
## THEY'RE MY FAVORITE BAND...SERIOUSLY.



> Exhibit 4: SSD -**How We Rock**

A band you love making a bad record is kind of like

picking up the phone at your house only to hear your mother already on the line having nasty phone sex; the voice and general tone are the same but the whole experience is disgustingly wrong. At least that's how I felt when I first heard "How We Rock" by SSD. As every other kid that lived within a



hundred mile radius of Boston, I cut my teeth on SSD's first record. It wasn't about looking cool, which was good 'cause at 15 there wasn't a leather jacket spiky enough or mohawk big enough to disguise my teenage awkwardness. And it wasn't about politics like a lot of punk of their day, which was also cool cause at that age my understanding of the world was miniscule and my interest in politics reflected that.

SSD wrote short hardcore songs full of punk aggression and speed, and everyone loved them for it. That's why when I came across a copy of "How We Rock" I was so repulsed. It's 7 tracks of pseudo-metal/rock bullshit that resembles little of their early work. The first track alone ("How We Rock Intro") is almost as long their debut record's entire first side, and contains more poorly played, wanking axe solos than a Jr. High battle of the bands. And it just goes down hill from there. On a side note, I had to search high and low for this record so I could write this review (I hocked my old copy years ago in a rare act of good taste but wanted to make sure I still felt that way before I trashed it in print). I scoured all of Boston, going to tiny record shops I hadn't visited in years, and ended up paying far too much when I did find a copy just so I could tell you people how much this record blows. In the long run the jokes on me; I looked hard and paid dearly for a record that I hated and got rid of 13 years ago just to reaffirm my displeasure in it and put all down on paper in one stinkin' paragraph. Final score count: SSD-2, me-0.


#### STEVEN RONALD "STEVO" JENSEN THE VANDALS 1959 - 2005

We are very sad to note that Stevo Jensen, the original singer for the Vandals, passed away August 20, 2005 on the island of Maui, Hawaii. He was with the group from 1980-1984, and appears on Peace Through Vandalism and When In Rome Do As The Vandals. The consummate showman, his performances rarely if ever left an audience unmoved. With provoking lyrical content (rednecks, cops, James Brady) and an unrestrained smart-ass persona, one was bound to run into both amused fans and angered detractors at the Vandals shows of the era.

"The Vandals of the Stevo years (1980-84) stood for nothing more than having a good time and poking a little fun at such a serious and confusing world. Stevo's Vandals had no dogma, no agenda, no anger, and no greed... Stevo was an inspiration to me and was always our

#### STEVE "SPANKY" BARRIOS CHINA WHITE/CADILLAC TRAMPS 1961 - 2005



Steven Robert Barrios, 44, passed away from heart failure on October 24th in Anaheim, CA. He was born in Long Beach, CA and lived most of his life in the Long Beach/Lakewood area. In the 70's Spanky started playing drums as a young adolescent and soon after joined punk pioneers China White. In the early 90's he joined the Cadillac Tramps, recorded, and toured extensively throughout the US and Canada. Spanky was survived by his son Joshua; brother John; mother Mary Ann; father Rudy; grandmother Mary; and brothers in music the Cadillac Tramps, who participated as pallbearers along with ex-Cadillac Tramps guitarist Jonny "Two Bags" Wickersham (presently with Social Distortion), who snuck away from a national tour to properly say farewell to his beloved friend. Beatz was 31 at the time of his passing. Bass player Nick Ghanbarian was also seriously injured. Members of the band's road crew were hospitalized as well.



I'd like to model something after the 924 GILMAN in Berkeley. Perhaps with a more open door to the other arts, such as theater, paintings, and dance.




We have been following the progress of Bryan's new van, from his purchase on eBay to its final state.

Do GORILLA BISCUITS and CIV fans come to your shop to be tattooed by you?


I guess so, but I like to keep the two separate. I want people to get tattooed because they like my work. If they like the music, that's cool too.

