
McGovern on Vietnam:

On Inauguration day, a McGovern Administration will announce the total withdrawal of all land, air and sea forces from Indochina to be accomplished within ninety days. Definite measures will be taken to assure the safe release of our prisoners of war. Our embrace of the Thieu regime will end.


