#### CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, FULLERTON

California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing. The main campus is located in Fullerton and a Mission Viejo campus was opened in August, 1989. The latter offers only upper-division and graduate courses.

Classes were offered at Fullerton for the first time in 1959 and the first commencement — for five students — took place in 1960.

The University's 25,000 students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes, although nearly 400 now live on campus in residence halls opened in 1988.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 775-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The University is fully accredited and enjoys national recognition for both its array of traditional academic programs and a growing list of independently accredited professional programs, including art, athletics training, business, chemistry, communications, computer science, dance, education, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, speech and hearing and theater. All told, there are 86 degree programs —41 of them at the graduate level — plus a wide variety of credential and certificate programs.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is an internship and cooperative education program that allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours without the formalities of regular admission to the University.

Still another strong point is the University's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students, but also open to community members, is another highlight, as is the network of community support groups, including the Titan Athletic Foundation.

Further examples of community outreach are the Ruby Gerontology Center, which serves as an educational and research facility for the study of aging and a meeting place for the Continuing Learning Experience support group.

Through a series of joint ventures started in 1979 with the establishment of the Fullerton Arboretum and continuing with the 1989 opening of the Marriott Hotel, the University and the City of Fullerton are working to complete an on-campus sports complex for the 1992 football season. When the main part of the sports complex is finished, it will include a stadium for football, soccer and other activities plus a pavilion for baseball.

To reinforce the University's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State conducts comprehensive fundraising. Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great university.



#### Dr. Milton A. Gordon, President

Dr. Milton A. Gordon was selected the fourth president of Cal State Fullerton by The California State University Board of Trustees on May 15, 1990. He assumed his duties on Aug. 6. He replaced Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb, who had served since 1981.

Gordon previously had served as Vice President for Academic Affairs at Sonoma State University in Rohnert Park in Northern California.

"Dr. Gordon has a superb academic and administrative background," said Marianthi

Lansdale, CSU board chair. "I'm certain that Fullerton will continue to flourish under his able leadership. We offer him our warmest congratulations."

Prior to his Sonoma appointment where he also held the rank of professor of mathematics, Gordon was dean of Chicago State University's college of arts and sciences for more than eight years. An associate professor of mathematics at Loyola University of Chicago from 1966-71, Gordon also directed that institution's Afro-American studies program. He also taught at the Illinois Institute of Technology, the University of Detroit and in the Chicago Public School System.

Gordon has a Ph.D. in mathematics from the Illinois Institute of Technology, an M.A. in mathematics from the University of Detroit and a B.A. in mathematics and secondary education from Xavier University of



#### Ed Carroll, Director of Athletics

The rapid climb of Ed Carroll through the ranks of the Cal State Fullerton athletics department culminated in his appointment as Director of Athletics on July 1, 1985.

University President Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb made the announcement on May 28, 1985, after a nationwide search and Carroll, now 40, immediately ushered in an era of "positive thinking" for Titan athletics.

"One of my priorities has been to enhance the image of our athletic program by stressing positives," says Carroll. "We must use the power of positive thinking to overcome our limitations and build our program to greater heights."

One of Carroll's first moves was to upgrade the football schedule. The Titans have played LSU, Florida, West Virginia and Auburn in recent seasons and have dates with Georgia and Oregon in the near future. With the new stadium complex now under construction, Carroll has signed Mississippi State, Colorado State, UTEP and Army to home-and-home series.

The new Sports Complex will provide a playing facility for baseball and football/soccer as well as an all-weather track. An on-campus Marriott Hotel opened in October, 1989, and the revenue it generates will help finance the \$10.7 million athletics project.

Fund-raising levels have reached record numbers during Carroll's tenure. The Titan Athletic Foundation's 1989 spring drive raised more than \$450,000.

Carroll began his Fullerton athletic career as a wrestler. In 1972, he served as team captain and was selected the "Most Outstanding Wrestler" in the California Collegiate Athletic Association championship meet. He later served as an assistant to former head coach Don Matson.

Carroll earned bachelor's degrees in history (1972) and physical education (1974) from Fullerton as well as a secondary teaching credential. He taught physical education classes at Fullerton and earned a master's degree in recreation administration from CSU Long Beach.

