Editorial...

At the beginning I would like to tell you that Hexus #1 did not come out as a split zine with "Zbrc", as it was intended, because of some problems in printing. For the first edition of Hexus, I received excellent feedback from many readers for the first issue and that gave me a good reason to continue my work on the zine. I was also happy to receive some well-intentioned criticism about the contents of the zine, which I kept in mind while working on this issue.

Since the publishing of the first issue a lot has happened for me, both positive and negative. The bands included in it are my personal choice and bands that have done a lot for the punk/HC scene all around the world. Most of the interviews were made "live" on Yahoo or MSN messenger so they would be more reliable and have a personal touch. I would specially like to thank these people for finding the time. This was the first interview I made life on MSN Messenger, so we kind of broke the ice with it. Irena and I made it with John Evicci, the drummer of Out Cold. And just to remind you that this band will play in Kumanovo on January 10, so brothers and sisters, friends and relatives, be there, you won't regret it!



hexus_zine: How are you John?
John: I'm very good thanks.
hexus_zines: How did the whole idea of
OUTCOLD come.

John: Well, we just loved punk rock & hardcore and decided to form a band. When we started in 1989 there were really no bands playing the good old style of punk & hardcore so we really felt like we were filling a void.

By, the way...can I make one small claification? The name isn't OUTCOLD, it's Out Cold...two words. People put the two words together all the time and I'm not sure why.

hexus_zines: As I know your brother is in the band.Who are the other members? Actually, my brother hasn't been in the band for 5 years. The current members are myself on drums, Mark Sheehan on guitar, Jaye Toothaker on bass and Micah Smalldone on guitar.

hexus_zine:tell me, which are your music influences?

John: Late 70s / early 80s punk & hardcore. Bands like the Bad Brains, Black Flag, Poison Idea, the Ramones, GBH, the Freeze, the Dead Boys, early Boston hardcore, etc.

hexus_zine: What are OUT COLD doing in their sparetime? I know that you're runing music label, but what about the others? John: Mark records bands. He has a small home studio thing set up and he really enjoys, doing that. The other 2...hmmmm...not too sure...hahaha. Other than doing other bands, that is.

hexus_zine:Tell me about your editions? you have 6 albums,right? John: Yes. 5 studio and 1 live.

hexus_zine:How are you accepted in your scene(in the states)?

John: Mostly we are ignored, but the few people who like us seem to really like us, so that's good.

hexus_zine:Tell me something about the

scene in you region?

John: The scene in Massachusetts is absolutely bursting at the seams with bands



and stuff. You could go to see a show every night of the week here in the Boston area. Most nights there's like 3 or 4 shows. It's quite a burgeoning music scene, always has been.

hexus_zine:What does the scene need to stay alive?

John: Energetic, inspired and creative

people. hexus_zine:You'll be playing in Skopje.What do you know about the Balkans?

John: Other than the horror stories I've heard about Bosnia, nothing much. I wish I knew more.

hexus_zine:Nothing about Kosovo and Macedonia?

John: As a matter of fact, I think the first time I ever even heard of Macedonia was when it was reported that the Kosovo refugees were going there by the scores and really imposing a burden on the country.

hexus_zine:Your oppinion on the 11 September attacks?

John: Absolutely horrible.

hexus_zine:Do you think America will attack Iraq?

John: Oh, man I have no idea. That's a real touch-and-go issue right now.

hexus_zine:Enough about war questions.What do you think about the hipocricy in the scene?

John: What exactly do you mean?

hexus_zine:2 faced zines, speking badly about the bands, Hear-say betweem the people?

John: Two-faced in the sense that they talk shit about the bands and then are nice to them in person?

hexus zine: Yes, about that.

John:That's wrong, obviously. If you don't like a band then you don't like a band. Just admit it. I don't feel the need to pretend I like someone's band just to be friendly or whatever. It's nothing personal, I just have my own tastes.

Zines should be no different.

hexus_zine: how long have you been present on the scene?

John: I've been into this type of music since 85/86.Right when things got shitty...hahaha. Just my luck

hexus_zine:Are you straight edge band? John: No.

hexus_zine: And your oppinion on sXe?
John: Straight edge is great. I applaud anyone who adopts that lifestyle. It's healthy and smart. Just don't force people to do the same or look down on people who don't.



Irena: Are you (or some of the band members) married?

John: No. None of us are married or have steady girlfriends for that matter.

hexus_zine:how old are the members of the band?

John: I'm 28. Mark is 33. I'm going to have to guess at the others' ages... Jaye is 25/ 26 I think and Micah is 23/24 I think.

hexus_zine: How is the work of your label aging?

John: It's been very hard and expensive and slow going but I think it's starting to gain momentum now. I hope so anyway.

hexus_zine:How manu bands have signed for your label?

John: Well, I don't "sign" bands like a major label would. I just work with them on a friendly basis, but so far I've worked with 12 bands.

Irena: Is "Out Cold" your first bend or you've been in other bands before?
John: It is actually my first band, although I've been in other bands on the side since.



hexus_zine:So you stand for DIY etics? John:By that do you mean am I against bands being involved with major labels? hexus_zine:WELL, YES, and by the way

Your attitude on major labels?

John: I have no problem with a band getting involved with a major label. I don't believe that's selling out or anything. It's a personal decision. The only thing I'm against is a band changing their sound with the express intent of getting signed, making money, getting famous....that kind of shit. That is selling out, not simply signing to a major. My feelings about major labels are...

Like anything major labels have their good points and their bad points. One the one hand they have the power to get the music to a vast number of people. If the early punk bands like the Ramones & the Sex Pistols didn't have a major label behind them chances are there wouldn't have been such a big movement. However, on the other hand...

With great power comes the opportunity to screw people and we all know how major labels can screw people right?

Hexus_zine: You have signed you first editions with Kengooro records. Why not whith American label?

John:Our first album actually came out on a local label called Lowell Records. After that, Kangaroo was the only label who was interested in working with us that's why we went with them. If we had offers from a US label we no doubt would've taken it.

