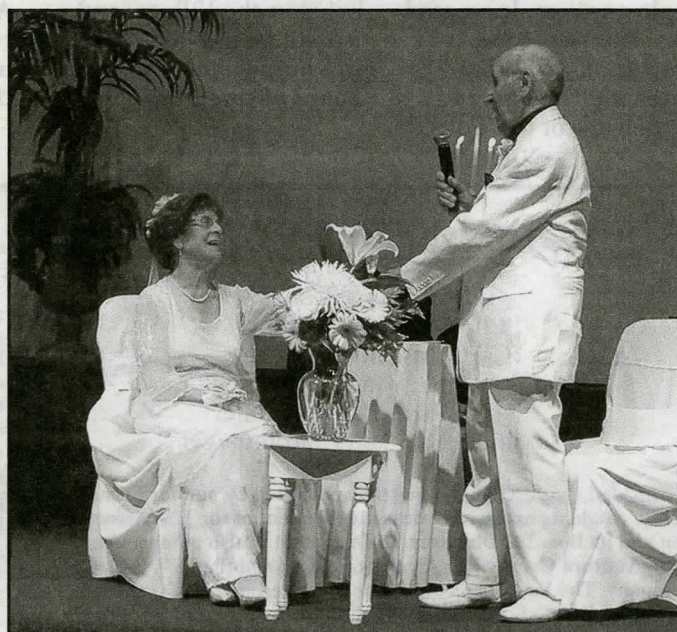

I try to pick up "Inside Leisure Village" as often as I can. I enjoy when various articles are written by residents voicing their pleasure of living here. All the amenities that we have here were for the pleasure of the residents and paid by the Association.

Unfortunately, some of the facilities are not being used very much. When many of us moved into Leisure Village, we were gung-ho, playing tennis, paddle tennis, golf and using the swimming pool. We did volunteer work and things for the Village just to make it better, a showcase of what retirement can be and how it can be enjoyed. I think we were successful in this manner.

Now, many years have gone by since its inception, and time has had its toll on some residents that have been here many years and some not as long. I've been here nearly 19 years, and now I see many of my friends that I've known for a long period, who were robust when moving in, now moving slowly, getting around with walkers, scooters or wheelchairs.

I still get around, drive my car, go to the market and other places, but I know my turn will come, and unless there is a different turn of events for me, I will have to give up some of these conveniences.

This brings to mind the difficulty by which persons in wheelchairs have in maneuvering their chairs in various places. Provi-

sions were made, according to government codes, that buildings contain an entrance other than the main entrance, which is ramped or level for use by handicapped persons, a sign showing its location, that shall be posted at or near the main entrance. The code goes on, but the concept is understood that persons in wheelchairs will have the ability to enter a building without any difficulty. These codes apply to government buildings only, but I think that it should also have some application to homes in senior communities.

Just recently I nearly stumbled when opening my front door to enter my home. I realized then that if I had been in a wheelchair, I would have no way, without the help of someone, of getting in because the entrance was about six inches too high for a wheelchair. So what is a person to do?

Also, if there were to be a fire in the home, how would a person get out and away from the house?

These are questions that the Board of Directors should consider.

Let us consider having the Woodshop make portable wood ramps and have them made available for anyone who needs them, a one-time charge just for the installation and removal. This convenience would have its own reward.

Last 55 Alive class Nov. 20

The last 55 Alive class for 2008 is November 20.

For the new residents of LV who might not be familiar with this program, this is a 4.5-hour accelerated class offered by AARP for the benefit of licensed drivers in Leisure Village who want to continue safe driving and be brought up to date on current California DMV rules and regulation.

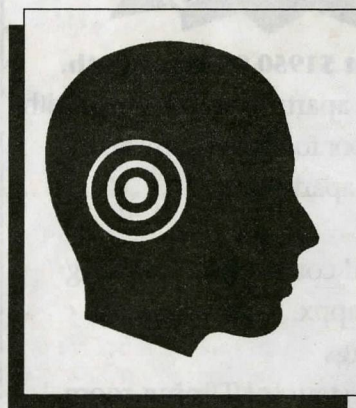
California law requires that insurance companies give a discount to everyone who takes this class. It is good for three years. If you are 70 years or older and need to renew your drivers license, you will be required to pass a written test. This class will be

helpful to prepare you.

Only those who have previously completed the two-day 8-hour class may take this class. If you need to take the two-day class or a class on the months we do not offer it here in LV, call me. I have information on other locations and dates.

The next available class in the Village will be Thursday, Sept. 18, in the MPR from 1 to 5:30 p.m. Space is available. The cost is \$10 per person with a check made payable to AARP. Pre-registration and pre-payment are required.

Plan ahead for post-earthquake restrooms

Are you prepared to cope with an inoperable sewage system after a major earthquake?

Disaster specialists expect interruptions of water supplies immediately after a major earthquake. Without water, sewage systems will cease to function. During the earthquake aftermath, human waste probably will have

to be temporarily stored.

Each family should have available at least 100 heavy duty, 4-gallon capacity plastic bags. These bags can be used to line buckets or wastebaskets that will serve as temporary toilets. After use, the bags should be tightly sealed with wire ties. A large garbage can or box can be used for temporary storage.

Under no circumstances should human waste be dumped or left exposed to insects or other animals. Careless handling of this material could quickly create a serious health problem.

Mobility news: Today it's easier to get around town

Did you know that persons with permanent or temporary physical disabilities can drive vehicles independently? Gone are the days of depending on others for transportation. In many cases, your own vehicle can be modified for you to drive.

If you require wheelchair access into your vehicle, mini or full-sized vans can be adapted for your needs. Mobility scooters and motorized wheelchairs that are too heavy to pick up can easily be loaded by an automatic lift

mounted in your vehicle.

To assist you with your purchase, special financing, grants and mobility rebates are available to all disabled persons who are purchasing or modifying a new vehicle. Contact your local Regional Disability Center. Disabled veterans can contact their local Veterans Affairs office to apply for financial aid.

To begin your search for other financial assistance, contact your local hospital for names of organizations willing to help.

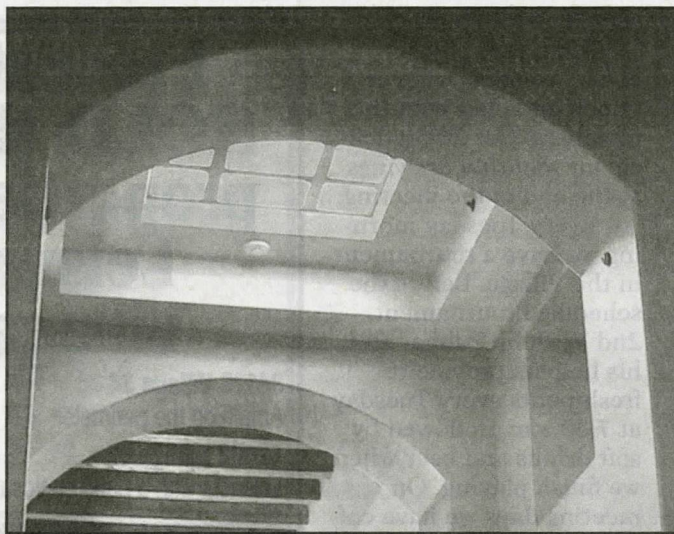
