VERY IMPORTANT INFORMATION

As you know, Admiral John E. Clark, Commander, Pacific Missile Range, although with considerable inconvenience to himself and his staff, has been most generous in inviting the public to the Naval Air Station on the occasion of the visit of the President. To show our appreciation to the Admiral, you may wish to give careful attention to the following suggestions:

*It is requested that you arrive no later than 9:30.

You will readily understand the safety and security problems created by the thousands who will be aboard the Station during the visit.

*You are asked to enter the Base through one of the main gates and proceed to the area of the speaker's platform as directed by Security.

*The enclosed VIP identification badges are not transferable. They must be worn at all times when aboard the Station and will aid the Security forces to quickly screen and pass you to your reserved parking and seating accommodations.

*The enclosed automobile identification must be placed on the lower right inside corner of your windshield.


*Of course, you appreciate seating arrangements are somewhat difficult and the plan that will be followed will be that the VIPs will be seated in the sequence of their arrival. Time of arrival alone will determine the precise seat location.

*While there will be thousands of school children there, it is necessary to limit seating to adults only in the VIP reserved section.

Because of the briefness of the visit, there will be no military review or honors rendered. A single Armed Forces band has been selected for the occasion.

The President will arrive by helicopter from the USS KITTY HAWK at 10:05 and proceed directly to the speaker's stand. The President will depart the station by jet at 10:30 for the Naval Ordnance Test Station, China Lake.

It is of particular significance that it has been more than thirty years since a President has visited Ventura County. It is hoped that Friday morning will be a bright, sunny one!