Irena: Where, till now you have had a concerts... I mean in what countries and which one is your favourite?

John :So far we've played in England, Scotland, Wales, Iceland, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Finland, Belgium, Netherlands, Germany, Spain, and Japan. My favorite place was probably Iceland.

hexus_zine: Which bands from the current

scene do you like the most?

John :My favorite current bands are...hmmmm....let's see...Off the top of my head: Puffball, the Reaction, the Shods, the Hellacopters, the Hives, Bad Wizard, the Datsuns, Fu Manchu, New Bomb Turks, the Piranhas, Queens Of The Stone Age.

Hexus_zine: About your musuc.Who writtes the music and who the lyrics?
John says:Mark pretty much writes all the music and lyrics.



hexus_zine: And what are you lyrics about? John: Mostly about anger, frustration, depression, confusion, desperation, stuff like that.

Hexus_zine: Are your lyrics inspired by your personal life?

John: Yes, definitely. Our lyrics are very personal.

hexus_zine:Can we expect anything new from OUT COLD soon?

John:We're writing new material for a split 12" with 9 Shocks Terror, a split 7" with Crash & Burn, and hopefully a 6th studio album after that.

John:I hate that shit.Although the White, Stripes were on MTV and I love them. Don't know how a good band like that got on MTV... And the Hives too...they were on MTV. I guess some good music is getting trendy... hexus_zinesDo you thing MTV destroy the bands music?

Bizkaia Scene report

First of all I will talk a little about Bizkaia, Where it is situated, political aspects of life around here and so on. Bizkaia is a little area inside the Basque country and for all of you to know the Basque country is situated inside Spain, in the north and closer to the French border. The political life here is a bit complicated. Nationalism is very strong here. More or Spain, they want to create a new country, another new one (I won t talk about my idea of creating another new country cos that s something we don t need -and i need more than a page for that-... another one



isn t the solution... nothing more). Inside the independentist movement are people more radical that support the terrorist organization ETA, the political party that supports ETA is Batasuna and nowadays they are in troubles with the Spanish justice cos in a few months they will be prohibited (I have to say that nowadays the government in Spain is a right wing one (most of the politicians in this party come from the fascist party that Franco had in the past during his stay in the power. Party s name is Falange espa ola y de las JONS. The politicians I talked about are sons, daughters, grandsons, etc... and some like Fraga are still from those days). Right wing in Spain is shit as in everyplace in the world and they dont want to talk about solving this very important problem, is something that has no solution by now cos the government doesn t want to talk about solving the problem and ETA does the same. This means more and more deths every year... Well, apart from the political problems let s talk a bit about the hardcore punk scene around here. It isn t very big but it isn t small either. It would be bigger but there are some divisions that



don t allow that. More or less a lot of punks don t go to hardcore shows and the sma egoes with hardcore guys. I know it s all about musical tastes but that's something that doesn t allow to have more than 200 people in shows. Another clear division is between punk / hardcore people and the independentist people I talked about before. They have their "own" bands and some use to go to shows, people inside the squat movement (there s a big and strong squat movement here with a lot of anarchist people and independentist people involved into it but not working together. I will explain this thing, it s supposed to be that they are fighting the same fight but it isn t true... main problem (and this isn t my opinion, it's what really happens here) is that independentists always

try to manipulate everything in favour of their independentism and that's something that has nothing to do with anarchist people. They only supports what is about helping independentism, helping their political prisoners, their organizations, their bands (I have to say here they have their own bands supporting their cause) and so on... I can imagine all people working together to fight the right wing here and it would be a really strong movement, but that s impossible nowdays. Now the musical thing concerning the hardcore punk movement. About the hardcore punk

community here I have to say that there are no divisions between emo, SXE, punk and so on, except the classical musical division, but nothing more than that. Now I will talk about bands I know. Maybe I'll forget someone but I ll try to do my best, ok?. FALLEN is maybe one of the most known bands from the area. Their music is metal oriented in the vein of Unbroken. First Snapcase or Lasy Indecision. They have 3 split cds out and in a month their new record will be out on CD and LP. They are planning to do a tour around East Europe (around your area). We hope we can do it cos I sing in this band. Another band is CRICKBAT, I m in this band too and it's more old school oriented in the vein of Ignite, Unity, first Intensity or Insted. 2 split cds out and waiting for the 3rd one. SPANDAU BULLET is another band I m into. It s more cllasical. Rawer and faster hardcore in the vein of Seein red more or less. Nothing recorded by now but planning to do it. 5000 RPM is a melodic hardcore band. They are a very young band although they are since 1998 together and playing. They have improved a lot from their begining and they recorded a demo but I have no notice about it. I know they sell it DIY but nothing more. NEILA is metal oriented in the vein of As I Bleed, Vision



of Disorder, Will Haven or His Hero Is Gone. They have a CD out on *In My Heart Empire* and planning to record again for another CD. CORDURA is emorockin hardcore a la Boy Sets Fire or Grade and A Little Timebomb (last record of course). They will release their first recording on Fragment when they record the songs. I think it will be a very good record. JAN is a "veteran" hardcore punk band around here. They have 3 cds out and play a lot. Now they have changed some of their members but they are playing again and a lot. Classical hardcore punk! RESTONS SOBRES is another fast and political hardcore act. They released a demotape and CD both on DDT. They are making a pause nowadays cos their drummer is working abroad, if I m not wrong he's working in Scotland or England, I m not sure. NCO is melodic hardcore oriented with nothing recorded by now. A year ago they played a lot of shows but I don I know why they have stopped... XIMEL contains former member from Fallen. Their music is rare and a mixture between Neurosis and DUT (a Basque band), very instrumental and repetitive... Sometimes they remind of Helmet

too. SIMCA is very active nowadays. Thay are playing a lot presenting their new and fisrt record. This is emorock oriented a la Aina, Samiam, etc. If you know Bcore disc releases that kind of stuff. MALESTAR is street punk band. I saw them live but they have released a new CD on WC that is working well. Another band in this style is SUBVERSION X. Make no mistake about it, they aren t SXE, their singer has been a junk for years, now is an alcoholic but is off heroin... they are well known through all Spain. They did a 7" and a CD and from what I know they have another one recorded but not released by now. I never saw them live cos it s not my style of music and life. The punk and drugs and destroy yourself kind of lifestyle is very far away from what I think. LOS HUEVOS DE KINDER is more punk rock oriented band with a CD out on DDT. It



