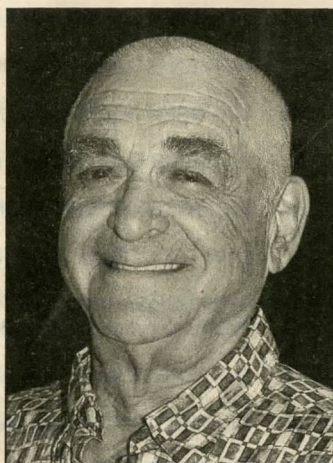

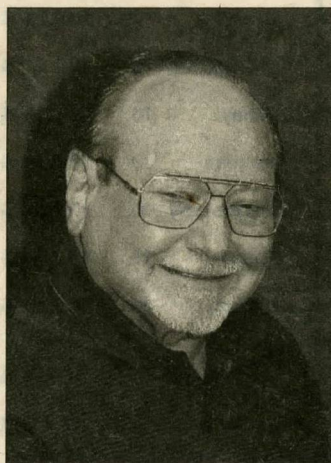


Incumbents, Marquardt elected

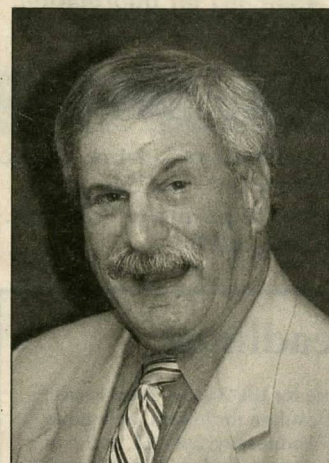
At the annual meeting June 25, Ted Lansing and Gerald Rosen were re-elected to the Board of Directors, and Don Marquardt joined them as the new Board member, replacing Joseph Benti, who chose not to run again. These are the results of the 3,149 votes counted: Ted Lansing, 963; Gerald Rosen, 889; Don Marquardt, 727; Robert O'Connor, 314; Robert Kulick, 245. Al Fox got 9 write-in votes; Hanna Huber and Dick Smaby had one each.

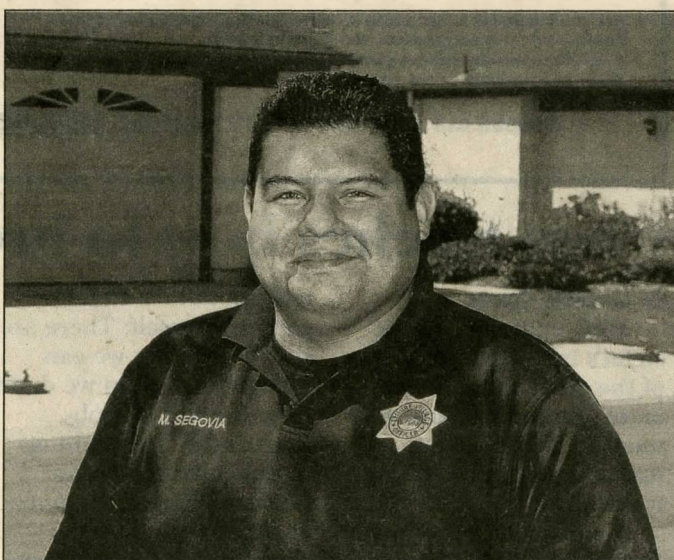
Feeling secure in the Village? Here's why

What price tag would you put on peace of mind? Peace of mind cannot be purchased, but feeling safe and secure in your own home is one of the most important benefits of living at Leisure Village.

And how is this benefit provided? The Leisure Village Homeowners Association monthly fees cover the cost of the Safety and Security Services Department that provides these services.

What are the services provided? The Main Gate to Leisure Village is guarded and manned 24 hours every day. Patrol cars are always patrolling, and they're always only minutes away from responding to any call for emergency assistance. Security officers are trained in first aid, CPR and Automatic External Defibrillation (AED) devices. In fact, the security officers at Leisure Village were

one of the first groups in Ventura County to have AED devices available as part of their lifesaving emergency response.

