· Second-Year Head Coach Michelle Gromacki returns to guide the Titans to yet another post-season appearance

Cal State Fullerton's second-year head coach Michelle Gromacki has a lot to smile about as she prepares to guide her Titan softball team into the 2001 campaign.

First, and foremost, the Titans added perhaps one of the finest college softball players in the nation to their lineup as catcher Jenny Topping announced her intentions to leave the University of Washington and transfer to Cal State Fullerton in December.

Second, the momentum from a 45-15 overall record and a trip to the NCAA regionals in Fresno, CA, in Gromacki's inaugural season as head coach and the school's first outright Big West crown since the Titans won the national championship in 1986.

Third, continuing a tradition of success in the postseason by advancing to regional competition for the 19th time in 21 seasons of softball at Fullerton.

Finally, a new home to showcase some of the finest softball players in the country as the Titan Softball Complex undergoes a facelift that is fit enough to house one of the country'stop softball programs.

However, smiles aside, the goal for each and every member of the team is to return to Oklahoma City and the Women's College World Series for the first time since the 1995 season, and snap into place the final piece of the puzzle needed to fully bring Fullerton softball back to national prominence.

The Titans have just the right ingredients to put together one of their most explosive seasons to date. Fullerton brings back 10 players and eight starters (including all three pitchers) from last year's team which also posted an impressive 19-5 mark in Big West Conference play.

Fullerton also brings in four freshmen and another transfer from the University of Missouri along with Topping to complement an already potent Titan lineup that will look to leave its mark on the scoreboard and the record books this season.

Last year, the Titans put together two winning streaks of 11 games and a string of 14 consecutive victories in their last 16 games to close out the regular season.

Statistically, Fullerton was also among the top teams in the country in numerous categories, including: batting average (15th), home runs per game (tied for 8th), slugging percentage (tied for 7th), doubles per game (1.45), and winning percentage (tied for 13th).

PITCHERS

Christy Robitaille, RHP, Junior Jodie Cox, LHP, Sophomore Gina Oaks, RHP, Sophomore

Perhaps one of the toughest trio of hurlers in the nation last season, the Titans regularly used the three-woman rotation in holding the opposition to a combined .209 batting aver-

Junior righthander Christy Robitaille returns for her third season in the circle and is coming off what might possibly be her strongest season to date.

Robitaille posted a 14-7 overall record and a 1.75 ERA last season while standing second on the team with 132.0 innings pitched. She also lent her talents out of the bullpen, leading the conference and ranking tied for second in the nation with eight saves on the year and shut out opponents six times en route to first team All-Big West honors at the end of the year.

In conference play, Robitaille was 7-2 overall with a miniscule 0.87 ERA in 14 appearances for the Titans to go with three saves and four complete games in 56.1 innings.

Robitaille is also poised to become one of the NCAA's top save leaders, already ranking in the top 10 in NCAA history with 13. She is just 11 short of the NCAA record of 24 set by Notre Dame's Kelly Nichols in 1995-

Perhaps the biggest surprise of last season was the performance of the freshman duo of Jodie Cox and Gina Oaks, who combined for 31 of the Titans' 45 victories and also provided Fullerton with a tremendous amount of offense.

Cox led the team in victories with 17 and led the squad with a 1.48 ERA to earn second team All-Big West honors. She allowed just 51 runs (30 earned) in 142.1 innings while holding opponents to a .195 batting average.

On offense, Cox hit .309 on the year to go with four home runs, 16 RBI, and a .487 slugging percentage.

Oaks was also solid from the circle, posting a 14-4 overall mark and a 1.52 ERA to go with 12 complete games and five shutouts. She appeared in 26 games last season, but started only 16 of those contests. Oaks allowed 36 runs (28 earned) in 128.2 innings while holding the opposition to a .197 batting average.

Offensively, Oaks was one of Fullerton's dynamos, hitting .313 for the season to go with four home runs, 18 RBI, and eight doubles. She scored 26 runs and slugged .463 for the season while walking 13 times.

CATCHERS

Jenny Topping, Sophomore Amy LaRocque, Sophomore Jennifer Holt, Freshman

Perhaps the most-improved cog in the wheel for the Titans in 2001, Fullerton prevailed in the nationwide sweepstakes for one of the game's most powerful offensive superstars with the transfer of Jenny Topping.

Topping will take up residence behind the plate for Fullerton this season after a monumental year for the University of Washington in 2000.

As a reshirt freshman with the Huskies, Topping led the nation in home runs (24), RBIs (90), and slugging (.960), while ranking fifth in batting average (.438), fourth in walks per game (0.84), and 24th in doubles per game (0.30).

The sophomore who prepped at La Habra HS, also played eight games during the 1999 season for Washington, but fell victim to injury after tearing her ACL.


In those eight contests, Topping hit .533 in her first six games and finished the year with a .375 average. She also tallied three home runs, 11 RBI, and walked seven times while starting at three positions: first base, catcher, and designated hitter.

Sophomore Amy LaRocque returns for her second season with the Titans after appearing in 38 games last year. She hit .156 in just 45 at bats, but she scored 12 runs and was 2for-3 in stolen bases.

Freshman Jennifer Holt was an all-league selection from Oakmont HS in Roseville, CA, during her senior year and helped lead the

Fullerton lost just one infielder off of last season's roster in Kristy Osborne, who graduated last spring. However, it just happened to be the team's top hitter and the Big West Co-Player of the Year.

However, the Titans do return senior Brenda Iglesias, who was a first-team All-Big West selection last season after hitting .345 (second on the team) to go with three home runs and 20 RBI. She was tied for third on the team with eight doubles and slugged a team high .513 as a junior.

Junior first baseman Monica Lucatero continued the tradition of All-Americans at Cal State Fullerton, earning thrid-team honors last season as a sophomore after hitting .343 to go with six home runs and 39 RBI. She also had six doubles and slugged .483 while walking a team-high 20 times.

Sophomore Amanda Hockett was an offensive dynamo for the Titans in her freshman season, ranking second on the team with seven home runs and driving in 25. She hit .259 in 59 games, was second on the team with 32 runs scored, and was second with a .504 slugging percentage.

Fullerton welcomes transfer Shawna Robinson from the University of Missouri to the lineup. Robinson was named to the 1999 All-Region first team and the Big XII first team. She will add some speed to the Titan lineup after being caught stealing just once (37-for-38) in two seasons with Missouri. Last season, she hit .376 on the year to go with eight doubles and 13 RBI as well as posting a perfect record on the basepaths, swiping 22-of-22 bases.

OUTFIELDERS

Rachel Olvera, Senior Yasmin Mossadeghi, Junior Kristy Halagarda, Sophomore Julie Watson, Freshman Brittany Ziegler, Freshman Jocelyn Evans, Freshman

Possibly one of the youngest, but most experienced squads on the team this season, the Titans return just one starter from last season's team, and a two-year starter who spent most of 2000 recovering from a knee injury.