After serving in various capacities in the Fullerton recreation department, Carroll left briefly in mid-1980 to serve as a recreational sports programmer and doctoral intern at Indiana University. He returned to Fullerton in November, 1980, as an assistant athletics director and later served as acting director of the Titan Athletic Foundation. He then served under athletic director Lynn Eilefson, who left in January, 1985.

Ed and his wife Connie live in Fullerton with young children Brandon and Kimberly.

#### GLORIOUS BASEBALL HISTORY HAD MODEST BEGINNINGS

The Cal State Fullerton baseball tradition had a most humble beginning, starting out as a club team and playing on a field literally scratched out of an orange grove. Only the wildest dreamer would have foreseen a program that now features two national championships, six regional titles, 13 conference crowns and 15 alumni in the major leagues.

It's been a memorable quarter century since Beryl Kempton and Warren Beck brought the program into the world. Bill Fulton nursed it into adolescence and Augie Garrido guided it into maturity as Titan baseball developed into a national power. Larry Cochell maintained that success and now Garrido returns to reap the benefits of his work with a new stadium.

Kempton was the university employee who graded the field out of the orange trees. Home plate sat near the old orchard residence, a brick structure now known as "Football House." It's reportedly the second oldest existing residence in the city and now houses the Titans' football coaching staff.

The first-base line ran north and the third-base line paralleled what is now called Gymnasium Drive, heading west. A split rail and wire mesh screen served as the outfield barrier.

Beck, a member of the faculty, was the inaugural coach. He fielded a "club" team which played local junior colleges and "pick-up" teams from neighboring universities in its maiden season.

In 1965, the program became a full fledged intercollegiate sport with Fulton serving as the head coach. He led them into play in the California Collegiate Athletic Association and set the groundwork for the success of the 1970s.

The catalyst to greatness was Garrido, who arrived from Cal Poly SLO and began developing a new field. A new backstop, batter's eye and such "luxuries" as electricity for the pitching machines provided Garrido the most basic of tools.

After a rebuilding year in 1973, the Titans began establishing their tradition in 1974 by winning the CCAA title.

The 1975 season saw a move up to Division I status and entry in the Pacific Coast Athletic Association. But the surging Titans didn't miss a beat. They won the PCAA championship by one



game over Pacific and then strolled onto Dedeaux Field on the campus of the University of Southern California and won the NCAA Western Regional, depriving the Trojans of a shot at a sixth consecutive NCAA championship.

Fullerton's first trip to Omaha for the College World Series was brief,to say the least. The Titans lost their first two games, to Arizona State and Oklahoma, and were sent flying back to Los Angeles. But experience would pay benefits down the road.

Fullerton repeated as PCAA champions in 1976, this time by a comfortable four games over San Diego State. But then came realignment of the league. The 7-team Southern California Baseball Association was formed by Fullerton, Cal State Los Angeles, San Diego State, Pepperdine, Loyola Marymount, UC Santa Barbara and Long Beach State. Pacific, Fresno State and San Jose State became part of the Northern California Baseball Association.

The new schedule failed to disrupt the Titans' championship rhythm, although they had to share the inaugural SCBA title in 1977 with Cal State L.A. Fullerton lost a one-game playoff with the Diablos but gained an at-large NCAA bid where they lost in the regional title game to Washington State in Pullman.

There was another SCBA title in 1978 and regional elimination at USC before the Titans struck paydirt in 1979. They parlayed another SCBA crown into a national championship but they did it the hard way.

Fullerton lost the regional opener at Fresno but came back through the losers' bracket, finally beating UCLA twice to earn a return trip to Omaha. Again, the Titans lost the opener, this time to Mississippi State. But a confident Garrido still liked his team's chances and they proved him right. They won five games in a row including a 2-1 verdict over Arkansas for the NCAA championship, the first title for Fullerton in a men's sport in Division I play.

The fruits of victory did not include a home playing site worthy of a regional tournament, so Fullerton began in 1980 a frustrating streak of postseason play. The Titans won the SCBA title again but had to go to Tucson, where the host Arizona Wildcats won the regional on their way to the NCAA title. In 1981, the Titans won the SCBA but lost in the regionals at Tempe to the hosts, the eventual national champion Arizona State Sun Devils.

Fullerton avenged the defeat, however, knocking off the highly regarded Sun Devils in their own backyard after another SCBA crown in 1982. However, the third trip to Omaha proved less than charming. Fullerton set a dubious record, becoming the first CWS team not to score as the Titans were shut out by Wichita State and Maine and hustled home.