Although Leisure Village is a private community with private roads, the Board of Directors of

Leisure Village adopted the California Vehicle Code to govern vehicle traffic within the Village. It is the responsibility of the Safety and Security Services Department and the Leisure Village Security Officers to enforce

this code and to enforce, as well, the Leisure Village Association Rules and Regulations.

The feeling of safety and security is easy to take for granted, but the security officers who work every day at Leisure Village to provide these services should never be taken for granted.

One of the finest security officers at Leisure Village is Lt. Manny Segovia, one of the most personable, friendly people you will ever meet. He is second in command at Leisure Village under Commander Jim Moore. He maintains that listening is one of the most important skills that anyone can ever develop. His philosophy is that rules exist primarily to protect everyone, and not to punish anyone.

Segovia is dedicated to Leisure Village and committed to the safety of its

A short sale is when the lender is willing to accept less than the loan amount. The owner owes more on his/her loan than the value of the house, and/or there is a hardship involved, making the monthly mortgage payment not possible.

Although late payments will show on a credit report, after the sale, the mortgage will be reported as paid or negotiated. Short sales are not reported on a credit history. There is no specific reporting item for "short sale." The FICO score will be lowered as little as 50 points if all other pay-

ments are being made.

A short sale's effect can be as brief as 12 to 18 months and does not challenge most security clearances. A homeowner or investor who successfully negotiates and closes a short sale will be eligible for a Fannie Mae-backed investment mortgage after only two years.

In a properly managed short sale, the home is sold at a price that should be close to market value, and in almost all cases, it will be better than a real estate owned (REO) sale, resulting in a lower deficiency. Sales can be advantageous to both homeowners and their lenders.

For more information, your Realtor can assist in listing your house as a short sale and will negotiate with the lender on your behalf.