contains member from JAN (drummer playing bass). They are active as fuck! AZADAZO is classical punk band with a demo tape out. They are really active and DIY and non profit guys. They use to organize a fest every year called "Agropunk" where a lot of punk hardcore bands play in 2 days and is for free. A very good fest to go and enjoy. The only one I don't like from that fest is the amount of drugs running from hand to hand but, hey, for a lot of people drugs and punk are the same. ULTIMA NEURONA is a band that is plannig to record now. I never saw them so I have no idea what they do... oh! Wait, now I remember that I saw them live with Fleas And Lice (I think) if I m not wrong is classic hardcore punk and political stuff as well. DBC died but they are alive again with another name. They recorded a demo CD and sold it DIY. Now a member is playing in Crickbat. EVOLVER has a new record and it's relly hot. Their kind of music is the crazy ferret or hidrahead style so of you love crazy metal this is your band. They had a band before called Rose Mary Killers and that recorded a CD but now thay are dead and Evolver is their new band and I have to say they are brutal as fuck! Let s finish with XXL, melodic punk rock band and a band that is still around and they started in 1994 more or less. Now they stopped and I don t know why. They have 3 cds out and planning to record another one. What is very important to me is that these guys are still the same with the past of the years. They strated with the Green Day and Offspring boom but they are now the same and that means they are and they were not in this for the trend as a lot of those I know from that times. That s all folks concerning bands. About zines, it's now almost dead because of internet or whatever but all around Spain (not only here) people don t do zines. Here



I know mine, IN MY HEART ZINE which is in the 4th issue and some political ones like ULTIMO REDUCTO which released two issues at the same time. EKINTZA ZUZENA is more or less like a political mag written in Euskera (our language with Spanish) and I don t remember more. There are only two labels: mine IN MY HEART, EMPIRE which is a distro list too with mail order catalog and DDT which has released a lot of bands during the past few years from punk to metal. 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
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
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Gustavo (who plays bass too) on vocals, added to the guitars of Mois s and beats of Michel. We're a political band, we have lyrics about resistance and fight, like true "alert screams" (Gritos de Alerta in english), but we've lots of critics for the hardcore scene too. We have made and organized lots of gigs here, and plus friends from another bands in Porto Alegre we're working to organize a Squat here, this and other activities make us an active group of people not just another hipocrite punk band.

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TWO SIDES

Once upon a time on a beautiful shiny Sunday afternoon, my assistant Koljo and I met with Zaffo (guitar) and Kecho (drums) in a cafŭ in Skopje where Kecho works. This interview was made with constant interruptions, because Kecho had to serve his guests. I'd like to emphasize that 2 SIDES is one of my favorite bands. They are perfect musicians and my close friends, so that was reason enough for this interview. RESPECT THIS BAND.



-The ordinary question, band history, how did it all started?

Zaffo: It all started two years ago. Actually in April 2000, but not with this crew. At the beginning Rila and Janko were in the band, we had two vocals. After that, they left the band. After that Pavel comes in the band, as a bass player. This crew plays till now.

-Tell me in which bands have you played be-

Zaffo: I have played in Boombyx, and in CBR which was a project made up from members from different bands, and we had only one gig. We played NY HC. From the others, Kecho had played in the first crew in Superhiks, Zoki in Smut and in Hexus, Pavel in Sors, Suns, and in Seth. Spaski hasn't played anywhere.

-What is the meaning of 2 sides?

Zaffo: Kecho has named the band, after the Gorila Biscuits song.

Kecho: In every other song I have heard this word, it sounded good, but it doesn't have any meaning. Every one can interpret the name how ever he whishes

-You have started as a band with two vocals. After a while one of them (Rila) has left the band. What was the reason?

Zaffo: My opinion is that the other didn't like his attitude. So we had to tell him to leave the band. But it didn't change a thing between us, we are still friends, and no one has anything against him.

Kecho: There was no particular reason, just the way of work... We are still friends, I like his new band SKO2, which is very good band, one of the best in Macedonia.

-Tell me something about your lyrics. Who writes them and what are they about?

Zaffo: 80% of the lyrics are written by Spaski, but there are a few written by me and Zoki. We make the music together. Most of the new songs are Zoki's, cause I'm having a down period and I have no inspiration. I hope this won't last long. The songs are mostly about friendship, everyday events, love... Anyway we don't sing about political and social issues.

-You have published Cdep for lithium records. After that you had a negotiation with the German label "Band Worm" Records, to publish that as LP

Zaffo: Nothing has come up, because of disinter-



estedness, because the things weren't run on time. The polisher gave up from all. I called him in Germany, to see what was going on, and he told me that nothing will come up.

-Will you search a new label to publish that LP, or?

Kecho: That LP was contented from the first EP, and a few demo songs, the EP is already published. So we are searching for labels, cause we want out work to be seen out of Macedonia. Lithium Records doesn't have distro, so we are on our own.

-Lithium Records are your native label?

Yes, we had one year deal, and an agreement to publish that EP.

-Are you looking for another label?

Kecho: Well in Macedonia there aren't other labels, except Lithium, and a few other labels which don't work with this kind of music.

-Will you work with DIY publishers? (Kojlo) Kecho: If we could, yes we would. But not on



burned CDs.

-In the Macedonian scene there were rumors that you had played for 100 euro for political purposes

Zaffo: No we had not, we played for 250 euro! Ha ha ha That is the lowest price for a gig.

Kecho: Here in Macedonia everything is about taking money from the political parties. It wasn't a political party, we played for one "Union for better Kumanovo".

Zaffo: I don't give a shit for who do I play, as long as I'm paid.

-One part of this scene says that Two sides



are playing to catch girls, for fame. What would you say to this?