In 1983, the Titans shared the SCBA crown but lost a one-game playoff to UC Santa Barbara for the automatic NCAA tournament bid. No matter, the Titans' 49-19-1 record earned them an at-large berth and another trip to Tempe, where the Sun Devils prevailed.

A slow start in 1984 after a couple of late summer professional signings stripped the pitching staff of its depth and left Fullerton's reign in the SCBA teetering. A realignment of the infield seemed to work wonders and the team caught fire. A surge that would see them win 37 of their last 42 games carried all the way to Omaha and a second NCAA chamionship.

Again, the road to Omaha was via Fresno, where the Titans survived a "Murderers' Row" field of USC, San Diego State and the host Bulldogs of Fresno State. An extra-inning title game played in 100+ degree heat finally went the Titans' way and presented a schedule of some of the nation's most famous

institutions in the College World Series.

Michigan, Miami, Arizona State, Oklahoma State and, finally, the University of Texas, stood in the way. In a series dominated by the hitters and their aluminum bats, the Titans showed a national ESPN audience that there was quality if not quantity on the pitching mound. Todd Simmons, Jack Reinholtz and record-setting reliever Scott Wright did yeoman's duty and left it for diminuitive lefty Ed Delzer to turn in the performance of his life in winning a 3-1 decision over the Longhorns in the title game.

There were other heroes, however. John Fishel, who would set a CWS record for hits and win the Most Valuable Player Trophy, slid around the Michigan catcher to ignite a five-run eighth inning and give the Titans an opening 8-4 win over the Wolverines.

After a 6-4 loss to Texas sent them to the losers' bracket, the Titans fought back. They routed Miami, 13-5, with bunts and stolen bases rattling the Hurricanes into four costly errors. They eliminated Arizona State as Reinholtz cooled the hot Devil bats and Kirk Bates delivered a crucial bases-loaded single. They outslugged Oklahoma State behind a Fishel home run, a bases-loaded triple by Tom Thomas and a two-run double by Bob Caffrey to earn the winner-take-all rematch with the Longhorns

The 5-foot-7, 133-pound Delzer got a rare starting call against the defending champions. A couple of infield hits in the first inning produced a run but that was to be all. Delzer pitched a near-perfect game until leg cramps forced him from the mound to open the eighth inning. Enter Wright, the NCAA's most prolific reliever ever. He slammed the door on Texas for his 22nd save.

The offensive hero was John Bryant, who stole a base to set up the tying run and then tripled for the key hit in a two-run fourth inning that proved the difference.

Defending the title proved too much for the 1985 Titans to handle. Competing in the Southern Division of a reconstituted PCAA, the Titans finished in first place in their division but the pitching came up too thin in a playoff series at Fresno State that decided

the league chamionship and the NCAA Tournament's automatic berth. And, with the nation's most difficult schedule taking its toll on an overall 36-32-1 record, the Titans did not get an atlarge bid and were left out of the playoffs for the first time in 11 years.

By most school's standards, the 1986 season was a successful one. The Titans posted a 36-21 record and won the Best of the West Tournament in Fresno as part of another challenging schedule. But, for the second year in a row, there was no league title nor NCAA playoff berth as the season turned on one inning. Fullerton blew a 6-2 lead in the ninth inning at home vs. UNLV on Apr. 5 and could never recover from the loss, finishing in third place behind UC Santa Barbara and UNLV.

When Fullerton opened up the 1987 season losing five of its first six games, PCAA rivals thought Fullerton's dominance had ended. But despite a schedule that saw them play all the contenders on the road, Fullerton roared through the league schedule, winning 12 of its first 13 games on its way to an 18-3 PCAA mark and a five-game margin over surprise runnerup UC Irvine.

The Titans' regular season record of 42-15 earned them a national ranking as high as No. 3 and sent them to the NCAA playoffs with a berth in the South II Regionals in New Orleans. The Titans were the top seed against five Louisiana schools and drew the No. 6 seed, Southern University from Baton Rouge. Representing a conference that never had won an NCAA playoff game, the Jaguars got a brilliant pitching performance from converted

reliever Allan Ratliff, who won, 1-0.

