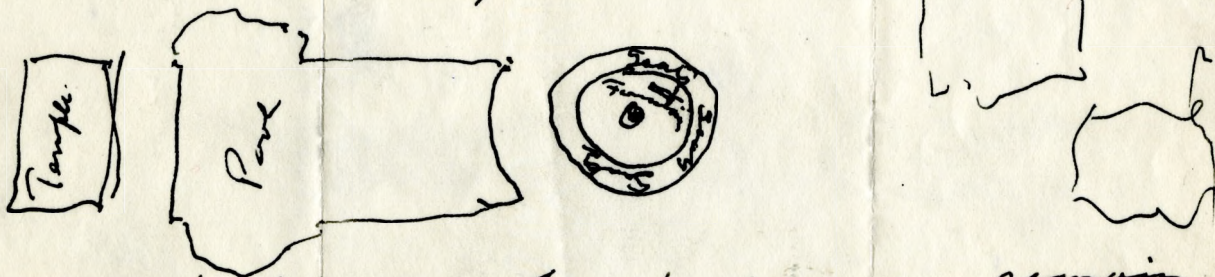
Under separate cover I am mailing a re-