Spearheading the group is junior Yasmin

Mossadeghi, who earned first-team All-Big West and first-team All-West Region honors last season after hitting .335 to go with 13 home runs and 48 RBI. She was tied for 20th in the nation with 0.22 home runs per game and slugged .601 to go with 11 doubles on the year.

Senior Rachel Olvera returns after appearing in 52 games last season and hitting .118. Olvera sat out all of 1999 with a knee injury suffered during a tournament in Hawai'i and received a medical reshirt year. She tallied just 17 at bats last season, but scored eight times and was 3-for-4 in stolen bases.

Sophomore Kristy Halagarda appeared in 30 games for Fullerton last season, but started just three games. She went hitless in nine at bats, but scored six runs and had a stolen

A trio of newcomers join the ranks this season for the Titans in freshmen Julie Watson, Brittany Ziegler, and Jocelyn Evans.

Watson, a native of Valencia, CA, who prepped at Saugus HS, was named to the first-team All-Foothill League and All-Santa Clarita Valley four times (1997-2000) and earned first-team All-CIF honors in 1999.

Ziegler, who hails from nearby Irvine, CA, and prepped at Woodbridge HS, was named to the 1998 All-Seaview League Honorable Mention squad, was a second-team All-League selection in 1999, and was made a first team selection in 2000. She also helped lead Woodbridge to two Seaview League crowns (1998-99) and two trips to the CIF semifinals (1998-99).

Evans, who also hails from Valencia, CA, along with her freshman teammate and prepped at Hart HS, is a three-time All-Foothill League selection and also a three-time All-Santa Clarita Valley choice. She helped lead the Indians to the CIF quarterfinals all four years at Hart and three Foothill League crowns and showed off her power hitting skills by winning the home run derby at the Los Angeles Daily News All-Star game.

Michelle Gromacki

Head Coach 2nd Season Cal State Fullerton, '87

COACHING EXPERIENCE: Hired in 1995 as an assistant coach to Judi Garman, Gromacki enters her second season at the helm of the Cal State Fullerton softball program after spending the 2000 season as the Interim Head Coach after the retirement of Garman.

In her freshman campaign, Gromacki helped lead a young, but talented, Titan squad to a 45-15 overall mark and the school's first outright Big West title since winning the NCAA national championship in 1986 with a 19-5 league mark. Fullerton advanced to the NCAA West Regional in Fresno, CA, but fell short of the College World Series after falling to California and Fresno State.

Her efforts did not go unnoticed, however, as Gromacki and her assistants (Kelly Ford and Justin Kloczo) were named the top coaching staff in the west region for the 2000 season.

As an assistant coach, Gromacki helped lead the Titans to a 184-129 (.588) overall record and a 79-69 (.534) Big West mark in five seasons. Fullerton posted a 20-8 league record in her first season as an assistant in 1995 (46-17 overall) and finished second in the conference before advancing to the College World Series where they finished fifth.

PLAYING EXPERIENCE: Regarded as one of the best catchers in the nation, Gromacki helped lead the Titans to a combined 170-19-1 overall record and a 65-10-1 mark in conference play while also helping to lead the Titans to the 1986 National Championship.

In 1995, Gromacki was invited to participate in the first-ever Olympic try-out camp and helped lead the Redding Rebels to one of four ASA Women's Major Fastpitch National Championships while being named an ASA All-American, an honor she has earned eight times throughout her career. She was also selected as a member of the USA National Team who participated in the tournament to open the Olympic Complex in Columbus, GA, for the 1996 Summer Games in Atlanta.

In 1994, Gromacki was a member of several USA National Teams which claimed gold medals at the South Pacific Classic Tournament, the World Championships in Canada, and the Pan Am Qualifier in Guatamala. She was a participant in the Olympic Sports Festival in St. Louis, acting as both a player and an assistant coach to Ralph

From 1985-92, Gromacki participated in two Olympic Sports Festivals, and was a member of two USA National Teams that took gold medals in international competition in China (1987) and Japan (1985). She also spent eight months playing on a traveling team in New Zealand from 1988-89.

Aside from playing, Gromacki has also been involved in numerous other activities to promote the sport of softball. She was responsible for Junior Olympic try outs and Pan Am Team practices held at Cal State Fullerton, has conducted numerous clinics and speaking engagements around the world, and conducted a clinic in Italy, spending three days working with the Italian Junior Olympic National Team.



Gromacki is also a contributor to numerous athletic publications, including authoring a monthly column for Southern California Softball Magazine and writing articles for the National Fastpitch Coaches Association newsletter.

PERSONAL: A native of Antioch, CA, Gromacki now resides in Huntington Beach, CA... parents are Rick and Adeline.

Assistant Coach 2nd Season Oklahoma, '92

Former Oklahoma star outfielder and eight-year Division I coaching veteran Kelly Ford returns for her second season with the Cal State Fullerton coaching staff as the No. 1 assistant to head coach Michelle Gromacki.

Ford came to Fullerton after a distinguished six-year career at Cal State Northridge. She began her coaching stint with the Matadors in 1992 and then assisted her former college coach, Jim Beitia (now with Tennessee), for the 1993 season at Oklahoma before returning to Northridge in 1994 where she remained for five seasons.

Success seems to follow Ford as every team that she has been associated with has advanced to NCAA postseason play and every team has been ranked in the top 20.

With the Titans, Ford will be responsible for assisting coach Gromacki in all aspects of the program.

Ford spent two seasons at the Oklahoma University and earned Academic All-America honors after transferring from Central Arizona College.

Ford was a member of two NJCAA national championship squads while at Central Arizona in 1988 and 1989 and helped lead the team to a combined 125-9 record over that span. She earned second team all-conference honors and was named a Scholastic All-American.

Outside of her collegiate coaching duties, Ford has worked with ASA-USA for four years travelling all over the country putting on coaching clinics and was in charge of ASA's Youth Championship Camp Series. Locally, she has run camps for the past six years throughout southern California and is involved in the National Fastpitch Coaches Association, just finishing a term as the Assistant Coaches' Representative for the past four years on the Hall of Fame and Awards Committee.

A native of Portland, OR, Ford currently resides in San Pedro, CA. She was a two-time all-state softball selection for Madison HS and was also all-state in basketball. A tremendous athlete, Ford was a three-year letterwinner in volleyball and a four-year letterwinner in both softball and basketball.



Erika Blanco

Assistant Coach 1st Season Fresno State, '97

Blanco enters her first season on the Cal State Fullerton staff after a prestigious playing career at Fresno State and a stint as a head coach at Bullard High School in Fresno, CA.