Zaffo: What can I say, there are people who like us, and there are people who don't like us. We do our best.

Kecho: I think that they are people who have nothing to do with this scene, because I am in the scene since 1992 and I can say that I know a lot of things. First of all before that we didn't even have a scene. We were a few people who managed to stay, so I thing that they don't have the right to say such a thing.

-Are you satisfied with fame you have gained? Kecho: I don't think we can talk about that, because you cant measure that. You cant see that through sealing CDs or...

- Do you think that the Macedonian scene is united? Do you think that there is cooperation between the people included, be-

tween the bands?

Zaffo: I think that for example the anarchists are sticking together. They are always protesting about something, they do something. But the others aren't doing anything. Everyone watches for him self. It looks like there is jealousy between the bands. There is no cooperation.

Kecho: I think that the scene is getting better. I'm not talking just about gigs, there isn't few cause there aren't organizers. But one of the things that are getting better is the fanzine, which is good to have. So in the future if we continue to be open minded and to work hard, we should have a good scene.



- Which of the domestic bands do you like the most?

Zaffo: Well, Sidewalk were good when they existed, Smut are also good, by the way I play with them. Hexus were good, they had interesting melodic songs...

Kecho: One who is working at the moment SK02.

- A general question. What's most important

thing in your life?

Zaffo: To me, the most important thing is to succeed in life, to leave something behind, something I'll be remembered by. I plan on having a normal life and means for a normal life.

- Does that mean getting those means by playing music, by using your spare time to play in a band?

Zaffo: Yes! But I don't plan on making a lot of many, just enough to cover the recording expenses.

Kecho: Answering your question: if we would like to make money on music, we would naturally like to cover our expenses, because it costs a lot to by music equipment, rent a garage and, most of all on accessories: strings, drumstick, cymbals... It would be normal to get some money from playing to cover these expenses. You know, you can't

say "I'm a punk and I play for free, because you won't be on the scene at all.

- So this money is still used for the good of



the scene?

Zaffo: Yes, I would surely not buy a new guitar or... It would be great if I made enough money to by a new instrument, but... As I said, this money is used for recording new stuff, a new album.

 And tell me, is the music all that meters, or is the message important too, considering that punk HC bands are divided into commercial and underground, anarcho bands that have a different ideology. In which group would you put

2 SIDES in this pseudo division?

Zaffo: I look at this division as a sort of a business. All labels in the western countries work for profit from the bands. On the anarcho scene, as I see in Skopje, play local gigs, but I think they can't have great success, except maybe in a limited region, but nothing more. On the other hand, bands that play classic punk-rock and sing in English have better chance of succeeding abroad But as I said this is just a business.

Kecho: All this grumping about ideology is just bullshit. It all comes down to making money. All those bands who bullshit about not being commercial should give their CD's for free, and not

sell them for \$20.

Zaffo: I against what SUPERHIKS did, they changed their music, started writing their lyrics in Macedonian so they can succeed on the Macedonian popular scene. If I release an album, I wouldn't like it to cost 600 denars, but 200 or 300 so anyone can buy it.

Kecho: It all depends on how much money will be spent on its release. If it's an original CD we'll try

to make the price acceptable.

-Do you think that SUPERHIKS lost a lot of their underground fans? I'm asking you as a former member of SUPERHIKS.

Kecho: No, I don't think so, cause they still play their older stuff. I think they did this so people would start listening to this kind of music and that's good. I expect them to publish a new album that will resemble their old style.

Zaffo: It's a fact that they gained popularity, but they threw away their previous style. They used to be a punk band and now they are a pop ska band. I don't know what their goal is, maybe they are forced to do so, but I think that a band can't succeed abroad with lyrics on Macedonian.

-Would 2 SIDES appear on MTV, if they have a chance?

Kecho: Yes, why not. Any bullshit against MTV is dumb. It is an industry like any other. If you're not their puppet, it's quite normal to have a video on any TV station.

-All the members of 2 SIDES listen to different music. What brings you together?

Zaffo: The friendship. The fact that we listen to different music and have different opinions is a big plus for the band. This is a good thing, because we all take part in the making of new songs. Everyone adds something from the stuff he listens to and thus we create our own style.

-What are your musical influences?

Zaffo: Mostly bands like H2O, MILLENCOLIN, VISION ... I can't say for sure, we all like different stuff. These are my favorite bands. Kecho likes others.

Kecho: I can't name a specific band that influenced our music the most, cause, as Zaffo said we all listen to different bands and everyone adds something from his favorite bands in our music.

-What do you do besides music? Zaffo: I work in air traffic control.

Kecho: I work in a cafй and I'm also a student.

-A few months ago there was a fight at one of your gigs. Without going into detail about this



fight, I'd like to know what's your opinion on violence on gigs.

Zaffo: I can't approve of this. This kind of things shouldn't happen. I look at our gigs as entertainment, as a chance to have a good time, but not as a place for violence. I don't approve violence.

-Is your song "Bad Scene" from you new demo connected to this issue?

Zaffo: Yes, I wrote this song and it's about our scene, the Macedonian scene. First of all it's not really a scene. The bands show up and disappear quickly. A lot of younger people start playing while they're in high school, but give up as soon as they enroll in college and become "normal" people. There is only a handful of people who really work hard for the good of the scene.

-What do you think makes the scene in

Macedonia divided?

I've noticed that there is a loot of jealousy, envy, and hypocrisy between the bends, hearsay. But we don't care about that, we'll just mind our own business and keep on working.

-Zaffo tell me, how did you start working with

SMUT, your second band?

Zaffo: We have known each other for a long time.



They have had some problems and they invited me to play with them. I'm going to keep on playing with them as long as I can.

-Another question for Zaffo: How many girls have you had?

Zaffo: ??? (Everybody laughing)

-Just kidding. I have another question. You have a lot of tattoos. Do they have a meaning? Zaffo: I don't care if they have meaning. I have had a band name tattooed (H2O). I tattoo thing I like. I'd tattoo anything I like on myself.

