

MRS. FITZHUGH WILL SPEAK ON POLIO EPIDEMIC

Speaking of her experiences during a poliomyelitis epidemic in Virginia, Mrs. Mabel Fitzhugh, college physio-therapist, will address students Tuesday, January 30, at 4 o'clock in room 39.

Mrs. Fitzhugh, who was sent to Virginia by the National Infantile Paralysis Foundation, will describe her experiences there as a helper in four different hospitals.

The cities in which she worked were Richmond, Charlottesville, and Roanoke. She was able to observe the Kenney treatment for infantile paralysis which is now being widely used in the United States.

Mrs. Fitzhugh will tell students about this treatment and the advances made in medicine during this epidemic, which is considered the worst that has ever struck any part of the United States. All students who are interested are invited to attend this lecture.