She spent four years as a Bulldog (1992-96) under head coach Margie Wright, earning the career achievement award after her senior season. Blanco helped the team to four NCAA Regional appearances, a Western Athletic Conference crown in 1996, and an appearance in the NCAA College World Series in 1995.

During her senior year, Blanco had a breakout season for the Bulldogs, hitting a career-best .315 with one home run and 43 RBI. She scored 15 runs that season to help the team to the WAC title.

As a high school head coach at Bullard, Blanco helped lead the Knights to four straight North Yosemite League Championships in 1997-2000. During the 1999 season, Blanco guided Bullard HS to the CIF Central Section Valley Championship en route to the California state title and a National Championship.

Blanco was a four-time North Yosemite League Coach of the Year, the 1999 CIF Central Section Coach of the Year, and, along with her staff at Bullard, was a recipient of the 1999 National Fastpitch Coaches Association West Region Coaching Staff of the Year.

Born in Fresno, CA, her parents are Pete and Mary and she has two younger brothers: Peter and Michael. Blanco earned a degree in Liberal Studies from Fresno State in 1997.

Volunteer Assistant Coach Susie Parra returns to the Titan coaching staff as a volunteer assistant coach this season working primarily with the pitching staff.

A three-time All-American (1992-94) and national champion (1991, 93, 94) from Arizona, Parra was an assistant coach with the Titans for

three seasons prior to starting her own pitching school.

In 1994, Parra became Arizona's first-ever National Player of the Year awardwinner and helped lead the Wildcats to the national championship. That season, she earned Pacific-10 Conference Player of the Year honors and was named to the All-College World Series Team after her one-hit, 13-strikeout performance against Cal State Northridge.

During the 1994 College World Series, Parra posted a perfect 3-0 record, pitching 21 innings and allowing just two runs (neither of those earned), walking seven, and striking out 18 batters while hitting .300 in four games at the plate.

In her four years, Parra posted a 9-1 record in College World Series

play with eight shutouts and a 0.00 ERA.

Parra also ranks among the Arizona greats in the record books: No. 4 on the single-season home runs list (14 in 1994), No. 3 in career home runs (20), No. 4 in career RBIs (108), No. 8 in walks while batting (25 in 1994), No. 7 in career walks (57), No. 10 in career at-bats (541), No. 8 career games played (213).

While with the Wildcats, she also set numerous records (some which were later eclipsed), including: single-season pitching wins (33 in 1994), career pitching wins (101), earned run average (0.30 in 1992), single-season strikeout totals (256), career strikeouts (874),

career innings pitched (780.0), and career no-hitters (8).




Performance Enhancement

TITAN SOFTBALL HISTORY

The history of Cal State Fullerton softball begins in 1979 with the Administration's decision to add the sport to the University's list of Division I competitors. Judi Garman, coach of the very-successful Golden West Rustlers, is hired while Linda Shafor is named the program's first assistant coach.

1980 - Pam Edde, a pitcher from Utah State, and Pam Knox, a shortstop who played two years at Golden West and a season at the University of Arizona, transfer to Cal State Fullerton and a local product - Janet Lloyd from Tustin High School - commits to Fullerton and the upstart Titans are ranked as high as 7th in the coaches' pre-season poll.

After compiling a 37 - 29 season record, the Titans earn a trip to the Western AIAW regionals in Fresno, where the Titans eliminate defending national champions UCLA when UCLA makes an illegal defensive substitution in the bottom of the seventh inning. The Titans go to the AIAW College World Series in their first year and finish 9th out of 32.

1981 - Terry Keasling and Sue Lewis along with new Assistant Coach Jan Dunlap, arrive at Fullerton and help the team to a 60-14 record including a sweep at the Western regional. They earn a return trip to the AIAW College World Series.

In the first game Janet Lloyd, recovering from knee surgery, hits a dramatic three-run home run in the bottom of the seventh with two outs and an 0-2 count to rally for a 7-6 come-from-behind win over New Mexico State.

In game 2, Terry Keasling steals the spotlight by pitching a two-hit shutout, striking out 13 batters and hitting a two-run home run in the bottom of the 15th inning to beat Western Michigan, 2-0.

In game 5, freshman Sue Lewis hits a pair of home runs to defeat UCLA, 5-4, to advance the Titans to the Championship Game. (The Titans complete a sixgame sweep over the Bruins in 1981.)

After losing to Fullerton, 6-1, to force the doubleelimination tournament to a final Championship Game, Utah State survives a seventh-inning rally by the Titans for a 4-3 victory. Cal State Fullerton finishes as the No. 2 team in the nation in only its second year.

Pam Edde, Sue Lewis and Janet Lloyd are named to the All-America team and Terry Keasling establishes the single-season record for strikeouts among Titan pitchers in a season, fanning 328 batters.

1982 - Kathy Van Wyk joins the team when Defending Champion Texas Woman's University drops softball. She compiles an incredible NCAA record 33 consecutive wins in a season - still the record - on her way to a 35-1 record, with a 0.18 ERA.

The Titans compile a 55-6-2 record and earn a trip to the first-ever NCAA College World Series where Cal State Fullerton finishes 3rd.

Kathy Van Wyk wins the Broderick Award (national player of the year) and is named to the All-America team, along with Sue Lewis. Terry Keasling finishes her two-year career with a 13-3 record and her average of eight strikeouts per seven innings pitched still ranks her sixth on the all-time NCAA list for career strikeout ratio. Additionally, Lewis leads the nation in home runs and RBI - 9 and 50, respectively.

1983 - JoAnn Ferrieri, Elise King and Susan LeFebvre begin their careers as Titans and Kathy Van Wyk becomes the program's third assistant coach. Cal State Fullerton finishes 56-15 overall and 17-3 in a tie with UCLA for 1st place of the WCAA Conference.

The Titans defeat New Mexico in the West Regional

to advance to their fourth-straight College World Series. They beat Indiana, South Carolina and UCLA to advance to the Championship Game against Texas A&M, where they lose to the Aggies, 2-0. It is the program's second appearance in the Championship Game in only four years.

Elise King and Susan LeFebvre are selected to the All-America team.

1984 - Debbie Mygind begins her Fullerton career and combines with Susan LeFebvre and Lori Neff for a 54-12 record as the Titans qualify for their fifth consecutive post-season appearance. Although the Titans lose to Defending Champion Texas A&M in the Western Regional, Titan Sue Lewis is selected to the All-America team for the third time. She becomes the only Titan to accomplish this feat.

