earlier occupancy. Dull had this to say about the unique Leisure Village "Pioneer Club"... formed from the first 100 who purchase homes in the community: "I would like to applaud our Pioneer Club members,"


