10. INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMS RESIDENT DIRECTORS FOR 1981-82. Applications are invited for assignment as Resident Directors of the overseas study centers of the International Programs of the California State University and Colleges for 1981-82. Appointments are made a year in advance so that those selected will have adequate time to plan for a year overseas.

The positions of Resident Director for Germany and Sweden are 12-month appointments. All others are for an academic year. Part-time (1/5) appointments are made for Israel, Japan and the United Kingdom.

The deadline for submission of applications is December 15, 1979. Applicants selected for interview will be contacted shortly after February 1, 1980, and all applicants will be notified of the final selections not later than May 1, 1980.