1985 - Terri Oberg begins her two-year Titan career. A return trip to the College World Series pits the Titans against their old rivals, the Bruins of UCLA. The Titans had already suffered a loss at the hands of Nebraska when the Bruins beat the Titans, 1-0, in a game which landed Fullerton in the No. 3 spot for the tour-

However, after UCLA beat the Cornhuskers in the Championship Game, it was determined that Nebraska had used an illegal player throughout the CWS. Although the NCAA record book doesn't reflect it, Cal State Fullerton claims its third No. 2 finish.

Debbie Mygind, JoAnn Ferrieri and Terri Oberg are selected All-America.

1986 - After one ninth-place, one third-place and three second-place finishes, Cal State Fullerton finishes the 1986 season with the NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP. Behind the strong pitching of Susan LeFebvre, Connie Clark and April Jones, the Titans finish with a 57-9

In Game 1 at the College World Series the Titans defeat Long Beach State in what proved to be the most difficult game of the series for Fullerton. Connie Clark pitches a four-hit shutout in the nine inning game.

LeFebvre pitches a one-hit shutout over Cal in the second game of the series and the Titans beat the Bears, 3-0. The third game was highlighted by a no-hitter from Clark, her second of the season over the Aggies, and the Titans beat Texas A&M, 3-0. Riding a streak, Fullerton faces Indiana in one semi-final game and for the first - and only time in the series - the Titans are scored on. But LeFebvre and the Titans prevail and take the game, 3-1, to set up the Championship Game vs. Texas A&M. Clark pitches a one-hit shutout and the Titans score in the fifth inning when Rina Foster triples and scores the winning run on a fielder's choice on the next play. Fullerton adds two more and wins its first national title, 3-0. The Titans tie a CWS record by going undefeated in the tournament.

Susan LeFebvre culminates a brilliant Titan career, receives the Broderick Award and joins teammate Chenita Rogers on the All-America team. Still the career leader in wins with 100, games played with 149, shutouts with 59, strikeouts wih 702 and innings pitched with 894.2, LeFebvre remains on the NCAA top 20 list for season-best ERA with a 0.23 average in her freshman season, 1983.

1987 - Missy Coombes, Valerie Douglas and Carey Hess begin Titan careers and Connie Clark returns for her senior year. The Titans finish 59-10 and earn a trip back to the CWS to defend their championship.

Cal State Fullerton defeats Florida State 3-0 in Game 1 of the CWS to set up a rematch of the 1986 Championship Game, the Titans and the Aggies. In what many people consider the greatest softball game in CWS history, the country's two best pitchers, Clark and Shawn Andaya, pitch 13 innings. Deadlocked 0-0 through ten innings (including two tie-breaker innings), the Aggies got on the board in the top of the eleventh. But, in Fullerton's half of the inning, Foster opens at second, is sacrificed to third and, with two outs, Missy Coombes drives Foster in with an infield single. The effort continues deadlocked at 1-1 until the 13th inning when Andaya herself scores the winning run for the Aggies. After 13 innings, the 3 hour and 25 minute

A tired Titan team takes the field the next afternoon and defeats Fresno State, 2-1. Going into the bottom of the seventh inning down by one run, the Titans rally with an opening single by Alani Silva. Michelle Gromacki reaches on an error. After a failed sacrifice attempt, the Titans have one out, Gromacki at second and Charis Monroe at first. Then, with one out, Cathi Hall, in the biggest hit of her collegiate career, doubles off the wall to score Gromacki. Chenita Rogers sends a sacrifice fly to deep right and the Titans come from behind to beat the Bulldogs.

Playing that same night, the Titans face familiar rivals UCLA. The Titans are unable to beat the Bruins and settle for a third-place finish. (Texas A&M goes on to beat the Bruins twice the following day to record its second national title.)

Connie Clark pitches every game and inning of the CWS and is awarded the Broderick Award, the third time a Titan pitcher has been given the honor. She is joined by Chenita Rogers on the All-America team, her second selection. Rogers leads the nation in hits with 89 and posts a .401 batting average.

1988 - Marty Rubinoff becomes the fourth Titan assistant coach and Mich DeBree becomes a Titan. Fullerton uses four young pitchers throughout the season

who combine for a 52-20 record and a third-place finish in the final season of the PCAA Conference. (The conference becomes the Big West for the 1989 season.) In a difficult West Regional, the Titans draw eventual National Champion UCLA and lose in a best-of three format.

1989 - Ann Van Dortrecht begins her pitching career for the Titans. Fullerton posts a 47-15 record and finishes 28-8 in second place in the Big West. The Titans draw cross-town rivals Cal Poly Pomona in the NCAA West Regional and are knocked out by the Broncos.

Missy Coombes and Carey Hess are named to the All-America team. Additionally, Hess leads the nation with 52 runs scored.

1990 - Joy Tiner becomes a Titan. The Titans finish 45-23, 22-13, good for third place in the Big West and draw Long Beach State for the West Regional. Both teams were ranked in the top five. After beating Long Beach State, 3-2, on the opening night, the Titans suffer a 4-0 defeat and then a difficult 2-1 loss in 16 innings to the 49ers. It is the eleventh consecutive year that the Titans compete in post-season play.

1991 - Kathy Van Wyk returns as an assistant coach and Tiffany Boyd arrives at Fullerton and the tradition of Fullerton pitching dominance continues as she and Van Dortrecht combine for most of the Titans' 52-16-1 record and Cal State Fullerton finishes 25-9-1 in the Big West. Again, Cal State Fullerton qualifies for post-season play and for the second time loses a best-of-three series to Long Beach State. However, the Big West has three teams - Long Beach State, Fresno State and UNLV - representing it at the CWS.

1992 - Denise DeWalt selects Cal State Fullerton and the Titans post a 45-20 record and a 25-11, second-place finish in the Big West. Tiffany Boyd is named Conference Pitcher of the Year and DeWalt is named Conference Field Player of the Year. But, for the third year in a row, the Titans are eliminated after qualifying for post-season play by Long Beach State in a best-of-three series.

1993 - Traci Fischer begins her career at Fullerton after sitting out most of the 1992 season as a medical redshirt. The Titans use four pitchers to combine for a 37-21 record and take second place in the Big West.

Fullerton qualifies for the West Regional and is sent to UCLA for another best-of-three series. The Defending Champion Bruins down the Titans and return to the CWS where UCLA loses to Arizona.

Denise DeWalt posts a .418 batting average and is selected to the All-America team. DeWalt's career .396 average marks the all-time best for the Titans.

1994 - The "yellow ball" is introduced in collegiate softball. Three pitchers, led by Jennifer Mortensen and Trinity Johnson, combine for a 35-29 record and the Titans place third in conference play.

Participating at the NCAA Regionals at Cal State Northridge, Cal State Fullerton is a part of a four-team Regional. The Titans beat Washington in the first game, 2-1, then lose to Northridge in game 2. The Titans beat Washington again, 4-0, and Northridge, 2-0, to force a final showdown between the Titans and the Matadors. Johnson takes the loss as CSUN bests Fullerton, 4-0, to advance to the CWS.

