David Lustig shares an interesting and adventurous life with us

As a writer of profiles of our Villagers, I never cease to be surprised at the number of us who have lived very interesting lives, but who, all too often, hide their light under a bushel. David Lustig is one such

He was born in Manhattan, then his family moved to Levittown on Long Island, NY where they lived until David was 7 years old. His father was a music editor & composer in the motion picture industry, so it was not surprising when his family moved to southern California. David grew up in Van Nuys when there were no freeways & many walnut groves.

After completing high school, David attended CSUN to study for a Bachelor of Arts degree in Journalism & History. However, he grew bored after a few months and decided to quit. Next up was a 4 year stint in the Air Force where he worked as a radar operator. Among other things, this job entailed directing fighter planes to their targets. After his service, the GI Bill offered ex-service personnel \$160 a month if they were enrolled students in an approved institution. David had been working as a box boy in the grocery business, so returning to his studies at CSUN (and being paid for it) was quite attractive. To augment that \$160 per month, he wrote freelance articles for business & electronics magazines.

David's work as a journalist & photographer has allowed him to see what everyone else does for a living. He has done ride-alongs with law enforcement personnel, interviews and photographs with parolees in their orange outfits cleaning up the sides of freeways & observing a burns doctor tending to a patient. One of the highlights for David was two nights spent in the San Diego area on the flight deck of an aircraft carrier, watching jets take off and land.

Most likely, the highlight of David's career was the year (1977-1978) that he spent working as Nelson A. Rockefeller's personal photographer, staying on Rockefeller's estate in upstate New York

and also traveling to many of the latter's many homes, both in the U.S. and overseas.

Over the years, Rockefeller had acquired over 42,000 works of art, antiques and furniture. David's

A WORD ON WINE

A Wine Renaissance on Cruise Ships

We just returned from a 17-day cruise, and I can report that the wine experience on board has undergone a renaissance. Some years ago, the so-called wine stewards could only offer limited advice about particular wines. We even had one who didn't drink wine!! Similarly, the ship wine lists consisted of a lot of wines that we considered everyday drinkers in California, but at greatly inflated prices.

Eventually, the wine steward position was eliminated as a cost saving measure. Holland America is our go-to cruise line, and they have reinstated the position of wine steward, now calling them wine sommeliers. And, our sommelier was very good at presenting the brilliant idea! wines, including how they would taste, and how to pair them. Being Californians, it is always refreshing to see a wine list with a lot of variety and wines from many world regions. The wine lists also offered a broad selection of wines by the glass.

Another refreshing change was the number of wine-oriented events offered throughout the cruise. In addition to larger guided tastings of regional wines, the sommelier held a small tasting event every day at 5pm. On sea days it was a guided tasting of five wines for just \$9, and on port days, it was a self-serve format with ten wines and hors d'oeuvres, also for just \$9. What a

We could work our way slowly through the wine list, tasting premium wines, wines of different styles and wines from all over the world.

However, there is one caveat: beware the list of Rosé wines. I discovered this at the beginning of our cruise, ordering a glass of Rosé at our favorite pre-dinner bar without looking at the list. When it arrived, I could tell by the color and the taste that it was (Oh-No!) a White Zinfandel. Now I have nothing against Blush wines, but, IMO, they are definitely not in the Rosé category, and they are a little too sweet for my taste. Lesson learned - there were several other Rosés to




choose from, so I ordered by brand going forward.

I salute the cruise line for expanding their on board offerings with better wine lists, knowledgeable sommeliers and a variety of wine-oriented events at a good price.



VILLAGE NEWS

Leisure Village Board of Directors – President of the Board Chuck Kiskaden resigned from the Board for personal reasons. Richard Loomis has assumed the position of President, Ruth Stubba as Vice President, and Merle Ruiz has been appointed to the Board of Directors.

At the same meeting, the Board approved the FY 24/25 budget with a 3.975% increase in HOA fees. Village 28 Storm Drains – The Board approved work on the Village 28 storm lines is complete and the "flapper gate" is operational. We continue to have drainage problems with the storm line. Discussions with the County are underway.

With the incoming rainstorms, the Village has rented pump equipment to ensure that the flooding problems are addressed.

Camrosa Water Lines Inventory – The water lines Inventory is now complete.

Paint Project – The rain has slowed

down progress on the paint project. The paint project is near completion in Village 17, and will then be moving on to Villages 7, 9 and 19 which are the next phase of the paint project.

Roofing – Work has begun on the next phase of the roofing project, work is underway in Village 7.

Concrete – At the December meeting, the Board decided to authorize the repair of the category 3 and 2 concrete problems. There are anticipated delays in the start of the Concrete project.

In Ground Garbage Vaults – Staff has been investigating how the inground vaults can be removed. This has occurred around the Village. No project to remove all vaults has been proposed/approved. At this time staff is trying to investigate what will be required.

Garage Doors – The Board reviewed the garage door policy and, with the input from several Villagers, sent the policy back to

staff and the Attorney for more clarification. There is a new version now available on the Leisure Village web site.

