New Master Plan Presented to LVA Board

After two years of monthly meetings, more than sixty suggestions from residents, and countless hours of discussion, the Village's Ad Hoc Long Range Planning Committee has completed its mission: to create a plan to enhance, modernize, and improve the facilities and the quality of life for residents of Leisure Village in the future. "Our charge was not to suggest new paint colors for the MPR or propose a bicycle club for Villagers," explains Paul Coffman, who chaired the Committee. "Our focus was to recommend significant projects."

That 2016 Master Plan contains eight new proposals and three unfinished ones from the Master Plan of 2010. The new document was presented to the Board of Directors in December. They will review it, discuss it, probably take public comment, and ultimately decide what projects will go forward and,



Village Pioneer Promotes Women's Golf

Edith Dowsing is a winner.

You can see it all around her Leisure Village home: a 1995 Women's Golf Club Trophy here, numerous ribbons for wins in lawn bowling and billiards there, framed award certificates on the walls. She recalls that she loved Leisure Village from the first month she and her husband lived here, "There was always so much going on – dancing, bingo, golf. Every night, we'd go to the Rec Center," she says smiling at the memories spanning more than four decades.

Edith and Reginald Dowsing were Pioneers, part of the first 100 who bought homes in the unique

2017-2018 LVA Budget is Approved

By now, homeowners have received their copies of the Leisure Village Association budget for the upcoming fiscal year, which begins on April 1, 2017. Here's a quiz: What is the total projected revenue for the upcoming year, and how much will your basic monthly assessment cost? It's a safe guess that more residents know what their new assessment will be for next year than what the Village's projected budget total is.

The new increase in the monthly homeowner's assessment is 3.326% over last year. The total projected revenue in the new budget is \$12,402,508. Villager George Jones, who is Chair of the Finance Committee, says that after homeowners figure their new assessment fee, "They should spend a few more minutes seeing where our dollars are going in the Village. Most of us are happy with the level of services here," he says. "It's good to understand what they cost."

His eleven committee members - all volunteers - spent dozens of hours beginning last fall pouring over the budget proposals line by line. When that process began, the budget projections looked gloomy. "It seemed like an assessment increase of 10% might be needed," he recalls, to deal with soaring costs in categories like workmen's comp insurance and ongoing legal expenses. "However everyone - department heads and staff - took a hard line and cut several hundred thousand dollars," he explains.

The committee's role is advisory; they advise the Association and the Board of Directors, who make the final decisions. But they don't meet together. No LV staff is in the room when the Finance Committee discusses its work. George Jones is pleased that the new budget does not reflect major cuts in important services. He cites one reduction as an example of the process. The Association will not subsidize club activities in the next fiscal year. Those groups will be on their own financially, saving LVA about \$15,000.


As Committee Chair, George is proud of their work and the outcome of it. It is intensely time consuming, but he smiles as he adds, "It's what we do to live here."

experiment in retirement living called Leisure Village. The year was 1974. When they drove from Torrance to Camarillo to take a first look at this community, the route was a twolane highway with dirt between the lanes. The Dowsings chose a house in Village 11 (one of two villages that actually had completed structures).

It is still home for Edith, who celebrated her 101st birthday there in Ianuary. And it is where she decided it was time to put her prized Golf Trophy back into Village competition. In January, more than 20 female golfers teed off in the first Edith Dowsing Annual Golf Tournament. The prize was possession of Edith's treasured cup for one year. The winner was Jaclyn Claros, who says she's thrilled to win the tournament and honored to receive Edith's trophy.

Edith laughs when she explains that she never played golf until she moved here. Her husband played a lot. He had just retired from Mattel, where he was a model maker for the toy manufacturer, and was thrilled that he'd never have to do outside gardening chores in his new Village home. "He was on the golf course at least three times a week," Edith remembers. "So I just picked up some clubs and started playing." She laughs

when asked how good she was, "I wouldn't have won the awards, if I weren't, would I?"

Golf was not her only skill. Edith was president of the Village Billiards Club at 83. She was a founding member of the Oxnard-Joslyn Lawn Bowling Club, where she competed (and won) until she was 95. She was active in LV's Women's Club. She stopped driving just two years ago.

Edith continues to be a big fan of Leisure Village. Maybe next year, she'll promote a billiards tournament.

LV Security Officer Receives Sheriff's Commendation





Leisure Village Plaza: convert the area around the Gazebo into a more welcoming gathering destination.

Solar Heating of Pool Water: installation of solar technology to control water temperature.

Photovoltaic Power: thorough study of use of solar power for usage in Rec Center and Association offices.

Pedestrian Crosswalks: change grass street crossings to concrete ramps.

Mountain View Tree Plan: new trees to replace dead ones along route.

Pedestrian Lane to Main Gate: revised walking path to increase safety and separate vehicles from pedestrians and bicycles.

Coffee/Food Service: a beverage and snack service in the Clubhouse if not included in the Rec Center remodel.

Golf Cart Parking: (from 2010 Master Plan) addition of spaces for electric-powered carts in West Parking Lot

Not Recommended from 2010 Master Plan: Walking Trail Path Extension and Golf Course Restroom.

Costs or budgets for the proposals were never considered; value to the Village and to Villagers was. The presumption was that skilled professionals would prepare plans and costs before final decisions were made. The Plan is available in detail on the website at leisurevillage.org and a portion of the plan is posted in the Rec Center atrium. Drawings of each project accompany the complete plan. All drawings were made by Don Marquardt, who was a committee member and, in the last year, the Board Liaison to the Committee.
