The faculty exchange programs offered through the university allow you to do all of these things. Most importantly, you can experience the diversity of our country and its educational system and try something new while keeping your anchor at home. How? Apply for one of the exchange programs described below.

The National Faculty Exchange

The National Faculty Exchange (NFE) offers a unique opportunity to work in a new environment at exchange campuses throughout the Nation. In addition to offering faculty a chance to teach or develop new courses, the program offers opportunities of exchange to administrators and staff as well. Participants may examine different approaches to problem solving, observe new technologies, interact with new student populations, observe varied administrative settings, and experience different programs, curricula, educational philosophies, and services. CSUB has been participating in this exchange program for over five years, and former participants highly evaluate their experiences.

This year our exchange participant is Ms. Patricia Knox, of the Nursing Department, who is on exchange from Southern Oregon College. She will be exchanging ideas with new colleagues and will be able to experience different programs, curricula, and educational philosophies. Our past participants have expressed complete satisfaction with the program and have returned home refreshed with vigor and new ideas. Why not check out the program? The Faculty Exchange Center

The Faculty Exchange Center (FEC) has a concept similar to the National Faculty Exchange and facilitates the movement of professional persons in education. The FEC makes it possible for interested professors to exchange positions with colleagues from institutions in both North America and overseas. The FEC publishes a directory containing instructors' names, their institutions, ranks, and fields of specialization. Members match themselves with one or more colleagues and initiate correspondence to work out details of the exchange.