1995 - Chris Zboril begins her career as a Titan and Michelle Gromacki returns as the program's fifth assistant coach. Also, Melanie Roche becomes the program's first pitching-only coach. Cal State Fullerton posts a 46-17 overall record and a 20-8 Big West mark, good for second place. The Titans draw a return trip to Northridge for the NCAA Regional with CSUN, Missouri and Illinois State. Shaking off seven years of regional frustrations, the Titans blast Illinois State in the opener, 9-1, and then beat Northridge twice, 1-0 and 2-1, to gain a berth as one of the final eight in the CWS at Oklahoma. The Titans beat first-place conference foe UNLV, 1-0, and then lose to two-time Defending Champion, Arizona, 11-0, and to Iowa, 6-5, to finish fifth.

1996 - Susie Parra joins the Titans' staff as pitching coach. In this Olympic year, the Titans travel to New Zealand and Australia to participate in exhibition softball in an international setting.

On the strength of two young pitchers and a barrage of veteran offensive talent, Cal State Fullerton finishes 41-28 overall and 17-15 in fourth place in the Big West. The Titans bid, and receive, the NCAA West Regional and play host to Northridge, UCLA and Southwestern Missouri State. It is the 17th consecutive year that the Titans qualify for post-season play.

The Bruins and Titans meet for the first time in three years and for the first time in the newly expanded Titan Softball Complex. Chris Zboril leads off the game for the visiting Titans (by seeding) with a home run, followed by another by Traci Fischer and the Titans don't look back as they hand the Bruins a 5-1 defeat in front of a crowd of 551 for the afternoon affair. The

TITAN SOFTBALL HISTORY

Titans continue their roll as they greet Northridge with 9 runs in the first inning and an 11-0 mercy rule pounding. The first inning is capped by a Zboril grand slam. But the Titans' offense falters and their pitching inexperience shows when Fullerton loses its surprising bid to return to the CWS as the Bruins beat the Titans, 14-1, and 7-2, to advance to the CWS.

Traci Fischer is selected to the All-West Regional team and the Titans finish the season with a ninth-place Coaches Poll nod.

1997 - The season features the most newcomers a Fullerton team has ever fielded, but the Titans go 29-26 on the year. Although the squad is disappointed by not making post-season play for the first time in the history of the program, 1997 is not without highlights.

Donna Coombes throws a perfect game as the Titans defeat Purdue at the Florida Tournament and Fullerton goes on to capture the crown there.

The Titans get off to their worst conference start, 0-6, but never give up, battling to conclude the season with a split with Long Beach State, eventual Big West Champions. Second baseman Nikki Hart is named to the 1997 All-Big West Team, along with shortstop Julie Williams. Outfielder Rachel Olvera is named to the second team and pitcher/utility player Jana Oetgen earns Honorable Mention.

1998 - Prior newcomers with a year of experience under their collective belts, combine with a couple of new faces to provide one of the most potent offenses Cal State Fullerton has ever fielded. However, pitching continues to be inconsistent and the Titans go 32-29 on the year and miss post-season play for only the second time in the program's history.

Brenda Iglesias and Kristy Osborne earn All-Western Regional honors for their outstanding hitting and are joined on the All-Big West squad by Dara Marzolo and Hart for her second consecutive selection.

1999 - Although Stephenie Little had arrived on campus in time to play for the Titans in 1998, it was her senior season, 1999, when she established herself as one of the nation's premier hitters – both contact and for power. And, if there was a word that summed up the 1999 season of offense for Cal State Fullerton, it was power. Led by Little's single-season Titan record 23 home runs (and her .372 average), Fullerton pounds 54 round-trippers (a new Titan team high), compared to their opponents' 23. The offense also sets Titan and Big West single-season records in doubles collecting 99 of them, led by Monica Lucatero's 18 (which ties her for No. 2 in the CSF record book).

The maturity of senior pitcher Jana Oetgen and the talent of newcomer Christy Robitaille mark the return of solid pitching for the Titans and the team — although flirting with the conference title for much of

the season after taking two of three from eventual champions Long Beach State in Long Beach — finishes the regular-season dropping three straight to Pacific and fall all the way to fourth in the Big West. However, overall record, the strength of schedule and the strength of their opponents' schedules land the Titans back in the NCAA post-season after the only drought in the program's history, 1997 and 1998. Fullerton receives a berth as the No. 4 seed at Regional 3 in Seattle, Wash., as 1999 marks the first time the softball post-season features eight, six-team regionals in an expanded 48-team format tournament.

The Titans play their best softball in several years, pummeling No. 3 seed Tennessee in the first game, 12-1. Fullerton ties the NCAA post-season mark for doubles in a single game, smashing seven of them. Facing post-season nemesis Texas A&M (see years 1983-86), Fullerton gets great pitching from Robitaille and a save by Oetgen and win, 2-1, to advance in the Regional to face the host Washington Huskies in the winner's bracket matchup. The Titans battle the Huskies better than anyone at that regional – and better than most did all year - and lose the heart-breaker, 1-0, in the 9th to the eventual NCAA runnersup Washington squad. Fullerton has to come back after a twohour respite to battle Hawai'i on Saturday night. (The winner of that game would have to beat the Huskies twice to advance to the College World Series.) The Titans wage another battle with the Rainbow Wahinethe two teams having met three times in the regular season with Hawai'i holding the 2-1 edge. This time the two teams get timely hitting and great defense to produce an 11-inning gem, but the Titans come up a run short and lose, 4-3

Fullerton finishes the season 36-29 and Little earns third-team All-American honors—the 27th selection for CSF— and is the Big West Player of the Year. In addition to Little's first-team All-West Region honor, Nikki Hart earns second-team All West Region status. Both Little and Hart earn first-team All-Big West honors and are joined by Oetgen, Lucatero, Yasmin Mossadeghi and Kristy Osborne on the second team. Oetgen, Dara Marzolo, Wendi Griffin and Stacy Pierson are selected to the All-Regional team.

But, 1999 marks the season in which the Titans announce to the rest of the softball world, "We are back"

It also marks Judi Garman's last year as head coach as she announces her retirement after 20 years guiding the program. At the time of her retirement, she leads the nation in all-time wins. Her final Division I coaching record ends: 913-376-4 (.708).

2000 - The Michelle Gromacki era begins at Fullerton and the Titans return to the national stage once again to usher in the new millenium, advancing to the

postseason as one of six teams invited to the NCAA West Regional in Fresno, CA.

Gromacki's troops sliced through the regular season, posting a 45-15 overall record and a 19-5 mark in the Big West Conference. Fullerton put together winning streaks of 11 games to open the season, another string of 11 games, and a streak of 14 games during the Big West schedule.

