Edmund G. (Pat) Brown

For Secretary of State Henry Lopez

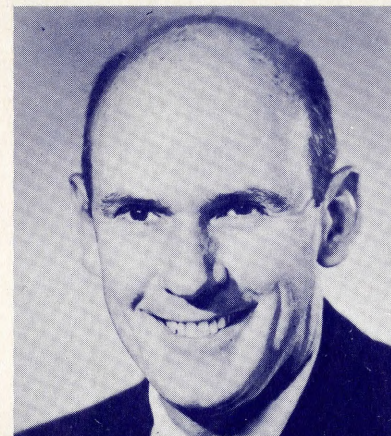
OUR seal of approval is on Henry Lopez who will handle the seal of California when he is elected Secretary of State.

For Attorney General Judge Stanley Mosk

For Member of Board of Equalization, 4th District Richard Nevins

RICHARD NEVINS is a lifelong resident of California, a graduate of Yale University in government studies and a veteran of World War II where he served with the Army Air Force.

He is married, the father of three sons, and has been in the insurance brokerage field for eleven years.

Richard Nevins believes that the fairness of our present State Aid for Schools is threatened by unequal property tax assessments between the counties.

He pledges a vigorous program of inter-county equalization and would give his full time, in accordance with the constitution, to carry out his duties as a member of the Board of Equalization.

Richard Nevins has further pledged to work for the removal of inequities in the interpretation of the Sales and Use Tax Law.

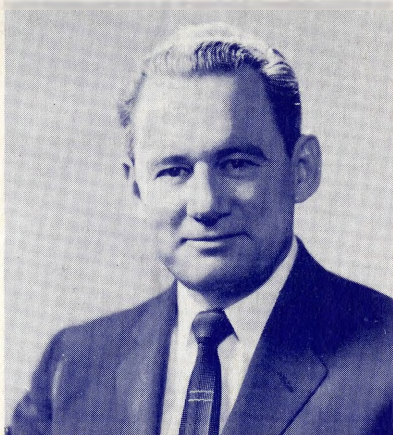
