El gran sentido plastico de los antiguos mexicanos, dejo testimonios destacados en los diversos sitios donde surgieran las civilizaciones precolombinas. Esa capacidad se tradujo lo mismo en esculturas de sombria belleza, como la feroz "Coatlicue" con su collar de manos y corazones, que en las impresionantes estelas mayas o esas cabezas de "Caballero Aguila,"

La sensibilidad del artista sabia dominar la piedra, no obstante la pobreza de sus instrumentos; su espiritu se sobreponia a la parquedad del medio.

Pero la escultura indigena al conjuro de sus ideas religiosas predominantes entonces, deja siempre (salvo algunas excepciones) una impresion oscura de crueldad, copia de la personalidad de sus dioses que los artistas querian representar; le falta la nota amable, la expresion de lo humano en el plano de la comprension y la sonrisa.

Pero no sucede igual con la orfebreria que tiene acaso un aliento mas noble, mas humano, y digalo si no lo que produjeron con tanta elegancia los aztecas, pero sobre todo los zapotecas y mixtecas y mixtecas de las regiones oaxaqueñas.

No encontramos alli el terror sino el perfil equilibrado de un arte que tornaba el oro y la plata, el jade y la turquesa, en elementos de uso comun en la vida social. Los orfebres eran en los pueblos mas adelantados trabajadores cuya labor se teneia en gran aprecio. Entre los aztecas la profesion de los operarios de metales preciosos eran objeto de una gran estimacion por la creencia de que la plata pero especialmente el oro "teocuitlal" eran producto de la deyeccion de los dioses.

El Museo regional de la ciudad de Oaxaca guarda numerosas muestras de esta aurifera joyeria.

Los martillos de piedra eran los instrumentos indispensables para la manu-

factura de las joyas, pero para las delicadas piezas de oro se usaba el procedimiento de la "cera perdida" que consistia en la preparacion de una mezcla de barro y carbon vegetal pulverizado, endurecida al calor del sol. En seguida a la mezcla se le daba la forma deseada bañandola con cera fundida, hasta quedar la superficie recubierta de modo parejo. Se adaptaba despues otro molde de barro y carbon y en el espacio intermedio - entre los dos moldes - se vertia el oro fundido - antes en un crisol. Fundiase la cera y quedaba reemplazada por el oro o la plata. Despues se rompia el molde y la joya quedaba terminada.

Asi se obtuverion orejares y bezotes, anillos, pectorales, brazaletes, mangos de abanico, etc. Los hallazgos que hiciera el Doctor Alfonso Caso en Montealban, Oaxaca en tumbas de origen zapoteca pero sobre todo en la numero siete que es de origen mixteca, causaron estupor en todo el mundo al ser conocidas. Arte tan acabado apenas era concebible y no faltaron las insidias que hablaban de falsificaciones. Mas por encima de cualquier envidia el valor de las piezas halladas que nos muestran el genio indigena de los habitantes de Oaxaca, tiene dimensiones de caracter universal.

Nada mas delicado ni bello en el horizonte de las culturas indigenas de Mexico.