-How do you see HC, just as a music style or? Zaffo: I understand HC as a way of life, as being different from the others, from the "normal" way of life, not to be a regular guy, to listen to a different kind of music, wear different clothes.

-Is it a way of life or just an external appearance?

Zaffo: As for me, I don't look at it as being different, for example I'm a HC man you're a punk or ska, I just listen to music I like, I do as I see fit and I don't give a shit about what other people think. Kecho: I'd like to comment on this, cause the meaning of the word has been worn out. The real HC music went hand in hand with living in squats and other things related to that way of life. The definition of HC nowadays is different, squats no longer exist in countries like Macedonia because it's a crime and the police would prosecute the members. The best definition of HC, and any normal life for me is: just be yourself and live your life as you see fit.

 Your opinion on straight edge, as a style of music and as a way of life?

Kecho: I have very high opinion for them, but it can't function here. It's much more expensive to live without than with meat. It's OK not to smoke or drink alcohol if it harms your health, but I think that this thing about SxE is just too exagger-

ated by the Americans who have everything and don't respect that, so now they act like:"We're angry with the whole world and we'll figure out something new". Everything is OK when it's within normal range.

Zaffo: The SXE is a good movement, as long as it stands for a healthy way of life. If some can live healthy, I respect that. But I couldn't live like that, cause I like getting drunk sometimes.

-I'm interested in your attitude towards the Macedonian popular (no-talent) pop scene.


Zaffo: That's normal, there's a popular scene in every country. It doesn't bother me; I'm just not interested in it. There always has been and there always will be such people.

-What can we expect from 2 SIDES soon?

Zaffo: A new album. I don't know when, but it will surely come out soon. We have new songs and we're working on it.

-Is the new material different from your old stuff?

Zaffo: Yes, the new songs are a bit more melodic and a bit softer, but there is no big difference. Kecho: The songs are more mature, the production is better then the first EP that was made in a hurry. I think that there's no big difference,



except that we're more mature now. What is 2 SIDES view of things?

Zaffo: We are five people with different views on life. When we're on stage the first thing we care about is sounding good, we try not to make mistakes, to look good. We don't really have a message, we're not trying to change the world, we just see our music as a way to have fun and we try to sound as good as possible.

-Final message.

Zaffo: Folks, just mind your own business.

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At the end I must add that after making this interview Zaffo left the band, but regardless of that Two Sides continue their struggle.

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POINT BLANK

Point Blank was formed at the beginning of 2000 and represents the crowning of the friendship, the energy and the strong desire to make music of the band members. The Members are: Damjan (vocals), Bazhe (guitar), Meto (guitar), Dimitri (bass-guitar) and Vlado (drums). They are the "guilty parties" for the energ turned into music accords, which reveals the creativity and the desire to play music. The band comes from Skopje and is one of the many garage bands in the city. The bands intention was to create a band, which through its powerful riffs, the deep sound of the drum, strong bass-guitar and vocal full of energy will be original and well accepted by the underground audience and dictate the way Point Blank will go on playing.

Our sound was influenced by different styles of music because all bend members listen to different music. Bands that influenced us the most are: Deftones, Sistem Of A Down, Primus, Dream Theater, NOFX, Millencolin and many others. P.S.We're always available for contact!

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MORE BOMBS OVER BAGHDAD

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"What a country calls its vital economic interests are not the things which enable its citizens to live, but the things which enable it to make war." - Simone Weil (1909-1943), French Philosopher Once again, after almost a decade has passed, the fiendish roar of American and British jets echoed in the suburbs of Baghdad, Iraq, and a deadly rain of bombs once again hits one of the oldest cities on earth. Immediately, the corporate media rushed to the airwaves to promote the bombings, and Bush Administration officials announced that the aerial attacks on the Iraqi capital were acts of "pre emptive self-defence." Once again, the corporatepolitical media launch into the deionisation game, with attacks on a "Hitler"-like Saddam Hussein, with foreboding threats of Iraq developing "weapons of mass destruction," - yeah, uh huh. George Bush II announces that this, his first substantive international action (other than a contemporaneous photo-op with Mexico's Vicente Fox), was meant to "send a message" to Hussein. His Dynastic, Unroyal Highness did not deign to tell his subjects what the "message" really was. This writer will try. The great English writer, George Orwell, in his prophetic novel of an intrusive, panoptic, totalitarian state, "1984", illustrated with brilliant clarity the capacity of such states to utilize words that mean exactly the opposite of what they were proferred to mean. And empires do what they do for one real reason: they can.



SMITTEN RECORDS

How did you start the label? Well it started in a diner in 1999, some friends and I were talking about how there is nothing good happening in the music scene around here, so I started thinking about what I could do. I always love introducing new music to people and helping out bands. So I decided that I have

nothing better to do with my life so I will devote it to running a label. I locked myself in my house for a year and a half and just made as many contacts as I could. So it really started in 1999 but we did our 1st release in 2002. How many bands do you work for, and name some of them? We have 7 really good bands. Anti-Anti from FL, the Swamp Kids from PA, Left Behind from PA, the Give Ups from OH, the Pseudo-Dropouts from OK, Dead Letter Dept. from ONT, and VM Collision from NY. And we will be bring on a new band soon. (so if you are in a good power pop punk band, send a demo). Do you play in some band? No, not anymore. I would love to be in a band but running a label is a full time job, so I chose the label. I play every night and every now and then with some friends but my first love is the label. Besides with the label I still get to do all the fun stuff like tour and go to a million shows. What kind of muzic style do you prefer to represent? As of now the label is all Power Pop Punk bands. How many editions have released? We have released seven 7"s and a comp CD as of Oct 02. We wanted to release all the bands on vinyl first because frankly, vinyl kicks ass. All our 7" releases are limited to 500 copies. But there are many, many more to come like full CD's from all the bands and some more comps. Is it hard to run a label and what would you say to the people who want? To start this kind of work? This is the hardest thing I have ever had to do. The only advice I could give to someone is, stop talking about doing it and get off your ass and do it. And always love what you do. Do you work something besides this? Yes, I am a hydraulic engineer. It isn't the cleanest job, but hell I get to work

