Charles I Wohler had the position of Personal Records Section Officer. He was a humorous and witty man with twinkling eyes; an abbreviated mustache, soft wavy brown hair and high forehead. His past experience included many years of employment with government agencies like NRA, FERA, SERA, WPA, and now WCCA. Social Data Registration Files, Occupational Records, Daily Population Reports, and Reports of Evacuee Movement to and from the center were under his jurisdiction.

Arthur H. Peters had the title of Administrative Timekeeper. Records of the earnings of all individuals working in the center were maintained by this department.

M.E. Johnson was Cashier and headed the payroll and script issuance office.

Clarence N. Johnson served as Postmaster for the Center Post Office which provided the same services as any Post Office in the city of Fresno. This included money orders, registers, C.O.D., insurance, stamps; even war bonds and defense stamps.

Frank Goblirsch headed the Supply Section. A small bespectacled man with a firm jaw, easily identified because he was seldom seen without a cap. His responsibility was the requisitioning, receiving and inspection of all materials, supplies and equipment and the issuance of them to the operating divisions. He also managed the warehouses for everything except Mess and Lodging.
