Dear Boy.

Day after I wrote to you I was real sick with a high fever. I dressed but was so heavy and drowsy and sick. I had to go to bed - (did not undress) and have the doctor and get more medicine. Mother was up and about. She went to ride with Mrs. Chaffield and caught a very bad cold had a chill high fever and is now very sick in bed. It is all my fault, if she had gone to ride with me she'd not have taken cold. Is not it a shame I get sick that way?

Father came up last night he brought your letter from Council Bluffs for which accept my thanks - he also brought a letter



from Mr Taylor for you - which I long to read  
but don't on principle as I should be  
disgusted with you if you signed mine -  
so I enclose it.

I am well enough now though my cold  
is still very troublesome. The children with  
the exception of Arag are well - he has a  
cold - Pam is behaving very badly at  
Julia's. If Mother is well enough I expect  
to go down to Brooklyn Tuesday - and I  
will find him at school at once.

I trust that you have arrived home all  
right. We all send you lots of love and  
wish we were with you - I am dreadfully  
worried about Mother.

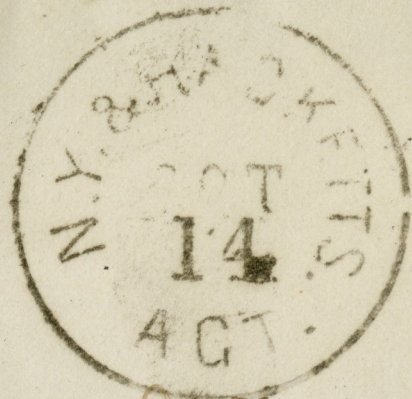