Administration Building Sewers – The Admin building is experiencing serious problems with its sewers which will require major repair. The Board approved the repair contract for the sewer and restoration of the women's and men's bathrooms in the Admin Building. Work has started on this project.

Frontsteps – Frontsteps is the new software system to be used to automate many functions of the Village administration. It is a database based system where office functions and resident access to infor-

mation will be provided. Over time it will be launched in phases to provide resident financial information, a continuously updated resident directory, on-line green sheet (and other forms) submission with tracking, integration of Frontsteps with the current website, license plate readers to support Village gate access, improved means to communicate with residents and owners, and many other features. Staff is working with the Communications Committee to provide information and training materials to support the roll-out. Villagers will be required to create a username and password to access both Frontsteps and the Village website.

Don Marquardt's Tree of the Month

The Evergreen Pear Tree (Pyrus Kawakamii) presents two spectacular shows. The first show is in December when leaves turn bright red and then drop soon after; and then in January it produces massive clusters of white flowers in contrast with its dark trunk and bark. Fallen blossoms cover the ground like a winter snowfall. The tree's blossoms attract birds, butterflies and bees.

The trees are 15-30 feet tall with bright green, glossy leaves. They are native to China and Taiwan. They can easily be observed along Leisure Village Drive, scattered among the golf course, and throughout the Village.



Flood Prevention During the El Niño

After years of drought, culminating in hitting the "this is really serious" stage, Southern California has been hit by El Niño and Atmospheric River driven rains. Lots of rains. The system designed for getting the excess water out of sections of Leisure Village had not been tested very often with rains of this magnitude. While the system did not exactly fail, the amount of water that lingered during certain downpours rattled Villager's nerves.

In response to the potential for some rather severe flooding during February rains, the LV Administration, under the leadership of Christi Moore, worked with a company



that specializes in removing excess rain water to more appropriate storm drains and Camarillo Creek. LV employees, in cooperation with Ventura County Flood Control, worked hard to make sure the drains were as clear as possible to mitigate the flooding that would happen due to backflow from the overburdened Conejo Creek.

Village 20 and Village 28 would spring into action automatically when the drains would reach a certain level of runoff water. They worked. There was no serious flooding in East Village 20, Vil-

THE HEALTHY VILLAGER By Jeannie Davis, PT, MPH

Hip Hip Hooray for Health

Many of us have had challenges with one or more hips in our lives, including myself as I was born with congenitally deformed hip joints. There are many causes of hip and thigh discomfort, but there is much information on how we can manage and take better care of our hips and thighs. The hip joint is a ball and socket joint connecting your leg to your pelvis. The socket of the hip joint is deep and rarely dislocated unlike the shoulder joint which has a shallow socket. We can move our hip in 6 directions, enabling us to weight bear and walk and manipulate our legs and be mobile.

While there are many possible causes of hip and thigh pain, the most common include arthritis, bursitis, tendinitis, and sciatica (which is a pinched nerve from your low back). Discomfort can occur in

the hip joint which usually expresses itself with groin pain during movement. We can also feel tenderness in our outer thigh, which is usually due to soft tissue pain, and not the hip joint itself. Outer thigh distress can be from bursitis at the upper outer thigh or iliotibial band (IT band) dysfunction. The IT band is a large area of soft tissue that runs from the hip to the knee on the outside of your leg. When it is inflamed and/or tight, it can cause an aching sensation on the outside of your thigh and/or knee.

What can we do to decrease hip and thigh pain? Apply moist heat or cold pack to the affected area for 20 minutes to decrease discomfort and promote the natural healing process. Have at least one hour in between heat and cold applications. Obtain guidance

on stretching and strengthening exercises without increasing any symptoms, and don't sit for long periods of time without getting up and walking around. Use a cane or other assistive device if walking increases your pain but be sure to use the cane on the opposite side of the

body from the leg that is bothering you.

Visit your physician for an accurate diagnosis if you are concerned about your hip or thigh pain. Please note if your hip Xray is negative or positive, take the results with a grain of salt as many people who have severe arthritis on Xray may not feel severe pain, as soft tissue can cause pain in addition to joint pain. See a skilled Physical Therapist for evaluation and treatment of your hip and thigh pain to receive therapeutic exercises, natural treatments, education and guided feedback regarding how you walk, especially if you limp.




Photo of the hip joint and the workings of movement attributed to this important part of our anatomy for mobility.

If you do have a limp, it is recommended to use a cane to protect your low back and other joints, as limping changes the normal pattern of walking and may place undue stress on your other joints.

Our hips are made for walking, so wear top of the line running shoes when you walk that are comfortable. Taking care of our hips is paramount to our health and activities.

Jeannie's Photographic Triumph


■ ILV's own Jeannie Davis clearly "has the eye"




In the last 10 years, Jeannie's travels had her in too many locations to list but I can tell you that she has been on every continent with the exception of Antarctica (I


