Dear Mr. Hope:

In reference to Mr. Brock's statement in the Nov. 2nd Press-Courier, I offer the following comments. Mr. Brock is right that "Oxnard is a big part of United". Oxnard has been the main financial support of United Water Conservation District since its formation. However, contrary to Mr. Brock's beliefs, there is good reason to be at swords points with U. W. C. D. The directors have refused repeatedly to redistrict because this would have given Oxnard and Port Hueneme a larger voice and its proper voice. The redistricting would have been in the direction of complying with the law of our land of representation based on one man one vote. Oxnard and Port Hueneme have most of the people and pay most of the taxes of the district but our one representative, Mr. Brock, tells us that we should be happy and ~~and~~ quiet because we pay somuch and have the equivalent of no voice!

Only after the directors of U.W.C.D. call for redistricting can Oxnard properly improve its relationship with United.