on trucks with tires twice the size of me. And it pays the bills to keep this going. Why are you doing this (for money, to develop the scene, or to gain something else)? HAHAHA money. Yeah right, in the past 7 months I put up \$12,000 and made \$2,000. So count money out. The reason I do this is the love for the music. I really do love to help out bands and get people to hear something they probably never would have heard. How much effort & money does this thing take? 101%. Some people say I am an idiot for doing this. but the way I look at it is: if I died today, what good would money do me? But if something happened to me now, at least the bands would have something. Do you have profit? A little one. But any money we make goes right to the bands for more mech like stickers, buttons, releases, shirts, ect. As I said before we lost \$10,000 in the past 7 months. So I would have to say the only profit is knowing that these bands are now given a much bigger chance to be heard. Future plans? Tons of more releases and tours. In fact we are planning a UK tour for the summer of 2003 for some of our bands. So this is not the last you will be hearing from us. We are here to stay, I will never stop releasing kick ass music. Until next time, keep rocking and thank you for your time and support. Keep Rocking !!!

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

HEXUS: Is it true that the sound of these Cd is very alike Blink 182?

Hardslug: Billy Bones says: "Get the fuck outta here!!!!!" and the Kid is laughing his ass off.

HEXUS: © Good answer

Hardslug: They only wish they
could sound like us!!!!

HEXUS: You are members of the punk scene for a long time. How is it now compared from before? Hardslug: Sean is here now - He'll start on this

Sean: Now I see punk kids at convenience stores, & in high schools it's widely accepted. It's not dangerous to be punk rock anymore. Easier to get gigs.

Billy: It was fresh back then - been stepped on hard over the years but now there's a lot of good shit and energy coming out.

Hardslug: I've been oblivious to change. Just been enjoying my shit for years. Never really bought new records over last 15 years

HEXUS: How did you start the cooperation with Dr Strange?

Hardslug: He was chatting with a guy from the Controllers who mentioned The Skulls, and Bill (Dr Strange) was really interested in putting a Skulls record out. We were looking for the right label at the time, and when we spoke with him, we drove out to meet him. After meeting him, we realised he was a very straight guy and just felt good. We did the deal very soon after and the rest is history

HEXUS: What are your lyrics about, do they have some message?

Billy: Yeah, you know, some do. Some are tongue in cheek, some have a message and some are designed to maybe save a life someday. Our stuffs very topical. For instance, we just wrote a song about kids killing each other at school.

HEXUS: What kept you together all these years?(Off the record, you have a gig ay?) Hardslug: Well, the Skulls haven't been together all these years. The only original member was Billy Bones, and he and Hardslug hooked up and started a band. When the Kid and Sean fell in, we were asked to do some



Skulls shows, we ! did and it just seemed to work. We just decided to call the new band the Skulls but we are essentially a new band. We play a lot of the old Skulls stuff but are constantly writing new material which EVERYBODY says is really good, as good if not better than the old stuff. -Off the record. ves we do.



HEXUS: What do you work besides music? Hardslug. Billy Bones is the best heavy-duty Sean. There's always someone that wants more industrial equipment salesperson in the entire control than they can handle. world, and he can't wait to meet somebody Hardslug. There's not enough love. I mean that. carpenter since that guy that used to hang Kid. Huh? of the most successful babe magnets ever to including their own family tread the stage. Hardslug sells himself, with or without shell.

HEXUS: Are you members of some organisation like ALF, Earth First ...?

Hardslug. No

HEXUS: The rise of the punk scene went in hunt with the rise of anarchist's movement, do you support this ideology?

Hardslug: Anarchy just won't work. Billy: Music should be about fun.

Sean: Anarchy's fun when your 15 years old, until you have to find your way into the real world

Kid: Huh?

HEXUS: What do you think what is the reason the anarchism lost it's basic ideology?

Hardslug: In today's 1st world society, there needs to be some kind of structure. Without it, things would simply crumble into a dog eat dog situation, seen Mad Max? -? The trouble with the anarchist groups is that they are simply too small to make a difference, and to get big enough to make any difference, they must become a structure in themselves therefore it becomes a contradiction.

HEXUS: Do you support the protest of the antiglobalist movement?

Kid: Send me a pamphlet so I can read up on it



I'm interested about your musical influences because your music is usually genre. Also I' want to know what sort of literature do you read?

Everyone in the band has got different influences, so I can speak only for myself. I grew up with all those 80's punk-Hc bands. I never like most of early English stuff but

basically German and U.S. bands such as Minor Threat, MDS, Necros, Misfits, Negative Approach and many, many more. Now I still listen to old hardcore bands. I love most of Boston bands, such as Jerry's kids, Fu's, Gang green, Deep wound, but also stuff like Dinosaur JR, Les savy fav, Flamingo Massacres and many many more. I guess I don't have just one band that I could say "OK, this one has influenced me lot...", except for maybe Husker Du and Cringer ©...

I love all kinds of art and whatever I have time, I try to read as many as I can. I think one book that kind inspired me a lot is "100 years of solitude" by general Gabriel Garcia Marques. Some others too.

You made a benefit CD/LP for A.B.C. Innsbruck. Is this your first benefit release? Is this benefit your idea? No, we already did some other benefit stuff. The split LP with Active Minds, for example was a benefit for Dave Calendar fund, an animal rights activist who was in jail. It's been some kind of common idea that resulted out of a long friendship with Patric from A.b.c. Innsbruck. Our next LP is going to be benefit for homeless people.

What anarchy means to you?

Huh, ...this is kind of question people are expecting to answer it right away, but to be honest. I guess that each day I could answer it in a different way. I think tonight I would describe it as " the most beautiful thing that



could happen to us if we could rid of both inequality and greed".

What about G-8 (anti globalization) protests? Have you been involved in some of those



protests?

No, I have not been to any of all the places, but I tried to follow as much as possible on independent radio stations and Internet web sites. It's really amazing to see how many people are fighting against globalization and even though most of the states are again reaching with repression, people are not afraid and they keep going on. I have attended a meeting that was held by a left wing party over here and the invited Jose Bove. I really appreciate most of what he said and I do have a lot of respect for his work the anti globalization movement needs radical activists and also people like Bove who are kind of "hyped" by the media

"The world is not for sale" and the next few years will prove it.