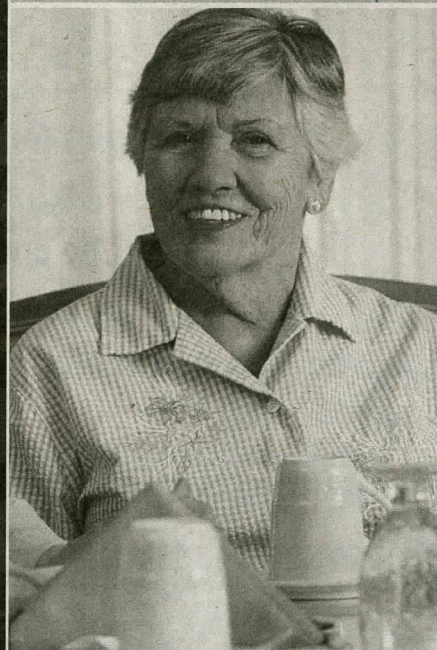

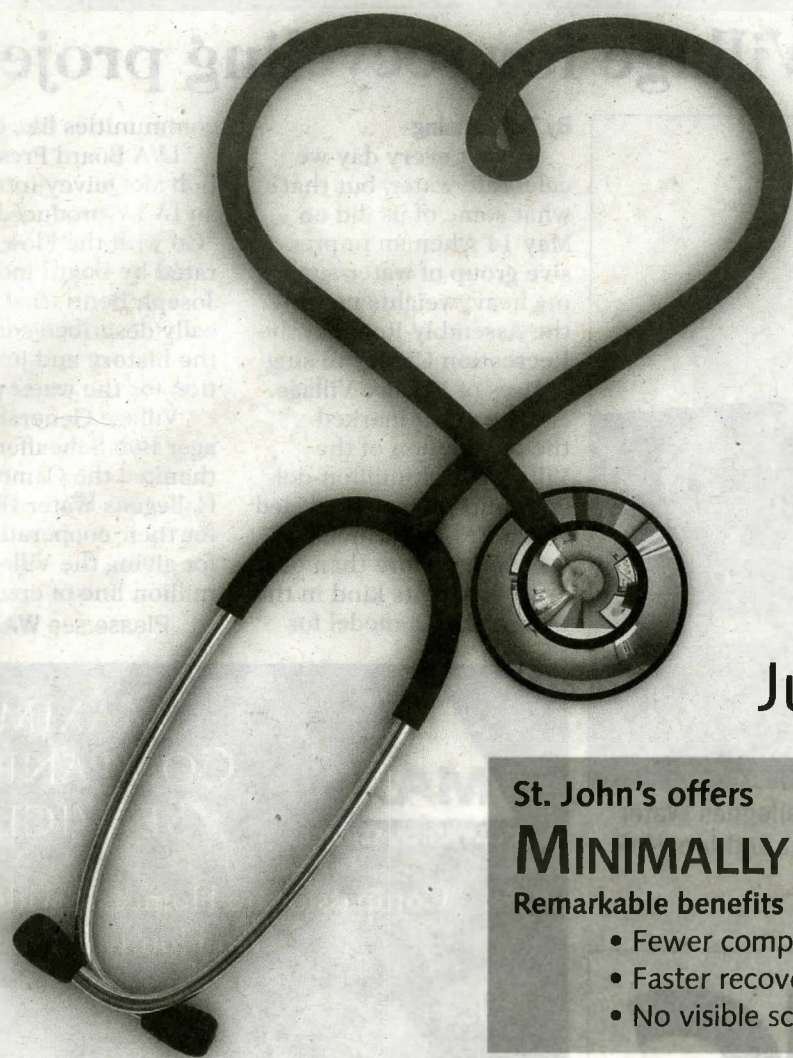

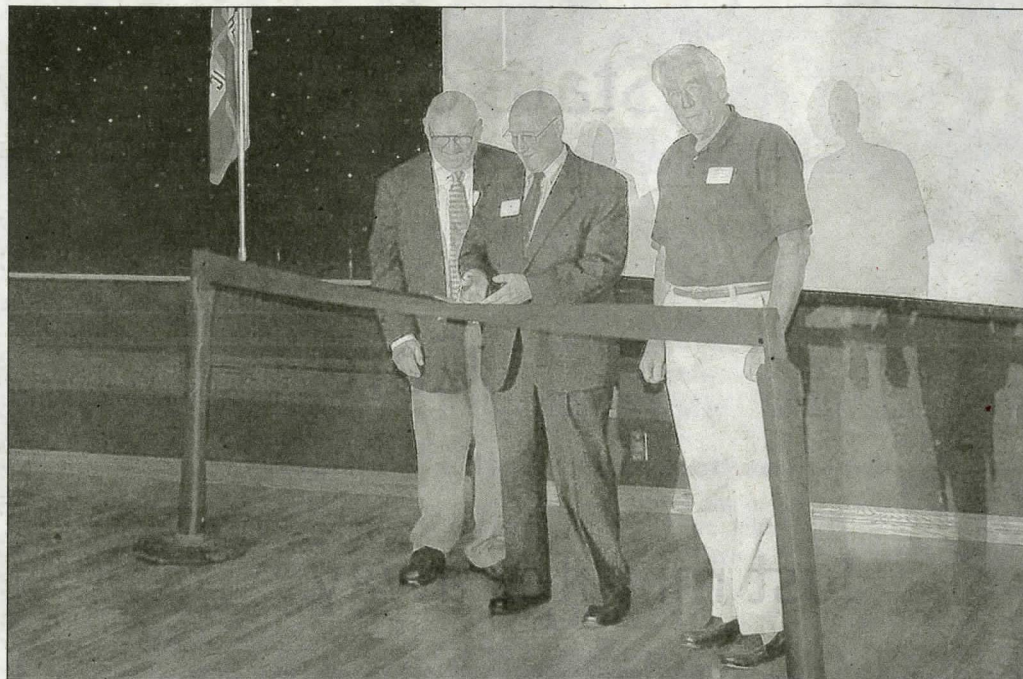

Water officials commend Village for recycling project

It isn't every day we celebrate water, but that's what some of us did on May 14 when an impressive group of water-supplying heavyweights met in the Assembly Room at the Recreation Center to sing praises of Leisure Village.