### WITH GORDY & GARY

Here at Eat Me we have a great adoration for beer. Consequently we also have a great love for the type of food that goes best with beer. That would be "Deep Fried." Don't tell me that when ya got half a heater on at the bar hat yer craving fruits and veggies! Hell no. When yer a little buzzed and have domething to work as a sponge and soak up some of booze and anchor a down, it's gonna be something fried. Hush puppies, buffalo wings, fish and chips, taquitos, jalapeno poppers, etc. etc. Working off that scenario we pulled out the deep fryers during Monday Night Football to see what we could have up by halftime. The food came out great but we did step in it a few times and because of that we learned a few things we'd like to hare.

- 1. You don't need a deep fryer to deep fry. Any deep pot, pan or Dutch Oven will work. The point of the deep fryer is that it is specifically designed for the task, e.g.—easier to clean, heats faster, uses a thermostat to regulate temperature.
- 2. Most things fry at 375 degrees. This is an easy one to remember. The problem is that if you are cooking anything with cheese in it you'll need to drop the temp to about 320 otherwise the cheese will boil free of your appetizer. Another hint is to make sure your cheese item is VERY cold prior to dropping in oil.
- 3. Peanut oil rules! Peanut oil has a higher smoke point (meaning that you can get it hotter than most oils before it starts to smoke) and can actually be reused a few times, depending on how dirty you get it each time. The only two drawbacks to peanut oil are that it is a heavier tasting oil than most, and most assuredly one of your friends will refer to it as "penis oil" over and over in an attempt to be witty.

- 4. Deep fryers kinda suck to clean. There is definitely a perk to buying appetizers.
- 5. If your oil gets really dirty and starts to foam, it needs to be replaced. If you fry a piece of bread every now and then it helps to soak up the crap and keep the oil cleaner.
- 6. Most foods, when cooked in oil, float when ready.
- 7. It's really is important to wait a few minutes before eating something directly out of the fryer. We learned this one the hard way.



### INGREDIENTS:

Lots of chicken drumettes and whatever the other part of the

1 c. flour

1 tbsp. granulated or powdered garlic

1 tbsp. onion powder

1 tsp. salt

1 tsp. ground pepper 1 pinch of paprika

### SAUCE:

1 c. chili sauce (I use Sriracha) 1 c. pepper sauce (I use Frank's Red Hot)

1 stick of butter

a pinch of fresh garlic

Preheat deep fryer to 325 degrees F. Rinse thawed chicken wings and drain. Combine all dry ingredients and place in gallon zip-close bag.

Add wings and toss in sealed bag to lightly coat. A thick egg batter like you would use for regular fried chicken is not wanted. The thicker the breading the less crunchy it will be when the sauce soaks in.

Being careful not to overload the fryer, place chicken wings in fryer carefully. It is best to do several small batches instead of one or two med. to large ones.

Cook wings for approx 7 minutes, or until you see them floating in fryer. Always sacrifice one wing and pull it apart to make sure there is no pink and the wing is indeed done. Pour on sauce and serve.

To make sauce, combine all ingredients and heat. Yer stoked.


/hen did you start your "artistic voyage" ?

Where has your work been seen?



### HE GIRL with the CAMERA EYE



### Jenny Lens photographer

Jenny on Jenny

My stories, the underlying text that accompanies every photo, are not what people expect to hear. I did drugs and ran around with people who would scare the shit outta you. I slept with people you'd never expect, but I wasn't a groupie. No I didn't get support from the performers I helped, nor did I get money, appreciation or fame. I didn't feel like I belonged or was accepted, even though my photos were acclaimed and published from early 1976, predating the photographers whose claim to fame was being early on the scene (and showed up at least 2 years after me). Predating Slash Magazine, starting with Back Door Man from the South Bay and my own column in New York Rocker, to continual publication and usage for 29 years. I then hid out for two decades, overwhelmed with the pain of my life and punk damage, wondering if anyone would ever cherish my photos and that time as much as I.

