VITAL ORGANS are CONTROLLED THROUGH NERVES

Dr. Ivan T. Hendren, D.C.

The vital organs of the body are supplied with two sets of nerves. Strange as it may seem, one of these sets is for the purpose of increasing function, while the other is for the purpose of decreasing function. Experiments have repeatedly shown that artificial stimulation of the heart through one of these nerves increases its rate and force, while artificial stimulation through the other set decreases both rate and force.

That same thing is true of the digestive system. If we artificially stimulate one set of nerves, the digestive juices are increased in quantity. The muscular action of the stomach and intestines is increased and if we stimulate the other set artificially the very opposite effect is had.

If the digestive system is to function normally and naturally, both sets of nerves must deliver a normal quota of vital energy. In brief the inhibiting power must delicately balance the activating power. Let either set of nerves outbalance the other in its delivery and there will be either excess function or deficient function.

The above explanation is not peculiar to the chiropractic profession. It is universally recognized by physiologists.

The chiropractor takes advantage of this knowledge and when he discovers abnormality in the digestive system or in any other vital organ, he seeks first to determine whether he is dealing with a condition of excess function or deficient function. This leads him to the knowledge of which of the two nerve supplies has interference somewhere along its path.

Having made this discovery he looks to those regions of the spine where the offending nerves make their exit. A careful examination of the spine reveals that certain bony segments are out of normal position and are producing interference with nerve transmission. Having made these discoveries the chiropractor's work is to replace the offending vertebrae and permit free transmission of nerve force. When this is done normal functioning of the organ is the natural consequence and when normal functioning takes place, symptoms such as pain, discomfort, headaches etc., automatically disappear.

The chiropractors method is essentially different than that employed by any other school of healing. He is concerned with effects only insofar as they point to those regions where the cause is to be found. He recognizes pain, including headaches, as a danger signal. He contends that to relieve the pain by the use of drugs without correcting the cause is as dangerous as to put out the red light at a crossing.

For every disease there is a cause. That cause must be corrected if health is to be restored. Just as normal, healthy expression of life depends upon forces within the body, so abnormal expression of life (disease) results from the inability of these internal powers to properly express themselves. It is this knowledge that leads us to the fundamental truism....

Delinguent Behavior

Death in the family may trigger delinquency in a son or daughter, the California Medical Association heard this week at its annual meeting in San Francis-

Dr. Mervyn Shoor and Mrs. Mary Helen Speed, Psychiatrist and Clinical Psychologist at Santa Clara County Juvenile Probation Department's Guidance Clinic, jointly presented a paper supporting this view Wednesday, April 18, at a Fairmont Hotel session of the C. M. A.

Findings of Dr. Shoor and Mrs. Speed indicate that delinquent behavior by children and adolescents is sometimes a substitute grief reaction. Delinquents, in this case, are not "children who hate" but "children who mourn, '

Although many authorities in the field of Juvenile Delinquency believe that "acting-out" behavior is correlated with antisocial attitudes, recent psychiatric consultation with twelve boys and girls indicated this is not necessarily true. In each case seen by Dr. Shoor and Mrs. Speed the youngster had previously conformed to the dicta of society, then a close family member died. After the death the youngster exploded into behavior that was so delinquent police and probation department action was necessary. The behavior in these cases included burglary, exhibitionism, and sexual promiscuity.

Timely psychiatric intervention, requested by staff of the Juvenile Probation Department, revealed that these juveniles, when faced with the meaning of loss and death, were not able to release their feelings in socially acceptable ways. They could not mourn. Instead they masked their grief, in pathological fashion, by various types of illegal behavior.

After clinical recognition of the meaning behind such behavior, various techniques were employed to help them work through the process of mourning and cope with their sorrow.

Their delinquent behavior dramatically subsided to their own relief, the relief of their families and the betterment of society.



MALARIA

Malaria has been one of the greatest killers of mankind. Up until recently, malaria killed and incapacitated millions of people each year and prevented man from utilizing millions of acres of arable land. In some countries of the world malaria has occupied first or second place as the main cause of death. In Mexico up until 1955 it was one of the three main causes of death and a determining factor against the economy of the country.

The number of people that died of malaria each year was greatly superseded by the number of people that were unable to work due to chills and fever caus-

ed by the disease.



TRAINING PERSONNEL

Malaria is transmitted by certain species of the anopheles mosquito that carry the infection from a person infected with malaria to a healthy individual. These mosquitos breed in water in the Tropical and Subtropical areas.

In the last few years the World Health Organization has launched an intensive campaign to eradicate this disease from the face of the earth. Because this mosquito only bites man inside the home, the eradication campaign is being accomplished by the spraying of residual insecticides such as DDT and dieldrin inside the home and other buildings found in malarial areas.

These insecticides on the walls and other surfaces of the buildings lasts for several months and are able to kill the mosquito after it enters the home and bites an infected person, thus preventing the mosquito from leaving the infected house and biting a healthy person in the neighborhood.

CIVIL DEFENSE

County Civil Defense Coordinator Frank E. Holt announced today that a whirlwind Countywide survey is already underway to pinpoint suitable bomb shelter areas in existing buildings throughout Santa Clara County.

At a meeting held Tuesday, January 9, 1962, in the County Supervisors' Chambers in San Jose, Commander H. L. Murphy of the Twelfth Naval District outlined a swift two-phase campaign to Mayors and representatives of county cities. County Supervisor Ralph H. Mehrkens was present with County Executive Howard W. Campen and Frank E. Holt, Civil Defense Coordinator for Santa Clara County.

The first phase will be a detailed town-by-town survey using aerial photographs and door-to-door investigation: Three teams of two men each will conduct the survey. The first phase will be complete in mid-April. The second will end in December.

Doing the survey under contract to the Navy will be two architectural engineering firms, for the City of San Jose, Ruth and Going, of San Jose; for the rest of the County, Abrams, Hollo and MKE Associates of Sunnyvale.

To be listed as a usable shelter, a structure must be 20 times safer under fallout than the outdoors, Commander Murphy stated. Shelters must also have at least 500 square feet of usable space.

Heads of the three survey teams are: Bruce D. McCreary, Louis Chan, and Frederick B. Bunting. McCreary heads the survey group.