Thrust into the losers' bracket, the Titans resorted to their deep pitching staff. Mike Harkey shut out Tulane and Larry Casian did likewise to Louisiana Tech. But Longo Garcia, the hard-luck loser to Southern, couldn't handle LSU and the Titans finished 44-17.

The 1988 season brought a changing of the guard, but no deviation in the Titans' success story. Garrido resigned and headed for Illinois. Cochell left the cold of Evanston at Northwestern University and ventured west.

After an inconsistent start, the new combination clicked and the Titans won 30 out of 35 games before losing a home series and the conference championship to Fresno State. But an at-large NCAA bid was tendered and Fullerton parlayed it into a return trip to Omaha by winning the South Regional in Starkville. Mike Ross hit a 3-run home run with two outs in the bottom of the ninth for a 6-3 win over Texas A&M after the Titans had beaten host Mississippi State twice in its own stadium.

Fullerton continued its winning ways in a revised CWS format in Omaha with well-pitched victories over Stanford and Miami. But Garcia and Mark Beck couldn't repeat their feats and Stanford came back through the losers' bracket to drop the Titans to third place.

Despite the presence of All-Americans Brent Mayne and David Staton, the 1989 Titan team endured Fullerton's worst season since 1973. The Titans finished in the second division of the Big West at 10-11 and the overall record was 30-27.

The end of a dynasty? Rival coaches thought so and picked the Titans to finish fifth in the Big West in 1990. Instead, the team romped to its first conference title since 1987 and rode that momentum to an impressive sweep of the Central Regional at Austin, Texas. Twice the Titans beat the host Longhorns on their own turf to earn a sixth trip to Omaha.

They crashed at the CWS, literally. Outfielder Rich Gonzales collided with the left field wall and his health distracted the Titans in losses to Oklahoma State and The Citadel.

Cochell accepted a lucrative offer to coach at Oklahoma to create an opening for Garrido's return for 1991.



#### TITANS IN THE MAJOR LEAGUES

Fifteen products of the Cal State Fullerton baseball program have worked their way into major league box scores with several more stars of recent Titan teams waiting in the wings for their opportunity.

The first Titan to play in the major leagues was lefthanded pitcher **Dan Boone**, who broke in with the Angels and Padres after helping Fullerton into the 1975 College World Series and then made a dramataic comeback with Baltimore in 1990. He was followed by catcher **Dan Whitmer** at Toronto (1976) and California.


The biggest name came next as Tim Wallach, the 1979 College Player of the Year, broke in with the Montreal Expos. He has played in several All-Star Games for the National League including the 1989 Classic in Anaheim.

Arriving at the "Big Show" in the mid-1980s were righthanded pitcher Jeff Robinson with the San Francisco Giants, Pittsburgh Pirates and New York Yankees; outfielder Andre David, who hit a home run in his first at bat for the Minnesota Twins; and outfielder John Christensen with the New York Mets, Boston Red Sox, Seattle Mariners and the Twins.

Lefthanded pitcher **Greg Mathews** burst upon the scene in St. Louis in 1986 to become a valued member of the Cardinals' starting rotation. He started in the Championship Series for







Seattle's Mike Schooler


the Cardinals. Recurring armproblems have plagued his career and he was released after the 1990 season.

Getting his debut in 1987 was Bill Moore with Montreal before the Titan Alumni Club exploded in 1988 with five additions. The most heralded was pitcher Mike Harkey, who was starting at Wrigley Field for the Chicago Cubs 16 months after his last Titan appearance. He was selected *USA Today's* Minor League Player of the Year in 1988 but suffered a knee injury during spring training and missed the Cubs' 1989 divisional title team. Last year he was the Cubs' No. 2 winner and placed fifth in Rookie of the Year balloting.

Earlier in the 1988 season, former Titan reliever Mike Schooler surfaced with the Mariners and he has become their top stopper and one of the best in baseball. In Philadelphia, Shane Turner was one of the players who tried to fill the shoes of Mike Schmidt at third base. In Houston, John Fishel, the MVP of the 1984 College World Series, was part of the Astros' futile run at the NL West flag before being traded to the Yankees. Kevin Reimer had made a couple of appearances for the Texas Rangers.

Arrivals in 1990 were catcher Brent Mayne, who was Kansas City's first-round draft choice in 1988, and lefthander Larry Casian, a 1987 draft by Minnesota. Both made starting appearances in nearby Anaheim Stadium.

