CAL STATE FULLERTON CAMPUS

California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing. Having first offered classes in 1959, the university has grown to 23,000 students and achieved national distinction.

In 1984, the university hosted team handball competition at the Summer Olympics. It also will begin its 25th anniversary observance with the theme "Honoring the Past—Creating the Future."

The university's students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes: many come to classes only in the evening. Drawn from throughout the world, the 750-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching

and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The university enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, education, engineering, communications, music, nursing, speech and hearing, and theater. All told there are 82 degree programs—40 of them at the graduate level.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is the largest university level internship and cooperative education program on the West Coast. The program allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their

regular studies

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours on a year-round basis. Extended education offerings are open to the community without the formalities of regular admission to the university.

Still another strong point is the university's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances and the Cabaret Repertory Theater Company, which performs regularly in Brea.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the 7,000-person network of community support organizations. The Titan Athletic Foundation is

one of these support groups.

Further examples of community outreach are the Fullerton Arboretum and Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary. Opened in 1979, the Arboretum is a 25-acre on-campus preserve that was established jointly by the university and the City of Fullerton. Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary is a half-hour from campus in a canyon of the Santa Ana Mountains.

To reinforce the university's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State has embarked on an ambitious campaign called "Commitment to Mindpower." Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great university.



ADMINISTRATION

Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb, President

Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb was appointed the third president of Cal State Fullerton on July 8, 1981. Her selection was the culmination of a nationwide search begun in November, 1980 to replace Dr. L. Donald Shields, who had resigned after a ten-year term to accept the presidency of Southern Methodist University.

Dr. Cobb had served as Dean of Douglass College at Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey, since 1976. There she also held the rank of Professor of Biological Sciences. Prior to her Douglass appointment she was Dean of Connecticut College and Professor of Zoology for seven years. Previously, she was Professor of Biology at Sarah Lawrence College in New York.

Born in January, 1924, Dr. Cobb is known for her work in cell physiology, her promotion of the advancement of women in scientific fields and her activities on behalf of minorities. She is the first black women to head a major public university on the west coast.

Cobb earned her bachelor's degree in 1944 from Talladega College in Alabama and her M.S. and Ph.D. in cell physiology from New York University in 1947 and 1950, respectively. She is the mother of a son, Jonathan, who is a student in the Cornell University Medical School.

HEAD COACH JUDI GARMAN



Judi Garman begins her sixth year as softball coach at Cal State Fullerton and has led the team to no less than a ninth-place national finish in each of her five years.

Garman established the program in 1980 and finished third in the conference, second in the region and ninth-Place nationally. Since then, Garmen's teams have won every conference and regional championship while finishing second in the nation in 1981 and 1983 and third place in 1982.

Garman's instant success at Fullerton is only the latest in a remarkable string of accomplishments which stretch across the continent from Canada to the University of California at Santa Barbara to Golden West College in Huntington Beach to Cal State Fullerton.

At Golden West College in 1971 she inherited a team which was winless the previous year and took it to a 9-8 showing. Two years later she captured a conference crown and it took two more years for her first regional championship and her first of four national championships.

Starting with nothing at Fullerton, she has taken the Titans to the national championship tournament in her first four years, just missing the national title and settling for second twice. In 1981 the Titans lost the national championship game 4-3 to Utah State and last year it took Texas A & M 12 innings to beat the Titans in the final game 2-0.

Garman began working on her master's degree at UC Santa Barbara in 1967 and started club softball and soon had a varsity team (1967-69). Upon completion of her studies she took the women's athletic directorship at Westmont College in Santa Barbara and coached volleyball, basketball and tennis in addition to softball.

Garman then moved to Golden West College where, along with softball, she coached basketball (1973-76) and cross country (1977-79). Twenty-one of her softball players received scholarships to four-year institutions, against whom she manufactured a 34-11-2 record over the years.

In great demand as a speaker and instructor at clinics, Garman has conducted her own sessions at Golden West College and Fullerton, attracting hundreds of coaches and young softball players. She has also taken a Titan team to Sweden for a series of clinics and exhibitions.

Fishing and snow skiing occupy Garman time away from softball field. She has also been published in many physical education journals and was a pioneer in the equality in sports movement when she played Little League baseball.

ASSOCIATE COACH KATHY VAN WYK

Kathy Van Wyk begins her third year as the Titans' assistant coach after a highly successful playing career at Cal State Fullerton and Texas Women's University.

Van Wyk, 24 had a sensational one year pitching career at Fullerton after transferring from Texas Women's University when its softball program was dropped. At Fullerton she compiled a 35-1 record with an earned run average of 0.18 and 270 strikeouts in 278 innings pitched. She was named both NCAA and AIAW All-American while receiving the Broderick Award for the nation's top softball player. Van Wyk also received an NCAA post-graduate scholarship.

At TWU she was a member of the 1979 AIAW National Championship team and was named Texas AIAW Player of the Year. In 1980 she was nominated for the Broderick Award after compiling a 40-6 record with three perfect games. In 1981 her record was 11-9 with a 0.63 ERA in 133 innings. She was also an ASA All-American when she played for the Orlando Rebels in 1979.

Van Wyk was born in Holland Michigan on July 21, 1960 and attended Holland Christian High School. She was

named to the all-conference team and she played on the 1979 state championship team. She also played two years of volleyball and three seasons of basketball. In basketball she was once all-city and twice all-conference.

After coming to Fullerton she ran her pitching record to 33-0 before losing her first game in the College World Series and was named County Athletic of the Year by the Orange County Sportwriters Association for sports other than football, basketball or baseball.

