'POPPED OFF TOO MUCH',  
AGNEW SAYS AT DINNER  
Governor, Who Asserted That His Offense  
Was Unintended, Calls Opponents "Bland"

ANNAPOLIS, Md. (AP)--  
Maryland Gov. Spiro T. Agnew, the GOP vice  
presidential candidate, told a Republican  
fund-raising dinner, "Sometimes it seems  
to me I've popped off a little too much of  
late."

Agnew, who has drawn criticism for using  
the word "Polack" and referring to a re-  
porter as a "fat Jap", added, "At least  
I'm not as bland as the other side has  
been."

The governor made the remarks during an  
impromptu appearance Wednesday at a dinner  
for Rep. Rogers C. B. Morton (R-Md.) after  
returning to Baltimore from a 10-day  
campaign trip. .

It was during the trip that he used the  
word "Polack" in Chicago to describe  
Polish descendants. He later apologized  
for his usage saying he did not realize  
the term was derisive. New York Polish-  
Americans seem to have agreed. Wednesday  
they invited Agnew to lead the group's big  
event of the year--The Pulaski Day parade.

Then, just before he arrived in Hawaii, he  
referred to a reporter of Japanese descent  
as a "fat Jap" but explained later that  
he meant no offense and that the reporter  
--a Japanese-American from Baltimore was a  
friend of his. A Democratic congressman  
from Hawaii said the term was contemptuous.

Agnew suggested that the American sense of  
humor was in decline if friends could not  
use the slang that people on athletic  
teams use affectionately among themselves.