It was the first outright Big West title for the Titans dating back to 1986 when Fullerton advanced to the College World Series and came home as the National Champions.

Youth was served in the 2000 season, led by an outstanding group of freshmen and sophomores who paced the Titan offense and shut down the opposition inside the circle.

Sophomores Monica Lucatero (Third-Team All-American) and Yasmin Mossadeghi were two of the Big West's big bats, hitting .343 and .335, respectively, en route to post-season honors.

In the circle, two freshmen and a sophomore proved to be a triple threat for opposing teams as the Titans regularly featured three different pitchers throughout the year. Highly-touted freshmen Jodie Cox and Gina Oaks combined for 31 of the Titans' 45 wins on the year.

After a masterful regular season, Fullerton entered the West Regional as the No. 14 team in the nation, and quickly jumped into the winner's bracket with a hard-fought 2-1 victory over Texas in the first round.

However, the Titans ran into an upstart California squad, which defeated Fullerton, 3-2, before advancing to the College World Series by defeating host Fresno State. In the fifth-place game, the Titans ran up against the host Bulldogs, but could not defeat the 1998 National Champions, falling, 4-3, to end their season.

Cal State Fullerton has produced a professional baseball player (Missy Coombes of the Silver Bullets) and several former players who are still involved with softball as international players or coaches, collegiate and high school coaches, athletic trainers or sports information professionals. Titan teams and players have traveled all over the world as players or coaches and have influenced the international softball community with their knowledge and experience.

The history of Titan softball includes a National Championship, three second-place finishes, three Broderick Award winners (now called the Honda/Broderick Award), 28 All-Americans and dozens of all-conference and all-region selections. Additionally, it includes countless individual highlights and memories.

Cal State Fullerton is one of only five schools to win the NCAA Championship and has participated in post-season play 19 of 21 years.

California State University, Fullerton plays a major role in the intellectual, cultural and economic lives of Orange County. Given the charge of teaching as a member of the state's three-tiered system of higher education, Cal State Fullerton does an exceptional job of educating the residents - and future - of Orange County. It prepares highly skilled and well-prepared university graduates.

Now in its 42nd year, the university points proudly to its product, approximately 120,000 graduates. With 85 percent of them remaining within a 50-mile radius of campus. they occupy key spots in business, industry, government, the political arena and education.

With full accreditation for its overall program, Cal State Fullerton has national recognition for its programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, communications, communicative disorders, computer science, dance, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, teacher education and theater. In all there are 98 degree programs with 44 of them at the graduate level - plus a wide variety of credential and certificate programs.

Students are provided the best of current practice,

theory and research and integrate professional studies with preparation in the arts and sciences. Through experiences in and out of the classroom, students develop the habit of intellectual inquiry, prepare for challenging professions, strengthen relationships to their communities and contribute productively to society.

Cal State Fullerton is the most affordable and ethnically diverse university in the area. It ranks 10th nationally in the overall number of bachelor's degrees awarded to minority students.

An extended education program, with open enrollment, offers individual courses, seminars and workshops, as well as more than 50 certificate programs ranging from entrepreneurship and sales management to creative writing.

Community members also may visit campus for theater, music and dance performances and art exhibits of off-campus artists, plus those of university students and faculty members. While here, both the Fullerton Arboretum and Heritage House are worth touring. And, an extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students, also is open to the public.

Volunteer opportunities are open through Cal State Fullerton's many support groups, such as the Art Alliance, Music Associates, Patrons of the Library and President's Associates. One such group, Continuing Learning Experience, holds many of its programs in the Ruby Gerontology Center, which serves as an educational and research facility for the study of successful aging.

In four decades, Cal State Fullerton has taken its place as a primary force in the growth and prosperity of Southern California.



TITAN ATHLETICS...A PROUD HISTORY

From modest beginnings and never with abundant resources, the Cal State Fullerton Titans have achieved successes that are the envy of many older and larger institutions across the country.

"Titan Pride" has been the rallying cry for 11 national team championships in seven different sports, hundreds of individual All-Americans, dozens of eventual professional athletes, numerous national coach of the year award winners, Olympic basketball players, a Miss America candidate and the subject matter of a Walt Disney film.

The tenor was set by the first intercollegiate team - men's basketball. In only his second season, Coach Alex Omalev advanced the Titans five rounds into the NAIA playoffs in 1961-62. Sixteen seasons later, the nation watched another "Cinderella" Titan Five advance to within one victory of the "Final Four" as Bobby Dye's 1977-78 team won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association postseason tournament and then beat nationally ranked New Mexico and USF to gain the finals of the NCAA Western Regional.

The basketball tradition began even stronger on the women's side. Recent Naismith and Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductee Billie Moore coached the Titans to the national championship in 1970 and star forward Nancy Dunkle was one of her players on the women's 1976 silver-medal winning Olympic team. The most recent Titan All-American was center Genia Miller in 1991.

The Titans earned gold in 1984 when point guard Leon Wood directed the men's Olympic team to victory in Los Angeles. The first-round draft pick of the Philadelphia 76ers went on to a 6-year National Basketball Association career and he currently is in his third season as a referee, only the second former NBA player to make that career switch.

Future NBA performers Richard Morton, Henry Turner, Cedric Ceballos and Bruce Bowen were some of the stars of the 1980s and 1990s, when the Titans made NIT appearances on both the men's and women's sides. Ceballos gained notoriety for winning the NBA Slam-Dunk contest one year while the women can point with pride to Autumn Hollyfield, the nation's top 3-point field goal shooter in 1993-94, and Koko Lahanas, the nation's scoring leader in 1994-95. Miller still holds NCAA records and came back from a career in Japan to earn a spot with the Los Angeles Sparks of the WNBA as Eugenia Rycraw.

Gymnastics has brought Fullerton considerable fame. Former men's Coach Dick Wolfe won three college division NCAA titles (1971, 1972 and 1974) and had subsequent teams in the Top Ten at the Division I level while winning 10 PCAA titles in a row. His 1987 squad was ranked No. 1 in the nation. Coach Lynn Rogers began the women's program in 1976 and the Titans have finished sixth or better in the nation 12 times and won the national title in 1979. One-armed Carol Johnston was an All-American and star of the Disney film, "Lefty," while Tami Elliott (1984-86) won 10 All-American awards before becoming Miss Virginia and competing in the Miss America pageant.

Baseball exploded onto the national scene behind former Coach Augie Garrido by breaking the USC monopoly in the NCAA western regionals in 1975. The Titans won the national title in 1979 behind Tim Wallach, who would play 17 major league seasons. They won the College World Series again in 1984 and John Fishel was the MVP of the CWS. They were national runners-up in 1992 with another MVP in third baseman Phil Nevin, who also was the first pick in the amateur draft by the Houston Astros.