This March, Kathy will be taking her pitching talents to Australia to compete for the US National team at the World Friendship Tournament. The team is tentatively scheduling a tour of England later this summer.

ASSISTANT COACH TOBI PERKINS

Former All-WCAA outfielder Tobi Perkins joins the Titans staff this season an outstanding career as a Titan player. Beginning her first season as a Titan coach, Perkins has gained experience coaching both at La Quinta High School and Mt. San Antonio College.

Perkins ranks high in several offensive and defensive categories for Fullerton. 1983 saw her commit only two errors in 71 games for the Titans. Meanwhile she tied second on the team in hits (56), second in RBI's (19), and tied for first in doubles (7) and stolen bases (12).

Some of her year end totals rank high in the Titan record books including stolen bases (27), at bats (731), games played (253) and single season hits (63 in 1981). Perkins has been noted for her achievements by being selected to the All-WCAA team in 1981 and 1983. She was former Athlete of the Year at La Quinta High School and received her degree in Fullerton in Physical Education. Tobi was the first Titan to ever compete for four-years.

"Tobi is going to be a great addition to our coaching staff," comments Head Coach Judi Garman. "With as young a teamas we have this season, she is going to be a terrific asset to the program."



TITAN SOFTBALLERS HEAD INTO 85 WITH HIGH HOPES

Despite the loss of many key personnel, the Cal State Fullerton Softball team will head into 1985 with the talent and confidence to be a national contender once again. 1984 saw the Titans win 25 consecutive games out of the starting block and hold down the number one spot in the nation for most of the year only to fall to eventual NCAA finalist Texas A & M in the first round of the playoffs.

In a game where pitching fills 90%, the Titans are still carrying a full house. 1983 All-American **SUSAN LeFEBVRE** returns for her junior season after posting a 20-4 record with a .376 ERA LeFebvre's two year record now stands at 46-9. Also returning to pitching duties will be former All-World athlete **DEBBIE MYGIND**. The native New Zealander had a 21-6 record in 1984 (.404 ERA) with yet greater strides to be made in her senior year.

"Both Debbie and Susan have really improved themselves in the off-season," notes Titan Associate/Pitching Coach Kathy Van Wyk. "Debbie has one of the finest change-ups in the game but needed to add some additional pitches to her repetoire. Susan used the off-season to improve her mental approach to the game. With the kind of strides that they have made, I anticipate both of them to have outstanding seasons."

Head Coach Judi Garman enters her sixth season with a lot of new personnel. Lost among last year's graduates include three-time All-American Sue Lewis, one of the nation's finest players and holder of numerous Titan records. Also gone is All-American outfielder Elise King, infielder Kim Kirk and Jan Pierini. But despite the loss of a great deal of offense, Garman feels that this team can and will rise to the level of their predecessors.

"I have been very pleased with the way we have been hitting the ball," adds Garman. "Even though we lost a lot of sticks last season, I expect to be very close to where we left off last year in terms of hitting."

With only three seniors, the Titans have one of their youngest teams ever. So freshman, JC transfers as well as returners will all have to make an immediate impact of the squad's offense. Leading the charge will be third baseman Joann Ferrieri. Last season she batted .315 while tagging six doubles and 17 RBI's. Senior catcher/DH MARIDEE RICHARDS hit .298 last season along with 20 RBI's. First base will be occupied by junior ROBIN GOODIN who was last year's starting first baseman. Second base will be run by highly touted freshman VALERIE VAN KIRK. Valerie combines outstanding defensive and offensive skills to make her a newcomer to watch in 1985. Shortstop should be held down by junior LISA NORIEGA whose strong bat (.282, 7 doubles 3 triples and 1 HR) and great throwing arm will be a necessity this season.

In losing King and Lewis, the outfield was hurt most by graduation. But Coach Garman has got to like the replacements. JC transfer **DIANE DODD** will step right in at the left field spot for the Titans. In Dodd, Coach Garman feels that she has a cog that will have an immediate impact on the offense. Dodd played her JC ball at nearby Fullerton JC where she was regarded as

one of the top JC players in the nation. In center field, sophomore RINA FOSTER and senior LESLIE KING should both see extensive playing time. King's versatility goes beyond the outfield as she will also see action behind the plate. Foster finished a very fine 1984 season by batting .273. Right field will be occupied by another touted newcomer in TERRI OBERG or returner LISA BAKER. Baker finished last season with a .293 avg. while Oberg will be asked to provide some of the offensive punch. Utility outfielder STEPHANIE TANAKA is also capable of filling any of the outfield spots while also being a heads-up baserunner.

As is the case with any sport, the key to success can be the quality of your depth. This is yet another improvement in the 1985 Titans. Freshman APRIL JONES' pitching impact is definitely in the years to come but look for her to get in some spot situations. Another freshman, catcher MICHELLE GROMACKI should definitely see some game action this season as will freshman utility player CARYN DAY and sophomore outfielder CORINA SMITH.

"I really see only two questions facing this team as to how successful they will be this season," comments Garman. "Last season we lost several games due to throwing errors at the shortstop position. If we have effectively improved ourselves defensively, that will be a big plus. The other factor will be how our new kids adapt to game situations. These kids have the talent, all they need now is the experience. I think if these two things come together for us, we're going to be allright."

COACH GARMAN: "Lisa does so many things well. She can help us at third base, first base, pitcher as well as the outfield. Her strongest suit is her consistency with the bat. She not only hits the ball hard but she does a great job of going with the pitch. I really look for her to have a great year."

HIGH SCHOOL: Named the Edison High School Most Valuable Player three times... Was a first-team All-CIF selection as well as being the Sunset League MVP... Outstanding all-around athlete as she was MVP of her school's field hockey team...