But I did the ONE thing I set out to do: I documented a cultural revolution. I didn't impose my artistic eye, skills, training and education and turn the photos into posed artsy-calculated compositions. I caught people in the moment, in the act, being natural and real. I was passionate, enthusiastic, angry, depressed, energetic, cheery and stubborn. I made mistakes and I was right on more often than not, a visionary who was ridiculed and ignored, but preserved.

I followed my heart and shot far more than punk. This was before hardcore. I am so tired of people asking me for BLACK FLAG. Get over it, hardcore was not the only LA scene. It was NY's PATTI SMITH, RAMONES (1976!), BLONDIE, TELEVISION,

Jan. 27, 1980 - Darby Stitches. In its full frame gory glory. Every time this is published, it's cropped horribly. Why is it so hard for people to use photos in the full frame provided? I shot Darby with his mohawk and spiky hair, but you'd never know it by the way people thoughtlessly crop photos. Hey, he put a lot of time into his hair and I made a point of shooting as full a frame as I could as often as possible.

X, along with the Clash, Ramones and Screamers, were one of my all-time favorite bands. I still prefer their music to anyone, perhaps tying with the Ramones. Depends upon my mood. I have quite a convoluted and long history with them.





Members of Iggy's fan club called me to shoot him. I'd been up for days in my darkroom, had no film, so they picked me up, we bought film, and drove me to his rented Malibu beach house. I have rare shots of him painting huge watercolors, written about in last year's Juxtapoz. This is my favorite shot of him.



DEAD BOYS: Stiv and Cheetah at Starwood, November 3-5 with the Mumps or November 13 with X, 1977.

MINK DE VILLE and DICTATORS. It was England's DAMNED, JAM, PISTOLS, BOOMTOWN RATS, SHAM 69 and THE CLASH. I shot classic CHUCK BERRY and BO DIDDLEY, roots, rockabilly, PETER TOSH in front of 60,000 opening for the STONES and amazing STONES, POLICE, TOM PETTY and CHEAP TRICK. It was the SCREAMERS, X, ALLEY CATS, WEIRDOS, DILS, ZEROS, GERMS AND BAGS. It was the MUMPS opening for VAN HALEN and SPARKS opening for Patti and the TUBES and 999, MAGAZINE, ULTRAVOX, and LEVI AND THE ROCKATS. It was the Masque AND the Starwood, the Whisky, and the Orpheum, Larchmont and Baces Halls. Stop asking if I shot the MISFITS or CIRCLE JERKS or thinking I was part of the 80's scene or any one scene. I'm a girly girl who loves to dance and scream along to the lyrics, often high on diet drugs or acid while wearing my Birkenstocks or Fiorucci's Jellies -- no spiked heels for this gal. I shot tons of parties, backstage where no one else shot, just having fun and capturing the fleeting moments for history. Or as Alice Bag wrote me, regarding my lengthy emails as 'herstory.'

LA from 1976-1980 was, more than any other city or scene, about strong, creative, brilliant (and wild) women. And no female photographer in any city was wilder nor more independent or more educated than I. I had college degrees, a BA in Art from CSUN and a Master in Fine Arts from Cal Arts -- with honors and art exhibits since I was a child but never studied photography. I had a brilliant art career behind and

Friedman!), scan, plan, read the word, advise pricing my photos and eating a portfolio, invite me to shows and ask w I'm doing. They ask me to show at their lleries. They tell me how much they love me d I love them back. Friendship and art: the aff of life.

THE SCREAMES - I rented lights, didn't know how to set them up or use a light meter, just took shots and had a blast. Don't know why I only did this once. The shots are terrific, very German Expressionistic/film noir, which of course was my intention (all those years of studying art history and movies is what inspired me to pick up my camera in the first place. I was too shy to take up offers or ask to shoot groups. I love that I also documented their infamous home, the Wilton Hilton.



