A strong cast, experienced in both professional and amateur productions, has been selected for the San Jose Light Opera Association of CARNIVAL, to be presented at San Jose Civic Auditorium May 7, 8 and 9 and 14, 15 and 16.

Jeanette Putnam, a teacher at Herbert Hoover High School, who has played in Off-Broadway productions as well as Summer Stock, will play the lead role of Lilli, the young girl from the small town who is thrown into carnival life. This is the role played on Broadway by Anna Marie Alberghetti.

In various Summer Stock productions, Miss Putnam has played Julie in CAROUSEL, Princess Margaret in STUDENT PRINCE, Fiona in BRIGA – DOON and Mary in THE DRUNKARD. In the long-running Off Broadway show, LITTLE MARY SUNSHINE the red-haired soprano understudied the lead while playing various roles.

As Lilli, Miss Putnam will sing the melodious LOVE MAKES THE WORLD GO 'ROUND, and the poignant MIRA, among others.

Adrienne Barbeau, an 18-year-old black-haired beauty who had Maria in WEST SIDE STORY, Mei Li in FLOWER DRUM SONG and Tuptin in THE KING AND I, will fill the role of Rosalie. Miss Barbeau also has toured the Orient with the Showtime on Broadway company.





LOS DE ABAJO, 1964

There is an old corrido, perhaps well known to the viejos among us, called LAS ESPERANZAS DE LA PATRIA POR LA RENDICION DE VILLA. It is a strange song. Katherine A. Porter has called the raza "a race of singing people used to sorrowful beginnings and tragic endings."

The corrido in question illustrates this quality exactly - but with a good deal of unintentional irony. For once, at least, the ballad is not about conventional lost loves or early death. Instead, its very title grasps toward something all too frequently absent from Mexican life: ESPERANZA. And this is the very irony:

Pancho Villa se rindio en la ciudad de Torreon ya se canso de pelear, se va a sembrar algodon.

In 1923 Pancho Villa was assassinated by a savage hail of bullets on the dusty streets of Parral, Chihuahua. Also in 1923, almost sixty-four thousand Mexicans crossed the border into the United States — a record number exceeded only in the next two decades by the 89,000 that poured across in 1924. In either case, little cotton was planted by Mexican hands.

Besides Villa's bloody body on the streets of Parral lay the butchered hopes of the impoverished raza for a prosperous, sovereign and just nation in the name of the people. The sorrowful, tragic end. Or so it seemed.

In 1952 during the cotton-picking season, a movie came to my hometown, in the San Joaquin Valley, called "Viva Zapata!" Weeks before, the owners of the movie house had plastered the sidewalk in front of their rundown show with a huge advertisement properly belonging to a thirty foot billboard. The words "Viva Zapata!" thus scanned the entire width of the sidewalk and screamed their message to all pedestrians. During these weeks it became a practice

for the kids in school to run down to show immediately after school to look at the sign.

We would walk all over it, looking at the pictures of Marlon Brando as Zapata, looking up and down the street, and earnestly feeling more important surrounding by so much publicity. The truth was that none of us knew why the movie was so important. We had heard of Pancho Villa, but this Emiliano Zapata was a real mystery. Did he really ever exist?

Pancho Villa and Emiliano Zapata are names totally absent from the roll call of American history. The young Mexican-American student will learn nothing about them in his school, and should he ever mention Villa – whose name still drifts on the winds of popular legend – should he ever mention Pancho Villa, he will be ridiculed. Even among the raza, the name is no longer as blood-stirring it used to be. For many it is even a cause for embarrassment. More and more, Villa seems a crude revolutionary clown better left forgotten. So does Emiliano Zapata, though his position is not as bad as Villa's – yet.

Zapata, the greatest agrarian leader Mexico has produced, is at least acceptable to the gringos. He has provided as good dramatic role for Marlon Brando and this makes him perfectly respectable, for the meantime. Someday he too will go the way of Pancho Villa. When the celluloid frames of "Viva Capata!" rot and turn to dust, the great caudillo will only be one more Spanish name too difficult to pronounce; only one more obscure Mexican little remembered because little understood. This is the backside of the tragedy of our people. We were ignorant of the real issues of the Revolution of 1910, and we remain ignorant now. Time and distance have compounded the tragedy: we have ceased to sing our sorrows.

- A Are you kidding? Just the sound of my name and they get goose pimples. And besides, they might serve refried beans and corn tortillas and I might as well eat them here at my home at least here I have chile sauce. Come to think of it I might attend but I'd take along my bodyguards.
- Q Is it true that some of the officers get free paid vacations to Mexico from the Honorifica treasury?

The purpose of the Council is to screen, recommend, endorse and actively support primarily American citizens of Mexican ancestry for appointive and elective offices in the City of San Jose, The County of Santa Clara and the State of California.

The participating organizations in the council are the Political Education Group (PEG), the Mexican American Citizens Committee and the Mexican Chamber of Commerce. The Mexican American Political Association (MAPA) are now considering membership in the council and indications are that they will join.

An organization of this type has been a long time coming and it should be effective in its aims, especially in recommending qualified citizens of Mexican ancestry to appointive positions on city and county boards and commissions.

MEXICAN AMERICANS FOR ALAN CRANSTON

Alan Cranston, the State Controller, and candidate for the U.S. Senate, is using Mexican Americans in great numbers in his campaign. Isais Aguilera is serving as a paid member of his staff at his campaign headquarters in San Jose and Ignacio Galindo has been named co-Chairman of the County Committee for Cranston. What is significant is that Mexican Americans are participating at the policy making level and it is happening throughout California. No candidates in the past have asked M-A's to participate so meaningfully which shows that we are making political progress.