Among the former Titans hoping to make the jump in 1991 are third baseman Dave Staton, a triple crown winner last year; infielder Mike Ross in the St. Louis chain and the Mota brothers, Jose, Andy and/or Domingo.

#### **HEAD COACH AUGIE GARRIDO**



Cal State Fullerton welcomes Augie Garrido back with open arms. The ninth winningest coach in collegiate baseball signed a three-year contract in August. Garrido returns to Fullerton after spending the last three years as head coach for the University of Illinois, where he built the Illini into a national power and led them to their first Big Ten Championship in 26 years. He compiled a record of 111-57 and twice took the Illini into the NCAA playoffs (1989-90).

Garrido comes back to Fullerton where he captured a pair of national championships, four regional titles and 12 conference crowns including 11 in a row from 1974 through 1984. These accomplishments only scratch the surface of the success story Augie Garrido has written in 15 seasons as baseball coach at Cal State Fullerton.

Garrido, 51, has served with equal professionalism his student-athletes, his institution and his sport while developing a nationally prominent program at a University which has existed for just one quarter of a century. He has sent scores of players into the professional ranks (15 to the majors) while bringing CSF its first men's Division I national title and serving as an articulate and respected voice in the promotion of collegiate and amateur baseball.

Garrido ranks No. 9 among active Division I coaches with 888 career victories in 22 seasons. His lifetime mark is 888-425-7 (.675) and his Fullerton record is 667-292-6 (.694). Three times (1975, 1979 and 1984) he has been selected National Coach of the Year.

The Titans have strung together 17 consecutive winning seasons while typically playing as difficult a schedule as anyone in the country. Eleven years in a row (1974-84), Fullerton won or shared its league championship and went on to post-season play. In 1985, Fullerton won the southern division championship of the Pacific Coast Athletic Association but lost a playoff series at Fresno State. In 1986 the Titans finished third, and Garrido's last

season with Fullerton, his squad finished first in the PCAA but finished second at the South Regional in New Orleans.

A native of the San Francisco Bay town of Vallejo, Garrido attended Fresno State University (1959-61) and was an all-conference performer for coach Pete Beiden. He signed a contract with the Cleveland Indians and played six years in their minor league system before retiring in 1966 to accept a coaching position at Sierra High School in Tollhouse, California.

Garrido moved up to the collegiate ranks in 1969 as head coach at San Francisco State (25-14) and then spent three seasons at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo (85-62-1), where he earned a master's degree in 1968.

Despite being situated in the heart of baseball-rich southern California, Fullerton had enjoyed only limited success in the infant years of its intercollegiate baseball program. But that began to change in 1973 when Garrido arrived. After one losing season (19-33-1), he began producing nothing but winners. And in 1975, the Titans asserted their new prowess by winning the NCAA regional tournament at USC and advancing to the College World Series in Omaha in their first year of Division I play.

It took until 1979 for a repeat Fullerton performance in the CWS, but the Titans didn't waste the second opportunity. They came through the consolation bracket to beat Arkansas, 2-1, for the NCAA championship. They repeated in 1984, beating Texas, 3-1, in the championship game.


Garrido's baseball interests carry beyond the college schedule. His 1979 team took a goodwill mission to Taiwan, he managed in the Alaska summer leagues, he operates a successful instructional camp for youth and is in great demand as a speaker. Garrido also had the opportunity to see Titan third baseman Phil Nevin last summer when he was an assistant coach for Team USA.

Garrido and his wife Tere have two children, Michael and Heather, and reside in Placentia.

#### TITAN ASSISTANT COACHES



Associate Head Coach George Horton returns to Cal State Fullerton after coaching at Cerritos College where he guided the Falcons to three junior college state championships in six years.

Horton, 37, compiled a 226-53 record at Cerritos and won the California state championship in 1985, 1987 and 1989. Each of those years he was selected National Junior College Coach of the Year. His best season was 1987 when the Falcons went 46-5.

Horton played two seasons for Garrido at Cal State Fullerton in 1975 and 1976 and won All-SCBA honors as a senior. He batted .308 as a junior and .290 as a senior while playing first base. He graduated in 1978 and went on to earn a master's degree in 1980 at Cal Lutheran.

