

## Neighbors Disagree About a Tree in Their Village

The center of the controversy is named Podocarpus, a healthy 35-year-old evergreen tree growing in a common area of Village 40. On one side of the debate are nearby neighbors of the tree who asked the Leisure Village Landscape Department to remove it because they contend its droppings are dangerous. On the other side are Villagers who

have mounted a campaign to save the Podocarpus, which they describe as a "magnificent" anchor for much of that Village.

The argument began when Village landscapers tagged the tree for removal because the homeowners living nearest to it complained that its droppings had caused a resident to fall. When neighbors learned responded with a petition and comments to Board Members asking that the tree be preserved.

Plant journals describe Podocarpus as a "premium" tree that can grow to 35 feet and requires a minimum of care. Its droppings are seasonal, not year-round. The pods are generally the size of olives; they fall or are picked off the tree by birds, which can release the seed inside.

The tree's advocates argue that a broom or blower can quickly remove

of the upcoming removal, they the pods in Village 40 in between regular Village edging and mowing. They point to other Podocarpus trees - outside the Recreation Center and along four city blocks in Santa Barbara - that have never been labeled as dangerous. Proponents for saving the tree cite the shade it provides to several Village 40 homes, its beauty across the cul-de-sac, and the barren look after, if it were removed.

> A decision from the Board of Directors about the future of the Village 40 tree could come at the February meeting.

and the ability to design and implement corporate and community programs. She spent several years specializing in urban transit plans for Orange and Los Angeles Counties. All the while, she raised her three children and maintained a business as a hairdresser. "The smorgasbord of life always appeals to me. I guess I'm an overachiever," Rita laughs.

It was a visit to a friend who lived in Camarillo that led Rita and Martin to decide to move to Leisure Village. "We loved how it looked," she recalls. "I was still working in LA and could take the train to the office." That was 2006, and it didn't take Rita long to join Leisure Village life.

## **LV Townhall Budget Meeting for 2019**

LV's proposed 2019-2020 Budget was explained to homeowners by Treasurer George Jones last month at a Town Hall meeting. Highlights of that presentation are:

Operating expenses budgeted for next year total \$11, 672.551.

Reserve funding is projected at \$1,440,000.

Total funds required to balance the budget are \$13,313,551. Current assessments, plus other income, plus the rollover of unused funds from this year's budget total \$13,073,988.

The shortfall of \$238,563 will require a homeowner's assessment increase of 1.900%.

The Board of Directors will vote on the proposed budget at the February Open Board Meeting on February 4. Copies of the approved budget will be mailed to homeowners at the end of February.

## The Tao of the Brush

"Painting is easy when you don't know how," said Edgar Degas, "but very difficult when you do." Leisure Village Arts Club provides entree to the easy part.

Patti Crichton, a vice president and seven-year member of the 70-member Village Arts club, is always on the lookout for a budding Degas.

When we met recently at a Friday afternoon studio work session in the Recreation Center Lanai Room, she was actively palavering with a new member-prospect and artist, to provide a demonstration and perhaps conduct a class for budding and experienced Village artists.

Crichton said VA club members gather in the Multi-Purpose Room at 1:00 p.m. on the first Wednesday of each month to conduct a brief business session followed by an education, instructional or informative program conducted by one of a growing roster of demonstrators/ artists; some from outside the village gates and some knowledgeable sources from within VA's own ranks.

A program can focus on, "a demonstration of water color, acrylics or maybe a film about an artist." Crichton said. And club members can get together to work on their projects any Monday and Friday afternoon from 1:00 p.m. to about 3:00 p.m. in the Lanai room.

Crichton said new members are always welcome, even those without prior painting experience. "We have all the supplies and equipment needed to get started. Easels, pallets, paper, paint, brushes are all available for use by members," Crichton said, and "All levels of artists are welcome".

Anyone can drop in during Monday and Friday afternoon sessions and test out the visual arts -- to find out if painting is right for them -- first, before deciding to join the club




or not, and without first investing in equipment and supplies.

## Deciduous Season in the Village

Leisure Village has an expansive cornucopia of trees and plant types. February is a month when living flora seasonal expressions can intermix and even amaze. Deciduous trees naturally shed their foliage and rest. The Village has many deciduous species to view and admire. Camarillo is blessed with one of the most desirable climate zones on Earth. Besides people enjoying our climate, many diverse plant categories also thrive, with added irrigation.

Unlike many global climate regions projecting four distinct plant growing seasons, Camarillo technically has just two main climateseasons during the 12 months.

1) A short rainy mild, cool-season that typically lasts from late October thru March, when most deciduous plants, for a time, defoliate and take a needed rest. Native wildflowers, grasses and chaparral then spring forth; our hills are green again.

2) Then, typically the dry spring season begins in April, transitions into May Gray & June Gloom conditions, transforming into a July Fry, followed by a long, toasty summer dry spell from August thru October.


This article explores horticulture aspects to look for and what one might encounter during the Village's February winter resting flora interlude. Both fall foliage and spring flowering can occur side-by-side. Our highly variable weather often confuses both humans and nature alike.

Locally, the winter deciduous season is triggered as the autumn fall season is set in motion. Many species of herbaceous perennial plants (like bulbs), shrubs (like roses) and most notably trees, begin a natural, expected defoliation transition leaf drop. This is when cool-season pruning is done.

Mediterranean-climate, native California plants often begin their resting-season in late summer or early autumn, as they cope with parched, dry weather conditions. Indigenous plants need to be tough and adapt to drought and extended dry spells. This becomes wildfire weather. As world climates seem to be rapidly changing, more extreme climate conditions are becoming a challenge for both humans and nature to adapt to.

Leisure Village is a contrived oasis microclimate because it has available to it what nature does not supply in late spring thru autumn, available water. The Village is blessed with a reclaimed urban water system that provides summer oasis irrigation water. In the dry season, compare the lushness of the Leisure Village in juxtaposition to the wild dehydrated hibernating appearance of the Conejo Grade landscape.

Some Village deciduous trees that have recently defoliated or are still in a colorful "fall" mode, or

are even beginning to break out of dormancy and beginning to bloom and exhibiting leafing-out.

Enjoy the almost botanic garden setting of Leisure Village landscape. February is a month to take in an array of botanical transitions and natural succession.

tion Program and many other services.


A recent focus of the District is working with, and providing resources for, people living with dementia and their families and caregivers. With the Village population of older people, a variety of medical conditions arise of which dementia and Alzheimer's disease are included. The variations in behavior brought on by these conditions demand knowledge and expertise of family and caregivers. Compassion is very important in dealing with a person afflicted with these issues. The District has specific programs designed to assist caregiver support, including REACH, which stands for Resources Enhancing Alzheimer's Caregiver Health. In addition to REACH, the District provides a variety of other resources for those caring for dementia/ Alzheimer's patients.

We here in the Village have an abundance of programs to entertain us and provides us exercise, but occasionally we are struck with physical and mental issues that require medical attention. The District offers a wide variety of classes and programs to assist us in dealing with those problems, and they include: Safety and First Aid; Family Caregivers; Screenings; Fitness; Evidence-Based Programs; Mindfulness; Body, Mind and Strength; Nutrition, and Advocacy. In addition, the District offers door-to-door non-emergency transportation services for a minimal cost, and an Adult Day Center for individuals to socialize outside of the home. The District also has a presence here in the Village on Mondays from 9:30 to 11:00 a.m. in the Lanai Room to provide caregiver support to residents.

The Camarillo Health Care District has a wide variety of programs that benefit the city and county. We Villagers should remember this valuable organization when we need a little extra assistance.