The Titans placed third in the CWS in 1994 and came back with their best season ever in 1995, going 57-9 en route to their third national championship. Leading the way was Player of the Year Mark Kotsay, now with the Florida Marlins, and one of 31 former Titans to have played in the majors. Fullerton made its tenth trip to Omaha in 1999 under third-year Coach George Horton.

Five players have become Olympians with Kotsay and Brian Loyd helping the U.S. win a bronze medal in 1996 in Atlanta. Nevin, Jason Moler and Bob Caffrey are the other Fullerton baseball Olympians.

Women also have sparkled on Fullerton diamonds. Hall of Fame Coach Judi Garman founded the softball program in 1980 and won more games (913) than any previous coach. The Titans have made eight trips to the College World Series and 19 regional appearances. They brought home an NCAA Championship in 1986 and boast three national players of the year in pitchers Kathy Van Wyk, Susan LeFebvre and Connie Clark.

The now-defunct football program made great strides in Division I-A after its humble

Div. II beginnings in 1970. Coach Gene Murphy guided the Titans to two conference championships and four runner-up finishes between 1983 and 1989. Titan products included Super Bowl rookies Bobby Kemp (Cincinnati in 1982) and Mark Collins (New York Giants in 1987). Titans have starred in the Canadian Football League led by receiver Allen Pitts of Calgary, 1995 MVP Mike Pringle of Baltimore and perennial quar-

terback star Damon Allen.

With the loss of football, Head Coach Al Mistri's soccer program filled the void in Titan Stadium. A women's squad was launched in 1993 and it coincided with a memorable men's season that saw the Titans climb as high as No. 3 in the national rankings. They were led by All-American forward Eddie Soto and competed at the NCAA Final Four, placing third. There have been three subsequent trips to the playoffs and a No. 2 national ranking in 1996. On the international level, former Titan Brian Dunseth captained the U.S. Olympic team in Sydney last September.

There have been national titles in men's cross country (1971) and women's fencing (1974) and individual standouts such as golfer Martha Wilkerson, runner Mark Covert and wrestler Laszlo Molnar, who finished second in the nation in 1994 at 167 pounds. Heather Killeen became the Titans' first Div. I cross country All-American in 1994, won three events at the 1995 Big West Conference track championships and was one of 10 finalists for 1995 NCAA Woman of the Year Award. The Titans have a rising star in junior Brandon Campbell. He became the first Titan to compete in the Pan-Am Junior Games and won a silver medal in 1999 while establishing a school record in the high jump at 7-1. He holds several other records and also plays on the basketball team.

WHAT ABOUT THE NICKNAME?

"What exactly is a Titan?"

"Why do you have an elephant for your mascot?"

Those are two of the first questions that arise when a Cal State Fullerton athletic team makes its inaugural visit to an area. While the relatively young institution carved out of the Orange County citrus groves may be too new for many traditions, there are some recognized legends.

"It was the students' decision in a vote," explained Dr. Ernest Becker, founding Dean of Students, of the nickname "Titans." "More than a hundred names were suggested, and the Student Council took on the job of narrowing the list down to a few for the purposes of an election. The vote was close, with Titans narrowly prevailing over Aardvarks and Rebels."

It was a unique student body, all upper division students until 1963. There were 453 of them, mostly female, in 1959, the first year of classes at what was then known as Orange County State College.

"Even when it was decided that 'Titans' would be the nickname, there was confusion as to what it represented," said Becker. "I was thinking of a large mythological figure from Greek history, not unlike Tommy Trojan, but with perhaps straighter, more modern lines. In the same vein, the original dormitories were named Othrys Hall. There were others, however, who related the name to the Titan missile then in prominence."

Nothing official was done but then along came the "First Intercollegiate Elephant Race in Human History."


What began as a practical joke attracted elephants from universities around the nation and even Oxford from England. A crowd estimated at more than 10,000 people turned out on "Dumbo Downs" as the hastily graded field became known that spring afternoon in 1962.

To publicize the event, a circus-like elephant called Tuffy the Titan was used and it began appearing on sweaters and notebook covers around the campus. With no other mascot, the elephant was unofficially adopted. Several revisions of the caricature have been made to create a more tenacious Tuffy, or Titus as he also was called in an attempt to make him Greek. The costume that brings the mascot to life also has changed. Tuffy even attracted a female Tiffy in 1992.

The origin of the school colors also bears discussion. The students voted for royal blue and white, but the athletic equipment manager at the time thought orange was appropriate on uniforms for a school known as Orange County State College. The unofficial color was "adopted" and finally was formally acknowledged by the Athletics Council in 1987. A change to a navy blue was initiated in 1992 with a de-emphasis of the orange.

Headed by Christine McCarthy, the Athletic Academic Services department, tabbed as Titan Scholars, provides effective support services to help student-athletes reach their academic goals. The academic services staff takes a proactive role by coordinating study plans, study skills workshops, tutoring sessions, study halls, faculty and peer mentoring and campus services referrals. Staff members also monitor progress toward

graduation, assist studentathletes in selecting and registering for classes and teach a Life Skills 100 class.

Coaches rely on Athletic Academic Services to track student-athletes' progress in classes and to alert them and the students to any potential problems. The department an "early warning" system in

place, which utilizes periodic grade checks and clear communication with faculty members when student-athletes may require additional academic support.

The department's services are available to all past and current student-athletes. "Not all student-athletes are able to graduate in four years, because of professional opportunities or personal commitments," says McCarthy. "We developed a re-entry program for former student-athletes who wish to complete their studies."

NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills

Cal State Fullerton is a participating institution in the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills program, which is aimed at enhancing the quality of the student-athlete experience within the university setting. Throughout their career, Cal State Fullerton



student-athletes are provided with resources that will assist their development in five primary areas: academics, athletics, personal development, career development and community service.

The athletic training program at Cal State Fullerton plays a major role in maintaining the health of Titan student-athletes. A team doctor, three full-time certified athletic trainers, two certified graduate assistants and more than 20 student assistants comprise a program that is generally regarded as one of the very best in the country.

Titan athletic training personnel specialize in preventive medicine, recognition of injuries and rehabilitation. Student athletic trainers who are admitted into the highly selective ATEP (Athletic Training Educational Program), which is administered through the Department of Kinesiology and Health Promotion, must meet demanding requirements. In addition to taking 100 units of kinesiology and athletic training courses, they must serve five semesters and 1,500 clinical supervised hours. Before becoming certified, candidates must pass the National Athletic Trainers' Association Board of Certification examination. Since 1997, nearly 80 percent of Cal State Fullerton graduates have passed on their first attempt, compared to the national rate of about 30 percent. Since the inception of the program, dozens of alumni have moved into coveted positions across the country (see below).