Johnny Rotten (SEX PISTOLS) and Joan Jett (RUNAWAYS) in Whisky booth, mid-January, 1978. The Pistols imploded after their San Francisco show, January 14, 1978 and headed for LA. Johnny and Steve Jones, from Jonesy's Jukebox, Indie 103.1, continue to live on LA's west side. From the moment I met Joan in early 1977, I thought of her as a female Johnny Rotten in terms of individuality. I love this shot cos they both have the same sullen, won't look at me attitude. I love it when people strike the same pose naturally. A moment wherein they both reacted identically. Synchronicity.







Really important note: I was one of the FIRST to ever photograph the GERMS, which I did quite often throughout 1977 up to 1980. We hung out at the same parties and shows, so I have many offstage casual shots of them, together or separately. I was very close to some of Darby's "boys" as Pat as called them. We shot speed together in 1979 and 1980. I just never made a big deal outta my relationship with the GERMS, but I have many rare shots of them.



GERMS - Darby Crash, aka Bobby Pyn, performing at the legendary Masque, November 23, 1977. This shot graced the two page spread opening for Don Waller's report on the Masque, in MOJO, July 2004. The GERMS were just starting out, and Darby could be himself at the Masque. We all could be whoever we wanted to be at the Masque and only those in the know were there. Ironically most of us thought we were outsiders. Darby loved performing his early Iggy riff/homage and cut himself, probably with a broken beer bottle.


I fought and struggled to take these pix cos I knew this was a cultural revolution. I studied art and movie history since I was a child, got art degrees, had my nose constantly in a book or at an art gallery or was listening to the radio when it rocked (nothing beat the '60's for the radio), lived through the British Invasion (saw the BEATLES at the Hollywood Bowl) and Summer Of Love. I knew this would hit hard and be short. And I told everyone--publicists and writers, fans and performers--alienating most because of my passion and visions.



PATTI SMITH - Many of us were turned onto punk because of Patti's "Jesus died for somebody's sins, but not mine . . . they belong to me!" Then came the RAMONES! Photos seen in "Patti Smith Complete"," Back of "Babel," "DIY" and elsewhere (but Patti credits them to "Jenny Stern," my pre-punk, pre-1977 name). Snuck camera into San Diego venue, November 11, 1976 and was only allowed to take a few shots before being caught. Then developed them incorrectly in the darkroom, hence the glowing quality.



THE CLASH - March 19, 1980 Santa Monica Civic Auditorium. The best live band EVER. Loved them and followed them around California and England.






He told he liked being around me cos I "was normal and had no problems," wh literally stopped me in my tracks. If he only knew! His NY girlfriend hut heroin in his coffee so he couldn't go on tour. Ouch! After a couple years, he changed and I stopped seeing them perform.

Jenny is working 24/7 on her punk archive and needs help! Whether organizing, labeling, scanning slides and negs, or with databases to compile not only photo info, but tons of mags and tear sheets, to spreading the word, marketing, PR, she can't do it alone. She needs to raise money to keep this going or it's lost forever. She's working on a documentary based on her photos, several book offers, exhibitions and needs grants and legal assistance because she's still being ripped off. You can work with her directly or via the net. She can offer college internships and training for people, as well as low-cost prints. Plus, hearing stories and seeing photos no one has seen nor heard.

Having been aware of the Power to the Peaceful Festival ((www.powertothepeaceful.org) for the last few years, to have Michael Franti call us up to be a part of it was an amazing experience.

The theme of this year's event was "Bring The Troops Home Now!" During this time we were privy to two amazing speakers: One a world-renowned activist, the other a cast member from the television show "CHEERS"! (Crazy, I know).

Woody Harrelson spoke first. By reciting a number of Marijuana-related jokes, he had the audience in the palm of his hand. You could tell that






#### All my friends stopped listening to punk rock and started listening to hardcore like Avenged Sevenfold, what is up with that?



Crossover is still the worst thing to happen to punk in its history. Punk should be metal-free.


