DEANS OF SCHOOLS APPOINTED

School of Education - President McCune announces the appointment of Dr. Lewie Burnett as Dean of the School of Education at California State College, Hayward. The appointment, effective September 1, 1970, was made upon the recommendation of the ad hoc Committee for Selection of a Dean of the School of Education and the Vice President, Academic Affairs. Dr. Burnett, who joined the faculty in September, 1962, has served as Head of the Division of Education since September, 1964.

On the recommendation of the Vice President, Academic Affairs, President McCune announces the following appointments, effective September 1, 1970:

School of Arts, Letters and Social Sciences - Dr. Mark Van Aken, Acting Dean.

School of Business and Economics - Dr. L. Glen Strasburg, Acting Dean.

ACTIONS OF THE ACADEMIC SENATE

At its meeting on June 4 the Academic Senate took the following action:

Referred 69-70 CASH 4, Credit by Examination (College Level Examination Program) to the Committee on Academic Standards and Honors and the Committee on Courses to be considered jointly during the 1970-71 academic year.

Failed to approve 69-70 CASH 6, California State College, Hayward policy on graduations with honors (Magna Cum Laude and Summa Cum Laude).

Referred 69-70 CPP 2, Revision in Academic Master Plan 1971-72--1975-76 back to the Committee on Planning and Policy.

Approved 69-70 CahGS 18, Request for Approval of Revision of the Foreign Language Requirement of the Department of Political Science, but amended it by deleting the last sentence of the revision statement.

Approved 69-70 CahGS 19, Revision of "12-Unit Rule" on Graduate Courses to be Offered by Departments Without an Approved Master's Degree Program but amended it by substituting the following for 4.2:

"The units above the 12-unit limit may be offered by the department, eight of these units may be offered for no more than two years without the Chancellor's Office formal approval."

Approved 69-70 CASH-CED 1, Status of R. O. T. C. on this Campus as submitted.

CSCH COED AWARDED MEDICAL TECHNOLOGY SCHOLARSHIP

Janice Vierra (Graduating Senior in Biological and Health Sciences) has been awarded the annual scholarship of the California Association of Medical Laboratory Technologists which is given to an outstanding student in Medical Technology in California. She will begin her year of clinical training at the Stanford Medical Center in Palo Alto, where she replaces James Mangels (B.S. in Biological and Health Sciences, 1969). Mangels, who has completed his training, has joined the Stanford Laboratory staff as a Medical Technologist.

NSF INVITES COLLEGES TO APPLY FOR INSTITUTES

Several program announcements and brochures have been received from the National Science Foundation. They include the following:

1. Summer Institutes for Secondary School Teachers of Science and Mathematics - 1971 Guide for the Preparation of Proposals.
Proposal deadline: July 1, 1970.
2. Student Science Training Program (Pre-College) for High Ability Secondary School Students - Suggestions for the Preparation of Proposals.
Deadline: August 25, 1970.

USOE BILINGUAL EDUCATION ACT (TITLE VII ESEA)

A Manual for Project Applicants and Grantees (Draft Form) has been received. The manual is long and detailed, yet helpful.

ARTS AND HUMANITIES EXTENSION BILL PASSES SENATE

A bill that would extend the National Foundation on the Arts and Humanities Act of 1965 until fiscal 1973, S 3215, has passed the Senate as reported. A similar bill has been reported to the House.

Under the Senate-passed measure, authorization of \$9 million for fiscal 1970, \$17 million for 1971, \$26.5 million for 1972, and \$35.5 million for 1973 would be for the National Humanities Endowment. The National Arts Endowment would receive authorization of \$2.5 million for fiscal 1970, \$4.1 million for 1971, \$5.5 million for 1972, and \$6.8 million for 1973.

Authorization of \$6.5 million for fiscal 1970, \$12.8 million for 1971, \$21 million for 1972, and \$28.6 million for 1973 would be provided for grants and contracts to support groups or individuals in the U. S. who are concerned or engaged with the arts.
