A new census has been compiled for Leisure Village, which gives a picture of what "55 and older" means right now. The Association counted all residents living here — owners and renters whose ages were available. The results are shown in the graphic at right.

"This is not a marketing tool," said General Manager Bob Scheaffer. "It's information that helps us to choose new equipment and make decisions about infrastructure." An example of one such decision

could be making the golf course more difficult if the average age was younger. This census clearly shows that is not necessary now.

The total number surveyed was 2,890.

The 70- to 79-year-olds have consistently been the largest group over time except in the very earliest years of the Village's settlement.

The youngest residents represent offspring who are caregivers for their parents or children with disabilities who live with their parents.

Cadet Nursing Corps vet calls Leisure Village home

When 19-year-old Verna Merrin signed up for the U.S. Cadet Nursing Corps in 1945, the decision was based on her limited pocketbook, not patriotism.

The University of Wisconsin student was drawn by the government's promise to pay tuition and stipends to those studying to be RNs.

"My father didn't want me to be a nurse," she says. "So I did it myself."

Sixty-seven years later. this Villager is one of a small group of surviving Corps RNs who helped bridge the crucial medical gap providing hospital care at home while tens of thousands of U.S. nurses participated elsewhere in the war effort.




Band concert Dec. 9



Constitutional initiatives provide property tax relief 'in the family'

Two constitutional initiatives
— Propositions 58 and 193 — provide property tax relief for real property transfers between parents and children and from grandparents to grandchildren. Collectively, they make it easier to keep property "in the family."

In general, Proposition 58 states that real property transfers, from parent to child or child to parent, may be excluded from reassessment.

Proposition 193 expands this tax relief to include transfers from grandparent(s) to grandchild(ren).

In both cases, a claim must be filed within three years of the date of transfer to receive the full benefit of the exclusion. Relevant to this: property held in trust, original trustee has passed, successor is a child (Proposition 58) or grandchild (Proposition 193), county will assess at date of passing, new tax bill to the child or grandchild even after sale. Forms are available on the county assessor's website in each county and can be submitted at the close of escrow.

Blight takes hold of Village pines

Looking good does not come cheap. A case in point is the cost of landscaping the Village. The process ranges from hiring an outside contractor to help keep our grasses green, to maintaining our permanent landscaping crew that cares for hundreds of acres of common area, including more than 120,000 sprinklers, 5,000 trees and an 18-hole golf course.

By some estimates, landscaping eats up nearly a third of our annual expenditures.

One increasingly costly item is the ongoing blight killing off most of our approximately 1,250 pine trees. They consist of three varieties - Monterey. Canary Island and Aleppo, none of which is likely to survive.

They are victims of a natural but lethal combination: a virus called pine pitch canker that causes the secretion of sap that attracts bark beetles, which, in turn, finish off the trees, leaving them unfit even for harvesting.

The scope of the problem, at least 10 dead or dying trees, can be seen just by looking in each direction standing by the benches at the eighth hole of the golf course.

If or until a better solution comes along, eventually all the infested trees will have to be cut down and removed. Depending on its size, each tree will cost anywhere from \$600 to \$1,200.

The infestation has already blighted entire stands of pine on hundreds of thousands of acres from the Rockies to the California coast, from San Diego to the great forests of the Northwest.

Responding to the immediate crisis, the Board voted an additional \$30,000 for tree maintenance from contingency funds, something like a pinecone on the forest floor compared to the overall cost.

The hard fact is, like Landscape Superintendent Mike Undem and his crews, all we can do is watch and pay as this grim tide of nature rolls across the Village.

It's a blight.



Nurse keeps Cadet legacy alive

to bolster the rapidly depleted number of registered nurses in American hospitals and public health agencies. World War II drew 80 percent of nursing professionals into the military effort, serving from the Philippines to Anzio. Skilled care on the home front was vanishing.

"More than 124,000 nurses graduated from Cadet programs by 1948 nationwide," recalls Verna.

She described her course at the University of Wisconsin as tough, but "no one ever flunked state boards." And she went on to a 27-year-long career in nursing - some was hospital-based, some as a teacher of college courses.

Verna Merrin knew she wanted to be a nurse from the age of 9. Her mother suffered a near-fatal pulmonary embolism after the birth of Verna's brother.

"I spent a lot of time in the hospital while she recovered, watching the nurses. I knew that's what I wanted to be from that time on," she says with a

Her first nursing job was in Cincinnati, and that's where she met her husband Irv. They moved back to Wisconsin, raised their three children (Verna often worked night

shifts so she could be home with the family), and, in 1997, they relocated to Leisure Village, lured west by their son, a doctor in Thousand Oaks.

"I wish we had done that sooner. I love it here," Verna says.

Verna says modestly that today's nurses have skills that go far beyond what she learned in the 1940s. But her family says, "Nursing is up with the angels; Verna always knows what to do." That attitude was important when Irv was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease and Verna cared for him for nearly five years before he died.

Much of Verna Merrin's time still centers around health care - hers and others. At 88, she exercises daily - at Morning Stretch, Bone Builders, lap swimming, regular walks and line dancing.

She is active in Your Neighbor's Care group and is the secretary of the Weight Control Group, a club she credits with helping her lose 30 pounds years ago.

The Journal of the American Medical Association wrote that the Cadet Nurses Corps prevented "the collapse of nursing care in civilian hospitals." Post-war, it was absorbed into military nursing groups. But graduates like Verna Merrin keep the Cadet legacy alive.