Horton's coaching career began at Cerritos in 1976-77 and he went to Los Angeles Valley College the following three seasons. In 1980, he moved back to Cerritos, where he also had played in 1971-73, as an assistant to Gordie Douglas before taking the head job in 1985. In addition, he coached during the summer for the Fairbanks Goldpanners (1981 and 1983) in Alaska and the Hutchinson Broncs (1982) in Kansas.

Horton and his wife Francie have three daughters --Michele (11), Heather (6) and Rebecca, born in December. Horton and his family reside in Yorba Linda.



Bill Mosiello is a newcomer to Titan baseball although he is indirectly liked to Fullerton's success on the diamond. His duties include handling the catchers.

Mosiello, 26, has played with and coached many players who have come from the successful Cerritos College program. Mosiello had been an assistant to Horton at Cerritos since 1987.

Mosiello attended Cerritos High School where he earned all-league honors as a catcher in both his junior and senior seasons, graduating in 1982. His team won the San Gabriel Valley League Championship in 1981 and 1982. From Cerritos HS, he went to Fresno State where he redshirted as a freshman. In 1984, he returned to Cerritos to play in his freshman and sophomore seasons. In 1985, he played on a 39-5 Junior College State Championship team earning all-conference honors and the Dallas Moon Award.

Mosiello went back to Fresno State for his junior year where he was named PCAA Scholar Athlete and was voted the team's Most Inspirational Player. In 1988, he earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in Physical Education from Long Beach State.

Mosiello was head coach for four summers for Cerritos where three of his four teams were the Western Regional Champions. He has been an associate scout for the Seattle Mariners since 1989. Most recently he managed the 1990 Mat-Su Miners in Alaska where his club was the Alaska League Champion and he was selected Alaska League Coach of the Year.

Mosiello is single and resides in Cerritos.



Rick Vanderhook returns to Fullerton after spending the last three seasons coaching with ex-Titan coach Bill Kernen at Cal State Northridge. Vanderhook will be handling the pitchers in 1991.

Vanderhook, 29, coached the Titans from 1985 to 1988. After serving as a bullpen coach and working with the pitchers and catchers in 1985 and 1986, he stepped into the third base coaching box in 1987 and worked with the hitters and defense in 1988.

Vanderhook has coached for Fairbanks in Alaska and the Goldpanners finished third in the nation in 1986.

He came to Fullerton in 1983 and redshirted his first season with the Titans. He was also a member of the Titans' 1984 national championship team. He was team captain for Cerritos College in 1982 when he batted .350.

Vanderhook prepped at Lakewood High School under Coach John Herbold, now the head coach at Cal State Los Angeles. He was team captain as a senior when he batted .320 with two home runs and 19 RBI. He struck out only once in 80 plate appearances while playing first base and catching.

Vanderhook is single and resides in Lakewood.




George Aspeitia begins his first season as a Titan coach after spending his last three years at East Los Angeles College as the pitching coach.

Aspeitia, 23, began his coaching career at Schurr HS in Montebello in 1986, the same school he graduated from in 1985. He coached there until 1987 when he advanced to the junior college ranks and started coaching at ELAC in 1988.

Aspeitia has also coached summer league teams. In 1990 he was the pitching coach for the Norwalk Cardinals who ended up 36-2 on the season with a team ERA of 0.89. The Cardinals eventually won the Junior Olympic Gold Medal. He also coached the national champion Montebello Stars.

Aspeitia was a three-year letterman at Cantwell HS before transferring to Schurr HS in 1985. A car accident ended his baseball career in his first season at East L.A. College.

Aspeitia is single and resides in San Gabriel.

#### 1991 SEASON PREVIEW

"If You Build It, He Will Come" is the theme for the 1991 Cal State Fullerton baseball season, which features not only the return of Head Coach Augie Garrido, but a sound nucleus from a team that won the always tough Big West Conference Championship, breezed through a tough NCAA Regional Tournament and developed an attitude that has the Titans looking toward the College World Series once again.

The theme is taken from the motion picture Field of Dreams, which starred CSF graduate Kevin Costner, who built a stadium in his Iowa corn field leading to the return in spirit of his late father. Fullerton's opportunity was to regain one of the greatest college baseball coaches in history. The stadium is under construction, and Garrido (only 12 wins away from No. 900) has come back. Fullerton's all-time winningest coach signed a three-year contract and also accepted a newly created position of Assistant Athletics Director for Community Relations.

