

Cuando estamos a unos cuantos dias de la Navidad y esperamos la llegada del nuevo año, vienen a nuestra memoria pensamientos que nos hacen recordar otras Navidades que pasamos en compania de personas ya desaparecidas, otras veces nuestras pensamientos nos revelan episodios de nuestra vida que recordamos siempre en estas fechas.

Todos nosotros hemos tenido en el transcurso de los años, alegrias y tristezas; dichas y sinsabores, pero tanto unas como otros, saturan nuestro espiritu de un sentimiento de bondad en la temporada en que recordamos con veneracion, el nacimiento del Redentor, nos sentimos invalidos por sus mensajes de mansedumbre, de sacrificio, de bondad y de perdon.

Entre los recuerdos que llegan a mi memoria en esta Navidad, como en todas, esta el recuerdo de Josie, una gran amiga, a la que admire por su caracter alegre y jovial, franco y energico, bondadoso y transparente, como el agua que sale de un manantial de aguas cristalinas, era alegre y alborotadora como un fandango; a la vez era serena y sensata como un filosofo. Josie fue una de las primeras personas que tuve el honor de tratar y conocer hace algunos años a mi llegada a la Ciudad de San Jose.

Quiero relatar en estas lineas un sucedido real, que mas bien podria ocupar lugar entre los Cuentos de Navidad. A la manera de los cuentos que oi en mi niñez, podria decir: Esta era una señora que se preparaba para celebrar una Navidad alegre y
feliz, con una suculenta cena y el reglamento cambio de regalos. Para los gastos que
originan estas festividades, contaba con el
dinero que cobraria como renta de la casita
alquilada a una familia en un barrio humilde.
Pero sucedio que cuando se presento a cobrar la renta, encontro que la familia no solo
no tenia el dinero, sino que ni siquiera tenia

nada decente que comer; algunos mendrugos y residuos en los trastos de la cocina era todo y con seguridad para la fecha del Nacimiento del Niño Jesus, hasta esto habria desaparecido.

Josie se dio cuenta de esta miserable situacion y salio de la pobre vivienda, sin decir una palabra. La mujer que ocupaba la vivienda, salio detras de ella y le explico.... con voz en la que se adivinaba el llanto, "Señora, mi marido se fue a buscar trabajo desde hace una semana, no he tenido noticias de el. Pero en cuanto me mande algo, yo le voy a pagar."

Alrededor de la pobre mujer se prendian de sus ropas, cuatro chiquillos, ningun mayor de los ocho años, en sus cuerpos y en sus caras se reflejaba una desnutrición completa.

Mi amiga le dio una amistosa palmada en el hombro a la atribulada mujer y le dijo al despedirse, "Dios no la abandonara."

Josie entro en actividad con su acostumbrada energia, fue a ver a sus amistades y les pidio ayuda para esa pobre gente. Nadie se nego a aliviar la situacion de la familia en desgracia, si alguien se hubiera negado, la embajadora de la bondad, en que se habia convertido Josie, se habria convertido en volcan en erupcion, calcinandolos por su pichicateria.

Al dia siguiente se presento en la casa de la desafortunada familia llevando una gran cantidad de paquetes, en los que habia de todo, alimentos, dulces, ropa, juguetes y algun dinero; depositando todo sobre la mesa, Josie le dijo a la asombrada madre, "ya ve que Dios no la abandona, aqui tiene esto para que usted, sus hijos y su marido pasen una Navidad feliz; yo le doy como regalo la renta que me debe," y diciendo esto se alejo.

La madre de los chiquillos no sabia si lloraba o reia, sollosaba queriendo hablar, decir algo, pero las palabras se le ahogaban en la garganta, entre lagrimas de alegria y entrecortados sollozos de gratitud, bulbuceo, "Que Dios se lo page."

Han pasado muchos años desde aquella Navidad, pero ese rasgo de generosidad de Josie, no se borra de mis recuerdos en ninguna Navidad.

Ahora mi amiga, la que admire, respete y me senti honrado con su amistad; no podra llevar ese rayo de luz que alegro a esa

Birchers 34 - Mexicans 28 Dum De Dum Dum!

The Mexican Americans of the Gardner area left their rear flank exposed at a meeting on December 7th and John Birch Society member Ray Gurries was elected as a Commissioner to the Economic Opportunity Commission (EOC).

A small band of Birchers, using the element of surprise, jolted the Gardner area leaders to a rude awakening. They came, they saw, they conquered.

There were only about 25 Mexican Americans in attendance for the meeting called for the purpose of electing an interim Commissioner to the EOC from Area 5 which includes the Gardner area.

According to Ray Gurries there were only about 20 Birchers in the audience. No doubt some people voted for Gurries not knowing that he is an ardent member of the John Birch Society and all it stands for.

Isais Aguilera and I made a desperate bid to stop Gurries but the troops weren't there. Neither of us had any intention of running for the seat before the meeting. Aguilera made the runoff election but lost on the second ballot 34-28.

Gurries told me in an interview that had the Birchers wanted to make a showing they would have had 200 people at the meeting. The lack of attendance by the Mexican American and the other poverty target groups made, it duck soup for Ray Gurries and his followers ... like taking candy from a baby.

Gurries says the Birchers stand for less government, more local initiative in order to create a better world. They are opposed to Washington's interference with local communities and feel that initiative should be left to each individual.

They are ultra conservative and opposed to all socialistic programs and schemes. According to Gurries their main target are the leftists and Communists who want to lead this country down the road to socialism and communism.

I asked Ray Gurries the \$64 question. As an interim Commissioner (a permanent one will be elected in two or three months), would he support the Mexican American organizations in their fight with the EOC? His answer was yes and he will fight to see that the War on Poverty benefits go to the people who need it and not to the bureaucrats.

No doubt Ray Gurries talks a good program, but the philosophy of the John Birch Society is not one that is clear nor easy to understand. At least as far as I am concerned. Nor do I think that extremist groups either on the right or left do this country much good.

The fact is that Ray Gurries and his sympathizers for the moment have made their impact on the poverty program in the Gardner area....whether we like it or not.

Their future influence may well depend on how much interest the Mexican American takes in the War on Poverty program.

We can't vote if we are not there.....
dum de dum dum!!

PERHAPS WE CAN HELP, DON

Don McGaffin, the editorial man at KNTV, as you read in a previous issue, attacked the Mexican Americans, saying there were no qualified Spanish speaking people to be found to fill important and responsible positions in the local War on Poverty Program.

It really pains me to even bring this up again, but getting away from philosophy, let's get down to the facts and then maybe Don will concentrate on editorials that he knows something about.

Obviously his knowledge of the Mexican American is limited if he knows anything at all.

In California we have at least 1164 Accountants and Auditors, 106 Architects, 466 Artists and Art Teachers, 163 Chemists, 387 Clergymen, 223 College Professors and Instructors, 1488 Designers and Draftsmen, 2746 Engineers, 329 Lawyers and Judges, 178 Pharmacists, 408 Physicians and Surgeons, 61 Social Scientists, 366 Social Welfare and Recreation Workers, 1386 Elementary and Secondary Teachers and 3519 other Professional, technical and kindred occupations.

These are U.S. government figures based on the 1960 Census and published by the Mexican American Study Project at UCLA. The figures now are obviously higher.

Please notice that we couldn't find a TV Editorialist. This may be because we seldom get involved in things we know nothing about.