The event marked the completion of the Village's multimillion-dollar, multi-phased Recycled Water Project, which was referred to more than once as a "first of its kind in the nation" and a model for

communities like ours.

LVA Board President Bob McQuivey introduced an LVTV-produced video, "Go with the Flow," narrated by Board member Joseph Benti, that graphically described some of the history and justification for the water project.

Village General Manager Bob Scheaffer then thanked the Camrosa and Calleguas Water Districts for their cooperation and for giving the Village a \$2 million line of credit to

complete the project. Thanks to excellent performances by a number of those who worked on the project, it appears only \$1.2 million of that money will be needed.

The first guest speaker, Frank Royer, general manager of Camrosa Municipal Water District, was effusive in his remarks, which included some references to current and anticipated future water costs. Mostly, though, he referred to the scarcity of water supplies and the potential for water-use reductions, and, yes, water rationing.

The harsh reality is that despite our dollar savings on the project, we may still face the problem of scarcity, just obtaining the water we need.

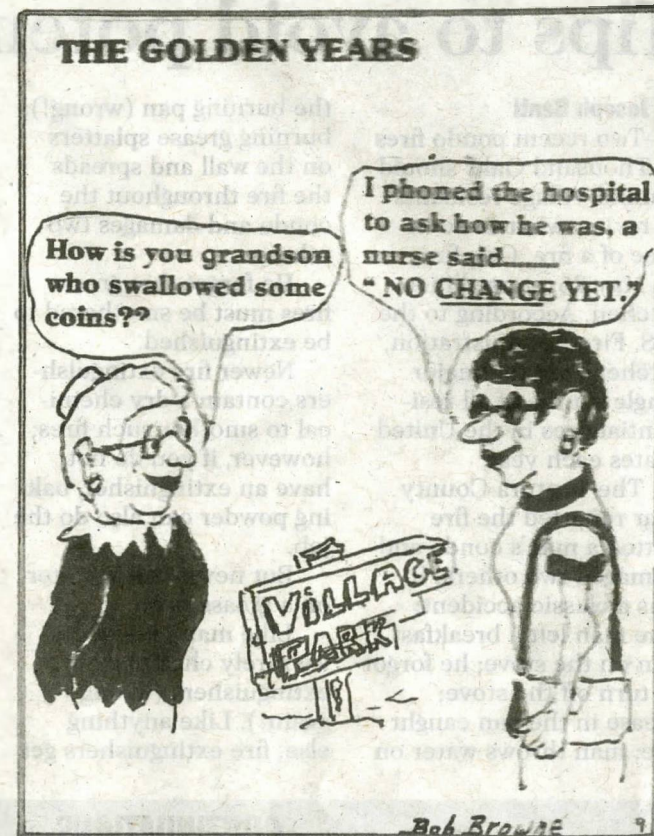
The other speakers included a veteran of the long struggle to achieve the recycled water project, Al Fox, a longtime Village resident and now the president of the Camrosa Water District, and Ted Grandson, president of Calleguas Water District, whose remarks closely paralleled those by Royer. Grandson also presented a Certificate of Appreciation to Leisure Village.

Continuing the most laudatory comments were: Walter Teitz, representative of the Metropolitan Water District; Joyce Taylor, representing County Supervisor Kathy Long; Don Waunch, Mayor of Camarillo (who also presented a Certificate of Recognition from the city); Carol Sweeney-Zimmert, past LVA Board President; Myron (Mike) Shapiro, a

past LVA Board Member and early supporter of the project when it was in the talking stages some 20 years ago and current member of the Village Water Committee; former LVA General Manager Randy Watkins; and Mike Morgan, past mayor and current member of the Camarillo City Council.

Concluding the official celebration, Scheaffer invited Al Fox, Ted Grandson and Bob McQuivey to perform a ceremonial "red ribbon-cutting." Scheaffer then invited all the participants to a lunch at the Pavilion, where the treat was cookies and cake, all appropriately decorated with aqua-colored confectionary water drops.

