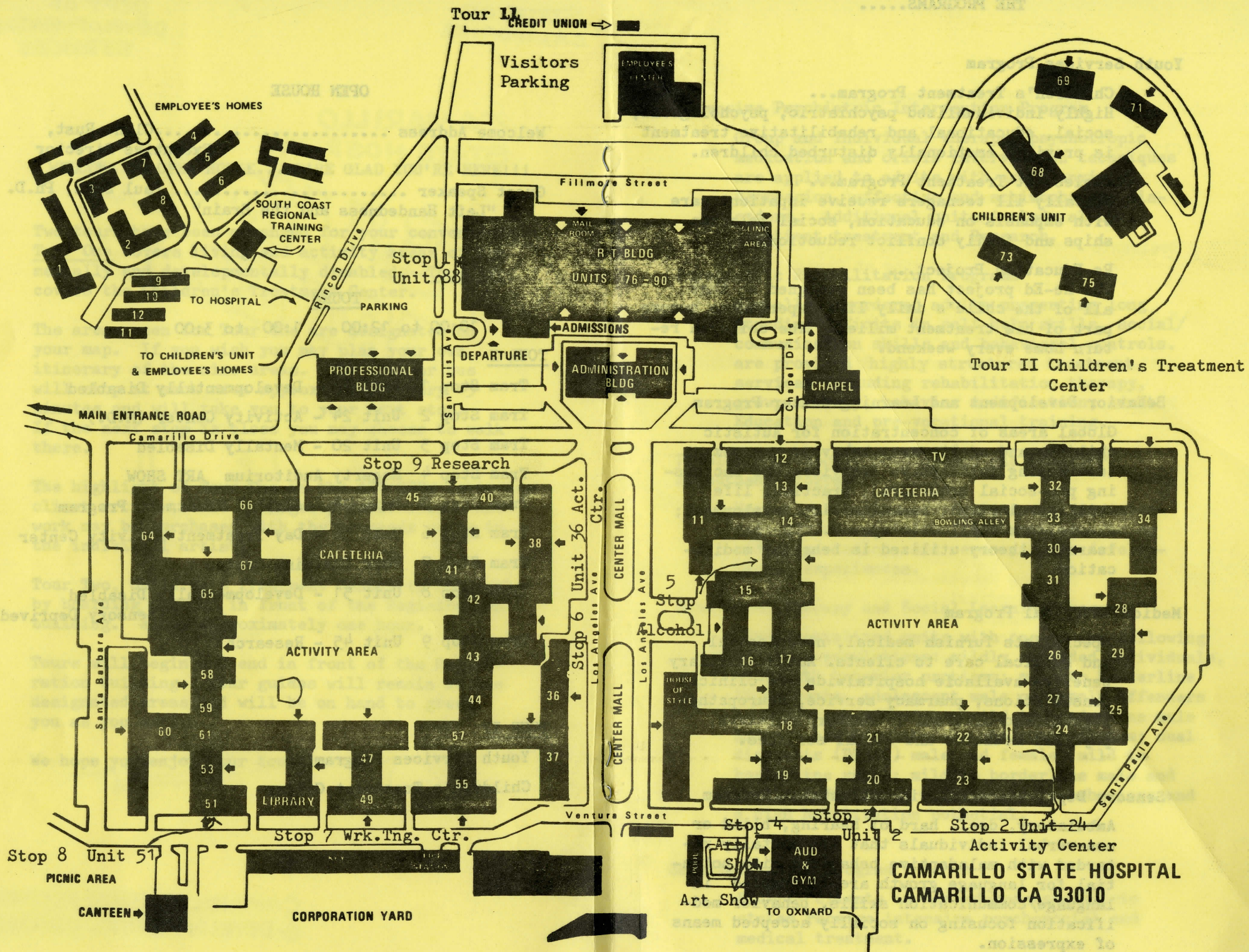

## THE PROGRAMS.....

### Youth Services Program

#### Children's Treatment Program...

Highly individualized psychiatric, psychological, social, educational and rehabilitative treatment is provided emotionally disturbed children.

#### Adolescent Treatment Program...

Mentally ill teenagers receive inpatient care with emphasis on education, social relationships and family conflict reduction.

#### Re-Education Project...

The Re-Ed project has been designed so that all of the child's daily life experiences become part of his treatment milieu. The children return home every weekend.

### Behavior Development and Learning Center Program

Global areas of concentration for Autistic children and adults are: behavior management (decreasing maladaptive behaviors and increasing pro-social behaviors); practical life skill development; communication development; and leisure skill development. The basic learning theory utilized is behavior modification.

### Medical-Surgical Program

Specialists furnish medical, neurological and surgical care to clients. Among ancillary benefits available hospitalwide are clinical consultations, pharmacy service, neuropathological and clinical laboratory services, physical medicine and dental services.

### Sensory Deprivation/Behavior Adjustment Program

Ambulatory, deaf, hard of hearing, blind or non-verbal individuals that are mentally retarded with maladaptive behaviors with potential for language growth are instructed in language/communication skills, behavior modification focusing on socially accepted means of expression.

### Intensive Psychiatric Intervention Program

Group and individual therapy, psychotropic medication and crisis intervention techniques are applied to adults with acute anxiety, depression, affective and schizophrenic disorders. Additional units include alcohol inpatient treatment and Research.

### Psychiatric Rehabilitation Programs

Mentally disordered adults presenting long standing deficits in self-help skills, social/communication skills and behavioral controls, are provided highly structured treatment services including rehabilitation therapy, group therapy, behavior modification, Adult Education and pre-vocational training.

### Physical and Social Development and Behavior Adjustment Program

Mentally retarded residents are given intensive medical attention, dietary supervision and augmentation, and sensory-motor developmental experiences.

### Behavioral Therapy and Social Learning Program

Five specialized units with one of the following distinct populations: mildly retarded individuals, male with behavior problems; mild to borderline individuals, adolescent male or female offenders or potential offenders; mild to borderline male individuals committed by the court system; dual diagnosis (DD/MD) male and female, mild to borderline range; mild to borderline male and female individuals with no severe behaviors and a high habilitation potential.

### Geropsychiatric Program

Elderly clients in disordered psychiatric states receive intensive psychosocial and medical treatment.



## EXPLANATION OF TERMINOLOGY

- Clients - refers to patients and residents collectively.
- D.D. - Developmentally Disabled. (Older term used was "mentally retarded").
- Residents - refers to developmentally disabled individuals residing at Camarillo State Hospital.
- M.D. - Mentally Disabled. (Older term used was "mentally ill").
- Patients - refers to mentally disabled individuals.
- Programs - refers to Treatment Program. Clients are admitted, diagnosed as to the type, degree or severity of their handicaps and placed in a Treatment Program along with those of similar types, degrees and severities of handicaps. There are usually three to four units or "living areas" per program. Each program is directed by a Program Director, Program Assistant and Nursing Coordinator. Each program has an interdisciplinary team comprised of Psychiatric Technicians, Social Workers, Psychologists, Rehabilitation Therapists (music, occupational or recreation therapy) and physicians.
- Unit - A living unit for clients. The out-dated term most commonly used was "ward".