Garrido replaces Larry Cochell, who was selected the Big West Conference Coach of the Year in 1990. Cochell ended his three-year Fullerton stint on an impressive note by taking the Titans to Omaha for the second time in three years after winning the BWC Championship. Cochell accepted an offer to coach at the University of Oklahoma, taking with him pitching coach Vern Ruhle. Garrido wasted no time in hiring George Horton, the former head coach of the Cerritos College Falcons, as his associate head coach.

Horton, a Titan player under Garrido in 1975-76, spent six years as the Falcons' head coach, compiling a 226-53 record and winning the California State Championship in 1985, 1987 and 1989. Each of those years he was selected National Junior College Coach of the Year. His best season was 1987 when Cerritos went 46-5.

An assistant to Horton at Cerritos, Bill Mosiello, was also appointed a Titan assistant. Rounding out the coaching staff is former Titan player and coach Rick Vanderhook, who spent the last two seasons with Cal State Northridge's Bill Kernen.

Although Fullerton lost many of the players who were responsible for the Titans reaching the College World Series, this season's squad has a blend of talented veterans and youth. The veterans include 2nd-Team All-BWC senior catcher Matt Hattabaugh (.316, 5 HR), senior first baseman/catcher Frank Charles (.327, 6 HR, 44 RBI) and the bullpen ace, senior Chris Robinson (3.88, 3-4, 5 SV). The youthful talent on the squad is headed by 2nd-Team All-BWC sophomore third baseman Phil Nevin (.358, 14 HR, 52 RBI), 1st-Team All-BWC junior pitcher James Popoff (3.98, 12-5, 89 K's), junior second baseman Steve Sisco (.294, 4 HR, 32 RBI) and junior outfielder David Ayala (.300, 1 HR).

These returnees plus the addition of many talented newcomers to the Titan ballclub should make for an exciting '91 season.

Hattabaugh will be the starting catcher for the Titans in 1991 and should contend for all-conference honors.

Charles, who may also see time behind the plate, is penciled in to start at first base after being the Titan designated hitter for much of the 1990 season.

Sisco will move from first base to second this season and will try to fill the big shoes of departed 1st-Team All-BWC second baseman Maté Borgogno. The position is not new to Sisco, who played summer ball in Alaska at second. Versatile newcomer Richie Kimm (Sacramento City College) will press for playing time with Sisco.

The shortstop and third base positions will revolve around where returning Freshman All-American Nevin starts. If Nevin starts at third, look for sophomore Trevor Rush or Kimm at short. Rush had limited playing time behind 2nd-Team All-BWC shortstop Kevin Farlow in 1990. If Nevin starts at shortstop, watch for newcomers Matt Lundin (Univ. of Tennessee), Mike Berry (L.A. Harbor College) or Kimm at third.

"Nobody did an outstanding job in the infield this fall," says Horton. "Our defensive capabilities are questionable. We have the potential to have a solid defense, with some hard work."

The Titan outfield seems more solid than the infield. Fullerton has five quality outfielders and all should see playing time. Incoming junior Chris Powell (Cerritos College) will most likely start in left field. Newcomer Frank Herman (Golden West College) seems to have locked up the center field position and letterman Ayala, newcomers Craig Fairbrother (Cerritos College) and freshman Jim Betzsold (Mater Dei HS) will battle for playing time in right.

Horton says, "We definitely have a stronger outfield than we do infield, defensively. There will be a battle for playing time because all of our outfielders have strengths in different areas."

Popoff and newcomers Dan Naulty (Cerritos College) and Jack Bailey (Rancho Santiago College) will make up the Titans' starting rotation with senior Robinson remaining in the stopper role. Fullerton sophomore Bill Fitzgerald makes the transition from a middle reliever on last season's squad to a starter on this year's club. Newcomer Paco Chavez (Cerritos College) who has a style very similar to Robinson will be a short reliever. Sophomore Tony Fetchel will be a spot starter after being mainly a relief picher on last year's squad. Newcomers Darin Pometta (Merced JC) and Greg Brannis (Estancia HS) will also see action.

The designated hitter position will most likely be filled by an extra outfielder.