And, yes, the most popular beverage served was bottled water.

Tips to avoid potentially deadly kitchen fires

Two recent condo fires in Thousand Oaks should remind Village residents to review what to do in case of a fire. One fire, on May 26, started in a kitchen. According to the U.S. Fire Administration, kitchens are the major single source of all residential fires in the United States each year.

The Ventura County Star reported the fire gutted a man's condo and damaged two others. It was a classic accident: The man left a breakfast pan on the stove; he forgot to turn off the stove; grease in the pan caught fire; man throws water on

the burning pan (wrong!); burning grease splatters on the wall and spreads the fire throughout the condo and damages two others.

He forgot that grease fires must be smothered to be extinguished.

Newer fire extinguishers contain a dry chemical to smother such fires; however, if you do not have an extinguisher, baking powder can also do the job.

But never throw water on a grease fire!

Like many residents, we rarely check our fire extinguishers (wrong again!). Like anything else, fire extinguishers get

old and go out of date.

During the June meeting of the Safety and Security Committee, Village Security Chief Jim Moore reminded us that the devices may provide only a false sense of security.

Generally, residential extinguishers are good for about seven years. The Web site of Kidde, the largest manufacturer (www.kidde.com) offers this information: If the needle on the pressure gauge of your fire extinguisher is in the green/full area, and the manufacture date is less than 12 years ago, your fire extinguisher is still good.

Moore advises keeping

extinguishers in a convenient place, not in hard-to-get-to corners, so that in an emergency they are easily accessible.

Moore says, "In no case, should you stay in the house for more than a couple of minutes."

And, he adds, "If you cannot get the fire out or under control, save yourself first."

Moore's bottom line on fire extinguishers is simple: If you don't know how old it is, replace it. Then, using a permanent marker, write the date on the extinguisher when you

replace it. Don't rely on finding a piece of paper or other reminders that we put away and forget.

Of course, if you have a fire emergency, call 911.

Now, check the age and gauge on that fire extinguisher and, while you're at it, make sure the smoke alarms are in working order.

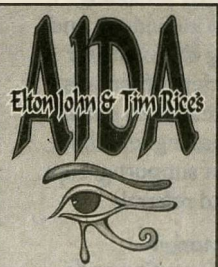

L.V. Bowling League

It's not too early to start thinking about the 2009-2010 mixed bowling league. The league will begin on Friday, Sept. 4. Sign-ups will be on August 7, from 10 a.m. to noon in the MPR. If you did not bowl with us last season, or are new to the league, you must establish an average prior to signing up. If you bowled in any league during the past year, and can provide documentation of your average, that's acceptable. You do need to go to Harley's Camarillo Bowl, located behind the 99-Cent Store, and get an I.D. number. Just tell the person at the desk that you are joining the Leisure Village Bowling League, and they will issue you your I.D. number. We'll need that number when you sign up.

If you have to establish

an average, that's easy too. Start by going to Harley's Camarillo Bowl and getting your I.D. number. This also assures you of getting the Leisure Village rate when you bowl there at any time. Next, you must bowl nine consecutive games, though not all at once, and keep track of your scores. Bring those scores, along with your I.D. number, to the sign-up. We'll use those scores to establish your average and handicap.

How much does it cost? There is a one-time membership fee of \$10, plus \$9 for the first week of bowling, for a total of \$19. It then costs \$9 each week of the season. Part of that weekly fee goes toward the Bowling Banquet and for prize money. Most

bowlers find it easier to pay for a month in advance, the amount due depending on the number of bowling days each month. For instance, if you want to pay for your membership and the four days of bowling in September, bring a check for \$46. If you can't commit to being on a team, but would like to substitute, you just need to pay the \$10 membership fee. Each time you bowl as a sub, the cost will be \$9. Should you bowl at least seven times during the season, you will be eligible for attending the Bowling Banquet and for prize money.

How good do you have to be? Your average must be at least 90. This past