Julie Max. Cal State Fullerton's Head Athletic Trainer, has been the driving force behind the development of an athletic training program that has received national acclaim. Max is in her 22nd year at her alma mater since replacing her mentor, the late Jerry Lloyd. Recently, Maxwas elected the first female president of the 25,000-member National Association of Athletic Trainers (NATA). The two-year term comes after a six-year stint on the organization's board of directors and a one-year term as its vice president. In 1997, Max was honored with the NATA Service Award, which recognizes outstanding service to the athletic training profession at the state and district level.



undoubtedly has a place in Cal State Fullerton lore, having served as the backdrop for such memorable triumphs as the men's basketball team's 1983 upset of No. 1 UNLV. Titan Gym also has an impressive international history — it served as the venue for 1984 Olympic team handball — and political history — former President Ronald Reagan made his last Orange County appearance at Titan Gym while campaigning for his successor, George Bush. The facility is scheduled to undergo an expansion in the near future, which will add significant office space and a practice facility.

Tennis Facility

Goodwin Field

was the host site for Cal State Fullerton's first NCAA Baseball Regional in the spring of 2000. A \$3 million expansion project, spearheaded by a \$1 million gift from Jerry and Merilyn Goodwin, has transformed the field into one of the premier collegiate facilities on the West Coast. The adjacent softball field also received a complete makeover as part of the project. Both fields now share a clubhouse-type facility that includes locker rooms, offices and a VIP-area. Both fields serve as the sites for premier in-season tournaments and figure to be regulars in the NCAA postseason.

is considered among the finest soccer facilities in the nation and regularly hosts professional and international soccer matches in addition to the Titan men's and women's programs.




STRENGTH & CONDITIONING STRENGTH & CONDITIONING

Cal State Fullerton student-athletes have year-round access to the services offered by the Strength and Conditioning Program, under the direction of Mike Nagler. Aimed at developing speed, power, strength and endurance in Cal State Fullerton's student-athletes, the program plays a key role in the success of Titan teams.

Individual workouts are designed, implemented and regularly adjusted by Nagler to help each student-athlete develop the stamina needed to maintain the rigorous year-round workouts associated with Division I sports.

Now located inside Titan Stadium is a 6,000 squarefoot weight room facility featuring eight platforms, eight squat racks, plyometric devices and nearly 8,000 pounds in free weights. The facility will service more than 300 student-athletes over the course of the year.



Individual workouts are developed, implemented and adjusted for each of Cal State Fullerton's student-athletes by strength and conditioning Coach Mike Nagler.

The weight room located above Titan Gym is one of several on-campus facilities utilized by Cal State Fullerton's student-athletes.



Mike Nagler was named Cal State Fullerton's first full-time strength and conditioning coach on Jan. 4, 2000. Nagler had spent the previous 17 months as assistant strength coach at the University of Iowa. At Iowa, Nagler was in charge of developing and implementing weight lifting programs for women's basketball, volleyball, women's soccer, men's and women's track, gymnastics, softball, and men's and women's golf. He also assisted with the men's basketball program.

He also previously worked as an assistant at Baylor University, the University of Washington, UNLV and Washington State and served as an intern with the NFL's Seattle Seahawks.

Nagler, 29, earned his bachelor's degree in exercise science from Washington State in 1993 and picked up a master's degree in kinesiology from UNLV in 1996.

Dr. Milton A. Gordon was selected the fourth president of Cal State Fullerton by The California State University Board of Trustees and assumed his duties on Aug. 6, 1990.

His university leadership includes serving as vice president for academic affairs at Sonoma State University for four years, as dean of the College of the Arts and Sciences for Chicago State University for more than eight years and as director of the Afro-American Studies Program at Loyola University of Chicago for six years.

President Gordon also taught at the Illinois Institute of Technology and in the Chicago public schools and served as mathematician at the University of Chicago's Laboratories of Applied Sciences.

He is the vice chairman of the NCAA Presidents Commission and the California state representative to the American Association of State Colleges and Universities. He also serves on the governing boards of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, California Coalition for Mathematics, Orange County Chamber of Commerce, Orange County Community Foundation, United Way of Orange County, YMCA of Orange County and Fullerton Chamber of Commerce. In addition, he is on the advisory boards of St. Jude Medical Center and The California State University's Institute for Teaching and Learning.



John Easterbrook Athletics Director

John Easterbrook is in his seventh year in charge of the Cal State Fullerton athletics department, which has seen continued and easily measured success during his first six years of leadership. The Titans have annually come out in the black budgetarily and on-campus facilities have been dramatically improved. Four teams have reached NCAA quarterfinals during his tenure topped by the 1995 national championship baseball team.

Easterbrook was appointed on Sept. 1, 1994, by President Milton Gordon. He

was chosen from a field of 41 candidates on the strength of his experience at a successful Division I program and his familiarity with the California State University system as an associate athletic director for nine years at Fresno State. Easterbrook, 61, was involved primarily in compliance, facilities and event management at Fresno State, which annually draws more than 500,000 fans.

Easterbrook was hired at Fresno State by Dr. Gary Cunningham. The pair had crossed paths at the University of Wyoming in Laramie where Easterbrook was the president and CEO of American National Bank and Cunningham was the UW athletic director.

Easterbrook previously coached college football for 13 seasons at Idaho, Oregon State, Illinois and Wyoming. He was a three-year starter at quarterback and also played two seasons of basketball at Illinois. He was the Most Valuable Player of the Copper Bowl. He earned a bachelor's degree (1962) in commerce and law and attended the University of Illinois Law School.

The Champaign, Illinois, native and his wife, Cynthia, have three adult children, four granddaughters and one grandson.

Dr. Jeremiah is primarily responsible for overseeing athletic department academics, assisting with departmental planning and financial forecasting and supervising volleyball, gymnastics, wrestling, women's basketball and softball.

She is a member of the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee and will chair the committee for the next two

years. Additionally, she is a member of the Big West Conference Athletics Council and serves on Cal State Fullerton's Academic Senate executive committee and university planning committee.

In her seven years as the Titan's women's basketball coach, Jeremiah compiled a 112-93 record and in 1990-91, she guided the team to a 25-9 season (most wins in school history) and the second-round of the NCAA Tournament. Following the season, Jeremiah was recognized with both District 8 and Big West coach-of-the-year honors.

She also was the recipient of the Carol Eckman Award, given by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association to the coach who best represents sportsmanship and ethics in the coaching profession. Jeremiah finished her 23-year coaching career with a 375-236 record.

She has a Ph.D. and a master's degree in physical education from The Ohio State University, as well as undergraduate degrees from Cedarville College and Central State University.