#### 1990 SEASON REVIEW

It was virtually a tale of two seasons for the Titans in 1991, the nonconference season and the conference season, highlighted by a flawless performance in the NCAA Regional Tournament at Austin, Texas.

Big West Conference champion Cal State Fullerton ended its 1990 season with losses to Oklahoma State and The Citadel at the College World Series in Omaha, Nebraska, June 2 and 4. In a game that was marred by the loss of team leader Rich Gonzales, who suffered a head injury after hitting the outfield wall, the Titans dropped a 14-4 decision to eventual CWS runner-up Oklahoma State (Gonzales recovered and signed a contract with the St. Louis Cardinals). They were eliminated by The Citadel, 8-7, in 12 innings.

Fullerton was 15-12 heading into Big West Conference play on March 30. The Titans finished up 21-9 through the Regional Tournament, including a 13-5 Big West record and 4-0 in the NCAA Playoffs. Along the nonconference road, Fullerton was swept in three games by Stanford (in Palo Alto) including two one-run losses. The Titans then traveled to Arizona and left Tucson with two of three games. The Titans went on to split two-game series with UCLA, Pepperdine and Loyola Marymount. Fullerton swept Wisconsin in a three-game home series and dropped two of three to Cal.

Then came conference time. The Titans were to open conference play against Pacific in Stockton on March 2, 3 and 4, but were rained out with the games never being made up. Instead, Fullerton would face Orange County rival UC Irvine in the March 30 opener. Irvine's 1st-team All-Big West Conference pitcher, Ken Whitworth, allowed only 6 hits in a complete game shutout in the first of a three game series. The Titans then began their about face. They won the next eight conference contests including 3-game sweeps at home of Fresno State and UNLV. Fullerton traveled to Long Beach where the 49ers took two of three from the Titans. Finally, the Titans took two of three from both UC Santa Barbara and San Jose State to end the regular season.

Many pleasant surprises came Fullerton's way during the season: left fielder Rich Gonzales' (.386, 5 HR, 42 RBI) consistent hitting, shortstop Kevin Farlow's (.284, 6 HR, 32 RBI) power and superb defensive play, freshman third baseman Phil Nevin's (.358, 14 HR, 52 RBI, 14 stolen bases) power, right-handed pitcher James Popoff's (12-5, 3.98 ERA) consistency and the overall play of second baseman Maté Borgogno, who hit .374 (3 HR, 56 RBI) to go with his spectacular defensive play (only 9 errors after having 29 in 1989). These ingredients combined to give Fullerton a balanced squad that won the always tough Big West Conference and advanced to the NCAA Playoffs for the 13th time in Fullerton's 16 year Div. I history.

Fullerton had six different players receive Big West Player and/or Pitcher of the Week honors (more than any other Big West team) in the last five weeks of the regular season. Winning were James Popoff, who tossed a complete game 4-hitter with 10 strikeouts in a 5-2 Titan victory and Phil Nevin, who was 6 for 11 (.545) with 7 runs, 3 RBI, a double and 2 home runs the weekend the Titans swept Fresno State; Huck Flener, who hurled a complete game 5-hitter in a 6-1 Fullerton victory over UNLV; Rich Gonzales, who went 9 for 12 (.750) with 4 runs, 4 RBI and a home run against Long Beach State; Matt Hattabaugh, who was 6 for 12 (.500) with 7 runs, 6 RBI and 3 home runs against UC Santa Barbara; and Maté Borgogno, who was 9 for 16 (.563) with 3 doubles, 4 runs, 8 RBI and 2 sacrifice bunts against San Jose State.

Ironically, for a team known primarily for its strong pitching and defense, the Titans did not fare well in close games.

They were 5-11 in 1-run decisions and 1-1 in games decided by two runs. When the margin was 3 runs or more, the Titans were a nifty 30-11.

The Titans ranked 6th nationally in team defense (.970) and the greatest strength could be found on the infield where four former high school shortstops with their rangy gloves started in Nevin, Farlow, Borgogno and first baseman Steve Sisco. Last year's team committed only 70 errors in 59 games compared to 125 in 57 games in 1989.

Since realignment, four differents schools have won or shared conference titles: Fresno State in 1985, 1988 and 1989; Cal State Fullerton in 1987 and 1990; Long Beach State in 1989; and UC Santa Barbara in 1986.