Let's get back on the band again. How often do you have gigs? Who is writing the music and the lyrics, and how many records do you sell? (Don't get me wrong about this question, I know that this is not my business but I'm just curious)

Well, we usually play some 70-80 shows a year. This year has been really fucked up and we played maybe 40-50 shows cause of several reasons. We started planning a tour schedule for next year and so far looks pretty good. We all hope it's gonna be a "better" year and we don't get into so much trouble. This year's been a pain in the ass and everything that was supposed to go wrong just went wrong.

I write all the lyrics and come up with the most of the music but I would actually say that we

create all the songs together. How many records do we sell? Well, we had some 9000 copies of the A.B.C. printed (a few repressed) and sold all of em. It's probablu going to be re-issued bu some other label, cause we don't feel like doing it ourselves once again. Too manu people have been ripping us off and we're really tired of these assholes. I actually have the impression that "DIY punk rock" is full of rip-off assholes and they are destroying a lot. I don't blame those who are doing it sincere and

honest, but I blame those who show up from one second to another, start talking and preaching like hell, start offering you and shit like that, and few months or maybe years lately for a government cause it makes much money they're gonna!!! We strongly support the DIY movement, but after a while you become more and more skeptical and frustrated...... but there is also (and I still believe the majority) a hell of lot of good people around !!! Thank for that!

Your opinion about sexism? Solution for that problem?

Solution? Wow, I don't come up with solutions I wouldn't dare saying "this is right and this is wrong". In my opinion sexism is not a problem that you can wipe out from one day to another. discussions It takes a long, long, long time, same goes homophobia, racism, specism ...

The Pope told me to tell you that he wants to we're never buy you a drink, he, he, he ... What about the religion?

I would accept. I like free beer or wine, so I'd go problems, but for a drink. If he pays I don't mind. I'm glad to see that less people are talking the pope for serious though I know that institutionalized religion still has a lot of power and impact on the people. Same shit for the Luxemburg, we're should read still fighting for the separation of church and state (actually we'd all rather have an abolitions hould of church and state).... Any kind of religion for



example teaches sexism, so one could say "abolish religion and uou abolish sexism" (would be too easy). I think that everyone has the right to believe in whatever he or she wants, but everyone should also have right NOT to believe, or chose what to believe, or chose if one wants to be baptized, chose if one wants to go to whatever church, chose if one wants to be taught about religion. Greetings from Macedonia

Skopje scene raport

Macedonia is a small country (25.713 sq. km.) situated on the Balkan Peninsula, in South-Eastern Europe. Its neighbors are Yugoslavia, Bulgaria, Greece and Albania. I'm writing this, because lot of people doesn't know where my country is located, I've even received questions like: "Do you have electricity?" "Have you ever seen a TV?" etc. Some historians say that Alexander the Great comes from Macedonia, others say he comes from Greece...

The subject of this article is, however, the punk/HC scene here. I'm on this scene for about ten years, so I can say something about the scene in those days and now. Ten years ago there were only three bands that played local gigs only and most people found them ridiculous because of their attitudes and their music. Nobody was even thinking of making a zine. I have learned from bands like Brigade O.D. (crust-punk), Bloody George (grind-core), Morbid Joker (punk) and New police state (Old school punk). From these bands only the last is still on the scene. As time passes on, things are changing. A lot of bands with many different music stiles have appeared on the scene. One of the most successful is Superhiks, and I can proudly say that they are our pride. They play ska-punk; they have one album, three video clips, from which one can be seen on MTV. Smut is new school band, and they too have one edition. Tank warning net play grind-core. They started like two vocal band, but one of the members goes out of the band. They have a few editions on EP and Tapes. FPO and Dedicated for life are two Macedonian straight edge bands, so we have a bit from everything. Two sides - my favorite band play old school HC. They have one CDEP for our one and only Macedonian underground label Lithium records. For Lithium records edition have Parketi from Bitola, which are playing punk rock, and they have very comic lyrics. New name that has appeared on our scene are Fragment, which play melodic HC. Two of their members played in the no longer existing Sidewalk, which had broke up by unknown reasons. How ever Fragment continued the work of Sidewalk. When we talk about melodic punk I would like to mention my former band Hexus, but except a few gigs and one demo tape, we didn't continue to work. Fluks are one of the oldest and still active bands, and they play very powerful HC. Sk02 have started as a project band but soon after they were very active, and they represented them selves with very happy punk-rock songs. Point Blank are relatively new band but they are promising

band. You cannot define their style, so I can only say, they are very original.

That would be about all for the most impressive bands from Skopje. I could add few words about zines. We do not have many, but I think enough is that someone started, and some people have started to create their own. Zbrc, So glava niz zid, Cor cordis, Vampire, Factory smog..., Glas, Progres, Kaka, Spirit, Hexus are just part of what you can call the zine scene. Some of them are just part of the history, but we have big respect for them and the people who made them.

This is what my friend Sean (editor of ZBRC zine) has to say about this:

THERE IS BUT AS IF THERE ISN'T

Macedonia has been an oasis of spat or subculture enthusiasm for a long time, a story that functions well in a place where the basic foundations of a strong underground scene are still being built. We mustn't forget, the foundation of any scene is the communication; the problem is, however, that we're closed up to the circulation, which is necessary for the education of people. Maybe the general conditions don't alow this, Because nobody is interested in noticing the conditions in which bands, albums and zines are being created and concerts are being played. This underground scene has given a lot of high-quality bands that no longer exist, but it's a good thing that the scene is like a wheel and it keeps on turning. BRIGADE OD, NEW POLICE STATE, F.P.O, SMUT, T.W.N., FLUKS, POINT BLANK, TWO SIDES, SINIAC, VERKA, FRAGMENT, PARKETI, SK,O2, TK.SK, B.B,K, TRACERI, SIDEWALK, MIZERIJA, RUT, DEDICATED FOR LIFE, DIVERGE, HEXUS... It's a good thing also that a firm foundation for good results is being built, but not through competition. The problem with clubs, room for practicing, equipment, recording studios etc. makes the existence of the fragile scene even more difficult. There are, but as if there aren't any. We must fight for ourselves if we want to change something. The fact that this country functions on remote control makes me sick, and the foreign power doesn't give a damn how, or if I survive. Between these lines you'll notice the problems of the existence of the subculture enthusiasm. If you think you can help, join in and keep pushing the wheel as long as you can, and then create someone else who will do the same thing.

