

REDUCED PREMIUMS - CSEA Members in the California-Western/Occidental Group term life plans as of August, 1970, will receive a twenty-one percent, 12-month premium discount because of accumulated reserve funds. CWO has confirmed the current reserve build up totals about \$1 million. The reduction will apply only to the employee's premium and began with the January 31 payroll deduction period for State College employees. The reduction should be evident in the employee's code 10 deduction.
