Lee:

As you suspected, the California Corporations Code does not apply to the Commission for Women. Instead, the Commission would be guided by the Brown Act.

County Counsel gave me the attached guide to the Brown Act, which may be helpful to you. Also, section 6.2, subdivision (c) of the Commission's bylaws provides:

"C. A quorum shall be a majority of the appointed Commissioners. Official meetings take place whenever a quorum is present. This includes study sessions and other informal conferences but will not normally apply to a social gathering."

County Counsel believes this means that you must always have a quorum present to conduct business, so if your Commission falls below a quorum, the Commission cannot conduct any business.