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How is my life being controled? Episode: Killing the boredom (free choice? -my ass!)

Very rarely, when I am on a bus, I observe people's face expressions. So many diversity on one place. There are all kinds of them; young, old, female, male, smiling, mad, talking, arrogant, joyful, friendly, happy or sad human beings. Then I think about how do they live, what kind of joy and sorrow they carry within. (Huh, this is pathetic!) Can they realize the apathy and the tragedy of their lifes? Someone would say that there aren't just tragical things in life and that we should be focused on the positive ones. But that's bullshit. I agree that I shouldn't whine and cry about it all the time. But how can I be indifferent to the despair in life when I see so much of it every day. You can be indifferent only if you don't see the world with higher consciousness and responsibility, or at least little sympathy. And that means you have very low IQ. It's sad to say, but the majority of people are just like that. Their "life philosophy" comes down to one thinghedonism. Their method for obtaining happiness is indulgence through entertainment or, better sad, killing boredom. Which if it becomes an objective for itself, it turns in to the most shallow and least creative thing to do. How can you be entertained if you can afford it? So, money is necessary condition. That's why whole industries are based on that principle, which are called entertainment industries. Think about the television, radio, the whole popular music industry, sport (think on any, soccer, basketball, Formula 1...), Hollywood and the film industry, Disneyland, any computer games, consoles as Nintendo's, Sony's, any night life in any city on this planet, alcohol industry, ect. I have nothing against having fun, but I think that we have to be aware of these facts. It seem's so stupid to me why people are so bored with their lifes and have to be entertained. Have any one of them thought about the fact that they are being abused and put in to the lowest level (as just a consumer or a statistic number) in the hierarchical pyramid of the big entertainment industries? I doubt it. And when their money is gone, the entertainment's gone to, And what happens? They work their asses of just to be able to please their egoistic needs. And what do they spend their money on again? The entertainment industries. And so the bureaucracy accumulates the most of the capital gain. What does the entertainment products that are sold on the market consist of? First of, the most valubile is sex. We can not escape from our sexuality (and why should we?!). The most important objective of going out on a party, in to a club, cafe etc. is the possibility to meet somebody from the opposite gender, or the same, and normally get laid. If that doesn't happen, then we consume sex from TV, movies, magazines, phone sex lines, comercials and other media. Go out and see the first billboard on which is a woman or a men who's sex appeal is pointed out at every cost, just to make people look and praise, and then masturbate at home. Sex is the most profitable product of all times. I can't remember where I read that wars symbolize a sexual intercourse. Conquering a new territory is the entering of the

Joe: NGO?





Future plans.

Ivan: We're pushing on with the same paste. A new demo-tape is on the way and we'd like to play more often, cause we're not getting enough publicity.

Pero: Yes, we like playing. Even thought Nikola is no longer in the band, we'll go on. We are planning on finding a female lead vocal, but that's not sure yet.

Are you cooperating with other bands? Ivan: No. We play alone in Pero's garage. Are you sXe? What's your opinion on sXe bands?

Milovan: We're not sXe.

Pero: We don't have anything against it, everyone should have the right to make his or her own choice.

Have you given an interview for any other r zine?

Ivan: No.

Pero: This is our first interview, and we'd like to thank Vlatko and Bojan for this opportunity to present the band.

You are all still in high school. How do you find the time for rehearsals? Are you ready to go into a studio?

Milovan: There's enough time for everything. **Pero:** We're planning on going into a studio, but since we don't have the money, we'll stay in our garage for now. Our only sponsors are our parents. We don't have any other sponsors.

One night I was sitting, and this thought come to my mind. I don't know, maybe it is from some song or maybe not, and it made me write this article. So I immediately started to write this. What should we do to develop the punk\Hc scene???? This question refers not just to the Macedonian scene, but also to all I asked this question to most of the bands in the interviews. I think the first thing is to respect the people involved in the scene. That meant respecting the bands, the zine makers, gig promoters, labels... more specifically their work. Because it is not easy to any of this, cause it requires a lot of effort and money, it needs dedication, inspiration... First of all I was amazed° when my work was respected. When I was selling my zine on one festival I wanted to give one copy as a gift to a great friend of mine, and he told me that it will be a gift if he byes one, cause otherwise he will not show respect for what I have done. After all a lot of people are doing this because they want to do this, not to gain profit. I mean if there is profit it is really low. On the other hand, if you bye someone's edition, you are encouraging him to continue to work and to gain instruments to release another issue. With those instruments the promoter pays the expenses for the gig, or festival, the bend can pay for the recording of the releases, musical instruments and sound equipment. the zine maker can publish his fanzine... That's why I want you to think about this, and next time when you see that someone has done something, he put an effort to make something, think about the way that that thing has come out, and respect it. You shouldn't judge the final product by its price. At the end somebody is trying to do something, and somebody is just passing by the shop window... and it never crosses his mind who and how this thing has got there.


Friendship... what a lovely word. The real respect comes from your friends. That's why people involved in the scene should be friends, and again people from here, and people from other countries. If someone from other country wants to come here, or to go anywhere, he should be your friend. You know the old saying that the richest man in the world is the one who has the most friends. Here the most important thing is the communication, the exchange of ideas, views, and options. This I like the most in the entire worldwide scene net. So the friendship keeps the people together. So in the name of all I've said do your best to make things better. Think about this!





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

If you ask me this is not a usual one-day lasting band, they make this music seriously. I guarantee you will like this a lot.

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
