Changes Coming to LV's Garbage Collection System

That headline alone evokes dozens of guestions. Why does it need to be changed? Whose can is it anyway? Where can I store new can replacements? What if we aren't able to pull the can out to the curb? What happens to the 2136 holes in the ground?

The answers to these and other related queries are not easy, nor answered yet in some cases, and may not be finalized as long as all concerns are focused on dealing with COVID-19.

However, some conversations between E.J. Harrison, the waste management company for all of Camarillo, and Leisure Village representatives occurred before the pandemic began. So, some Garbage pick-up rules changing. information about possible changes is available.

It seems clear that Village garbage collection will be different in the future. Driving that

automated barrels can be emptied from the curb by driver control inside the cab. He adds that accommodations would be necessary for residents who could not roll out the barrels themselves.

A concern for Leisure Village is storage for those roll-out barrels. In garages? On patios? In red stake gardens? Harrison has suggested the smaller 32-gallon barrels. But the question of where to store them is complicated. Rick Wilkman, Co-Chair of the Village Architectural Committee, says the group has begun to look for answers, including building shelters or creating concrete pads outside for them, recognizing that one-car garages often won't have room.

Many questions must be answered in any new agreement between Harrison and Camarillo. One will be answered inside Leisure Village beginning June 1st. Harrison will no longer pick up trash bags of green waste left outside the trash can for free. The new charge

The Helping Hands of Leisure Village

People who live here learn quickly about the warmth and neighborliness of Villagers. However, the giving nature, hard work, and personal outreach from so many of our neighbors during the first three months of the COVID-19 Pandemic have been extraordinary. Look at this scoreboard of contributions from Leisure Village's helping hands thus far:

Handmade Masks: more than 2790

Plastic Gowns: 42

Two-way Patient Monitors: 16 Cash Donations: \$1000 (so far)

Members of the Women's Club started the outreach. "We began to hear that some of our neighbors didn't have masks," Shearon Millar recalls. "We wanted every Villager to have at least one. So, several women who liked to sew quickly stitched up some. And a wave began." Shearon laughs as she admits that in the first weeks that wave kept the volunteers busy eight to ten hours a day, creating the masks, collecting the finished products and distributing them to LV residents as

well as to locations around the county such as the County Rescue Mission, the Angel of God Hospice, local hospitals, and nursing homes.

Villager Phyllis Angers was in that first wave. "I'm a sewer. When I heard that neighbors didn't have masks, I got busy," she says. And that's not the half of it. Through the middle of May, Phyllis has made 420 double-lined masks – not bad for a 90-year-old retired nurse who says she actually wore out one of her sewing machines on this project. "I'm kind of fussy," she laughs. "I am committed to keeping the virus out."

It didn't take long for others to join the Covid-19 attack. Susan Rockwell fired up her sewing machine to make 637 masks by mid-May. Mamata Kalle sewed more than 250 protectors for Villagers, and she spread the word to all those in the Bone Builders and duplicate bridge groups. Her husband Hemu Kalle and Sandy Jacobs answered the need of the Healthcare Foundation of Ventura County and learned to make personal protective plastic gowns. "We make them out of large garbage bags; we've made 42 for the healthcare workers," Hemu explains, "And they tell us they need more."



"People just knock on our doors and hand us cash," says Shearon, "They say not for a mask for themselves, rather for masks for other people. So far, we've collected more than \$1000."



Spam Calls - Online Safety for Seniors

■ Take Control of Those Pesky Robocalls

Hardly a day goes by in which I am targeted by an avalanche of robocalls. These annoying intrusions are non-stop and cause us to feel helpless. According to YouMail, which provides call blocking services, there were 58.5 billion robocalls in the U.S. in 2019. Forty-four percent of these calls were illegitimate. Can we actually take control of the influx of these fake calls?

First, we need to understand what are robocalls. An AARP article on this problem states, "Illegal robocalls include telemarketing spam (automated sales calls from companies you haven't authorized to contact you) and attempts at outright theft. Prerecorded messages dangle goodies like all-expenses-paid travel or demand payment for nonexistent debts to get you to send money or give up sensitive personal data."


Next, understand the key to any "successful robocall" is to get you to answer the phone. Robocall scammers will use ID spoofing to hide their location, tricking you into thinking you are receiving a call from a legitimate or local number. One study shows 59% of people will pick

up these calls if they see it has been placed from a similar area code. Once you pick up the call, the scammer on the other end of the line assumes you are all ears. Now you have provided these crooks exactly what they want: a real person on the line and the knowledge that their repeated attempts to verify your number have paid off.

Finally, recognize that awful robotic voice will say anything to keep you on the line. They will lie about who they represent: the utility company or a federal agency like Social Security. They will say anything to get you to give them your personal data, credit card information or social security number. Here is the real shocker: these calls will tell you to press a particular key to learn more, or to get off a call list. By trying to get off that call list, you have actually put yourself on the list!

In further articles I will share additional steps to take to reclaim your telephone privacy. For now, I advise you not to engage these calls. Ignore them. Hang up on them if you mistakenly answer their call.

Don't forget that some robocalls are legitimate. I will receive robocalls from my dentist reminding me of a dental appointment. Be on guard against the fake calls.



Cryptograms





Protect Yourself From Online Scams Prevalent In Today's World

During this difficult and uncertain time, many people are unsure where to turn for information. Add to that the fact that nearly everyone is working remotely online, and the landscape has become ripe for online scams and fraud. We want to share with you some of the scams to watch out for, as well as specific things you can do to make it less likely you'll be tripped up by calls, text messages, or emails from scammers trying to steal your money or personal information.

Mortgage Forbearance Scams

Mortgage, forbearance, and loan modification scams increased over 2000% in the first month of the stay-at-home orders. The Ventura D.A. put out a warning about these scams and we have a link to it on our website. Here are the key points:

- Never pay any person or business for mortgage or forbearance assistance, including the negotiation of a new, lower mortgage payment. It is unlawful for any entity to charge an advance fee to negotiate on a borrower's behalf with a lender. Borrowers should contact their lender directly to discuss forbearance options, and never go through a third party.
- Never sign a deed that transfers any portion of home ownership to another person or entity as part of a mortgage assistance or forbearance scheme.
- Never make any portion of a mortgage payment to anyone other than your lender.
- Never stop making mortgage payments to your lender on the advice of a mortgage or forbearance "expert."
- Homeowners struggling to pay their mortgage payment should contact their lender directly to learn what assistance programs may be available.

Things to do that increase your protection from current fraud schemes

- Beware of ads, emails and other communications offering COVID testing kits, COVID vaccines, or other types of medical help relating to COVID 19.
- Contact tracing scams: If you get a text claiming you were exposed, and the message contains a link to click on to learn more, DO NOT CLICK it, delete it immediately! The FTC has issued a warning about these scams and assures that messages from local health departments will **not** include links whatsoever. We have more details about this on our website.
- Don't respond to texts, emails or calls about checks from the government.
- Hang up on robocalls
- Beware of emails claiming to be from the CDC or WHO
- Do not make donations in the form of gift cards, cash or by wiring money.

OVERARCHING PRINCIPLES TO REMEMBER

- > Legitimate help does not come to you in the mail, over the phone, or by knocking on your door.
- > Legitimate help is sought out.
- > People struggling financially should vet any solutuions with their family and legitimate assistance programs.
